d) Approving Police Officer - New Hire

Chief of Police Peterson shared that there was one vacancy open for a police officer position. One candidate completed interviews and thorough background checks. Chief of Police Peterson requested the approval to hire Zachary Boeselwith the Forest Lake Police Department at Paygrade 9 and Step 5 under the 2023-2025 Law Enforcement Labor Services Labor Contract.

Councilmember Husnik asked how many applications were received. Chief of Police Peterson stated there is an open application and this position received four applications.

<u>Motion:</u> Councilmember Husnik made a <u>Motion to Approve</u> the hiring of Zachary Boesel to fill the open position of police officer at paygrade 9 and step 5 pursuant to the 2023-2025 LELS Labor Contract. Motion seconded by Councilmember Valento. <u>Motion carried 5-0.</u>

8. Discussion

a) City Administration Search (no packet materials)

City Attorney Johnson shared that the City Council received proposals from DDA, Baker Tilly, and Gov HR USA. City Attorney Johnson asked the City Council for their next steps for the city administration search plan. City Attorney Johnson also asked if the City Council would like DDA to attend the February 12th meeting.

Councilmember Erickson shared positive feedback on the DDA proposal, specifically with the two-year guarantee and the value.

Mayor Bain asked for potential next steps, including in-person proposals with the firms, individual Council member meetings, reference checks, or meeting attendance.

Councilmember Roberts questioned whether the City Council could request a two-year guarantee from the remaining firms.

Mayor Bain stated it would be helpful to receive specific city references for the named individuals working for the firms. Mayor Bain stated the firms could be invited to the meeting on February 12 and attend either in-person or virtually. Mayor Bain encouraged the City Council to be prepared to decide on the firm to hire a City Administrator by February 12.

Councilmember Erickson asked if these firms would help with other staffing searches as well. Mayor Bain confirmed it made good sense for the firm to hire additional positions.

Councilmember Roberts asked if there was pricing available for hiring remaining positions. City Attorney Johnson stated that DDA has the staffing study completed and can share the results of the staffing study on February 12.

Councilmember Erickson supported the idea of DDA presenting the staffing study and the City Council completing a workshop to discuss the study following the meeting.

Mayor Bain confirmed that the City Council saw initial information from the study. The City Council has not heard the complete presentation from DDA or discussed the information. Mayor Bain thought it would be unlikely to provide approval on the same night as the presentation.

Councilmember Roberts questioned whether there were benefits of advertising positions such as deputy clerk.

Mayor Bain encouraged the City Council to discuss expectations during a workshop. Mayor Bain requested the other firms provide a quote for the additional position searches. The City Council will hear the DDA presentation on the staffing study and the City Administrator search to determine the next steps.

b) Deputy Clerk Position (no packet materials)

Interim City Administrator Handt reviewed the history of the administrator/clerk and deputy clerk positions. The DDA study suggested separating the administrator/clerk roles as other comparable cities have a clerk and an administrator position.

Councilmember Valento shared that the City is understaffed and communicated the value of separating the clerk and administrator positions to alleviate additional stress in one role.

Councilmember Erickson stated the job duties of the two roles are very different. Mayor Bain communicated that there has been a lot of transition in the deputy clerk role. It is difficult to re-train the position every two to three years.





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Mayor Bain asked Interim City Administrator Handt for the next steps to hire these positions. Interim City Administrator Handt indicated the next steps would be to update the job descriptions and determine the pay grades the positions would fall into.

Councilmember Erickson asked if splitting these roles would impact the proposals from the firms. City Attorney Johnson confirmed the other firms would be made aware of these changes.

c) Public Meeting Virtual Attendance Options

Community Development Director Wittman reviewed the disruption of the January 8 City Council meeting through the virtual attendance option. The Zoom links are now updated with secure features. Community Development Director Wittman asked the City Council if they wanted to continue offering the virtual attendance option.

Mayor Bain asked for additional options to livestream the meetings in place of Zoom. Community Development Director Wittman shared that the City Council meeting could be streamed via YouTube and Facebook

Mayor Bain asked if the Zoom account was low-cost. Mayor Bain expressed hesitancy with removing remote options based on positive previous participation. This is also an option for vendors to participate remotely.

d) 2024 Local Board of Appeal and Equalization Meeting Date

Community Development Director Wittman shared that the Washington County Assessor's Office set the Board of Appeal and Equalization Meeting date for April 8 from 5:30-6:30 p.m. The City Council adopted the 2024 meeting calendar and published the meeting for either April 15 or April 29. Community Development Director Wittman asked the City Council for the preferred meeting date to coordinate with Washington County.

Mayor Bain suggested the City Council set the meeting for April 15 from 5:30-6:30 p.m. and the City Council can meet for the City Council Workshop at 6:30 p.m.

e) 2024 New State Funding

Finance Director Knopik shared the City received a one-time Public Safety Aid for \$918,000 at the end of 2023 from the State Legislature. In 2024, the City will receive approximately \$210,000 for local, affordable housing aid. Staff will have recommendations for fund usage before fund disbursement in June.

Mayor Bain communicated that housing funds are used in areas where Forest Lake does not have a large footprint. Mayor Bain encouraged staff to provide recommended usage for the funds.

Mayor Bain asked if the funds are committed to the City over a four-year period. Community Development Director Wittman stated the funds are new and are dependent on the

government in place. The funds are guaranteed for four years. The City Council will need to determine who will distribute the funds to meet housing goals and capitalize on housing partnership opportunities.

Councilmember Erickson asked if the County CDA and other non-profit partners could help keep the money local. Community Development Director Wittman confirmed there would need to be evidence to show how and where the finances were used. The City needs to consider where there are gaps to use these funds efficiently and effectively.

9. Staff Updates

Community Development Director Wittman shared they will attend a local transportation meeting to discuss the expansion of transportation in Forest Lake and area cities. This meeting will provide follow-up with partners from past meeting discussions.

Interim City Administrator Handt thanked the staff for their welcome over the past week, noting early voting for the primary started last week.

Public Works Director Adams communicated that the hockey rinks are open and will be maintained as temperatures allow.

City Engineer Goodman stated staff submitted for another I & I grant. The potential allocation will be communicated in February. The City should receive a minimum of \$50,000. On Tuesday, February 6, there will be an Open House from 4:30-6:30 p.m. for the County State Highway 32 project. They will hold another public engagement meeting for the Broadway Avenue maintenance project.

Chief of Police Peterson has partnered with the City of Forest Lake Lions Club and AARP to present information on senior scams. They have started to organize the City of Forest Lake Safety Camp, Coffee with the Cops, and Night to Unite.

10. Mayor and City Council Updates

Councilmember Roberts welcomed Interim City Administrator Handt and thanked City Attorney Johnson for the assistance during the transition. Councilmember Roberts suggested if the staff takes on additional roles, they should be compensated.

Councilmember Valento welcomed Interim City Administrator Handt and expressed appreciation for City staff.

Councilmember Husnik attended the School Board meeting and met with MnDOT aeronautics at the airport.

Councilmember Erickson agreed with the comments expressed by Councilmember Valento and Councilmember Roberts.

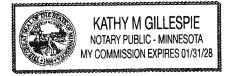

BACKGROUND:

At the October 23, 2023 meeting, the city council approved two proposals for services order with Bolton and Menk related to pavement maintenance and the construction of pavement for Taxiway Connector A3 Extension and Taxilane Bravo Extension. As noted at the time, the projects would be funded 95% with a grant from MNDOT Aeronautics.

STATE OF MINNESOTA STATE AIRPORTS FUND GRANT AGREEMENT

This agreement is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Commissioner of Transportation ("State"), and the City of Forest Lake, 1408 Lake Street South, Forest Lake, MN 55025 ("Grantee").

RECITALS

- 1. Minnesota Statutes Chapter 360 authorizes State to provide financial assistance to eligible airport sponsors for the acquisition, construction, improvement, marketing, maintenance, or operation of airports and other air navigation facilities.
- 2. Grantee owns, operates, controls, or desires to own an airport ("Airport") in the state system, and Grantee desires financial assistance from the State for an airport improvement project ("Project").
- 3. Grantee represents that it is duly qualified and agrees to perform all services described in this agreement to the satisfaction of the State. Pursuant to Minn.Stat.§16B.98, Subd.1, Grantee agrees to minimize administrative costs as a condition of this agreement.

AGREEMENT TERMS

Term of Agreement, Survival of Terms, and Incorporation of Exhibits

- 1.1 Effective Date. This agreement will be effective on the date the State obtains all required signatures under Minn. Stat.§16B.98, Subd. 5, whichever is later. As required by Minn.Stat.§16B.98 Subd. 7, no payments will be made to Grantee until this agreement is fully executed. Grantee must not begin work under this agreement until this agreement is fully executed and Grantee has been notified by the State's Authorized Representative to begin the work.
- 1.2 **Expiration Date.** This agreement will expire on December 31, 2027, or when all obligations have been satisfactorily fulfilled, whichever occurs first.
- 1.3 **Survival of Terms.** All clauses which impose obligations continuing in their nature and which must survive in order to give effect to their meaning will survive the expiration or termination of this agreement, including, without limitation, the following clauses: 8. Liability; 9. State Audits; 10. Government Data Practices and Intellectual Property; 11. Workers Compensation; 12. Publicity and Endorsement; 13. Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue; and 15 Data Disclosure.
- 1.4 **Plans, Specifications, Descriptions.** Grantee has provided the State with the plans, specifications, and a detailed description of the Project A8206-26, which are on file with the State's Office of Aeronautics and are incorporated into this Agreement by reference.
- 1.5 Exhibits. Exhibit A (Credit Application Form) is attached and incorporated into this agreement.

2 Grantee's Duties

- 2.1 Grantee will complete the Project in accordance with the plans, specifications, and detailed description of the Project, which are on file with the State's Office of Aeronautics. Any changes to the plans or specifications of the Project after the date of this Agreement will be valid only if made by written change order signed by the Grantee and the State. Subject to the availability of funds, the State may prepare an amendment to this Agreement to reimburse the Grantee for the allowable costs of qualifying change orders.
- 2.2 If the Project involves construction, Grantee will designate a registered engineer to oversee the Project work. If, with the State's approval, the Grantee elects not to have such services performed by a registered engineer, then the Grantee will designate another responsible person to oversee such work.
- 2.3 Grantee will notify State's Authorized Representative in advance of any meetings taking place relating to the Project.
- 2.4 Grantee will comply with all required grants management policies and procedures set forth through Minn.Stat.§16B.97, Subd. 4 (a) (1).
- 2.5 **Asset Monitoring.** If Grantee uses funds obtained by this agreement to acquire a capital asset, the Grantee is required to use that asset for a public aeronautical purpose for the normal useful life of the asset. Grantee may not sell or change the purpose of use for the capital asset(s) obtained with grant funds under this agreement without the prior written consent of the State and an agreement executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved this agreement, or their successors in office.

2.6 Airport Operations, Maintenance, and Conveyance. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 360.305, subdivision 4 (d) (1), the Grantee will operate the Airport as a licensed, municipally-owned public airport at all times of the year for a period 20 years from the date the Grantee receives final reimbursement under this Agreement. The Airport must be maintained in a safe, serviceable manner for public aeronautical purposes only. Without prior written approval from the State, Grantee will not transfer, convey, encumber, assign, or abandon its interest in the airport or in any real or personal property that is purchased or improved with State funds. If the State approves such a transfer or change in use, the Grantee must comply with such conditions and restrictions as the State may place on such approval. The obligations imposed by this clause survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

3 Time

3.1 Grantee must comply with all the time requirements described in this agreement. In the performance of this grant agreement, time is of the essence.

4 Cost and Payment

4.1 **Cost Participation.** Costs for the Project will be proportionate and allocated as follows:

The federal multiyear amount is an estimate only. These funds are not committed and are only available after being made so by the U.S. Government. Federal funds for the Project will be received and disbursed by the State. In the event federal reimbursement becomes available or is increased for the Project, the State will be entitled to recover from such federal funds an amount not to exceed the state funds advanced for this Project. No more than 95% of the amount due under this Agreement will be paid by the State until the State determines that the Grantee has complied with all terms of this Agreement and furnished all necessary records.

4.2 Blank.

- 4.3 **Sufficiency of Funds**. Pursuant to Minnesota Rules 8800.2500, the Grantee certifies that (1) it presently has available sufficient unencumbered funds to pay its share of the Project; (2) the Project will be completed without undue delay; and (3) the Grantee has the legal authority to engage in the Project as proposed.
- 4.4 **Total Obligation.** The total obligation of the State for all compensation and reimbursements to Grantee under this agreement will not exceed \$ 105,450.00.

4.5 Payment

- 4.5.1 **Invoices.** Grantee will submit invoices for payment by email. Exhibit A, which is attached and incorporated into this agreement, is the form Grantee will use to submit invoices. The State's Authorized Representative, as named in this agreement, will review each invoice against the approved grant budget and grant expenditures to-date before approving payment. The State will promptly pay Grantee after Grantee presents an itemized invoice for the services actually performed and the State's Authorized Representative accepts the invoiced services. Invoices will be submitted timely and according to the following schedule: Reimbursement request schedule: continuous as needed.
- 4.5.2 **All Invoices Subject to Audit.** All invoices are subject to audit, at State's discretion.
- 4.5.3 **State's Payment Requirements**. State will promptly pay all valid obligations under this agreement as required by Minnesota Statutes §16A.124. State will make undisputed payments no later than 30 days after

- receiving Grantee's invoices for services performed. If an invoice is incorrect, defective or otherwise improper, State will notify Grantee within ten days of discovering the error. After State receives the corrected invoice, State will pay Grantee within 30 days of receipt of such invoice.
- 4.5.4 **Grantee Payment Requirements.** Grantee must pay all contractors under this agreement promptly. Grantee will make undisputed payments no later than 30 days after receiving an invoice. If an invoice is incorrect, defective, or otherwise improper, Grantee will notify the contractor within ten days of discovering the error. After Grantee receives the corrected invoice, Grantee will pay the contractor within 30 days of receipt of such invoice.
- 4.5.5 **Grant Monitoring Visit and Financial Reconciliation.** During the period of performance, the State will make at least annual monitoring visits and conduct annual financial reconciliations of Grantee's expenditures.
 - 4.5.5.1 The State's Authorized Representative will notify Grantee's Authorized Representative where and when any monitoring visit and financial reconciliation will take place, which State employees and/or contractors will participate, and which Grantee staff members should be present. Grantee will be provided notice prior to any monitoring visit or financial reconciliation.
 - 4.5.5.2 Following a monitoring visit or financial reconciliation, Grantee will take timely and appropriate action on all deficiencies identified by State.
 - 4.5.5.3 At least one monitoring visit and one financial reconciliation must be completed prior to final payment being made to Grantee.
- 4.5.6 **Closeout.** The State will determine, at its sole discretion, whether a closeout audit is required prior to final payment approval. If a closeout audit is required, final payment will be held until the audit has been completed. Monitoring of any capital assets acquired with grant funds will continue following grant closeout.
- 4.5.7 **Closeout Deliverables.** At the close of the Project, the Grantee must provide the following deliverables to the State before the final payment due under this Agreement will be released by the State: (1) Electronic files of construction plans as a PDF and in a MicroStation compatible format; and (2) Electronic files of asbuilts as a PDF and in a MicroStation compatible format. (3) Electronic files of planning documents (Airport Layout Plans ALP) and Airport Zoning as a PDF and in a MicroStation compatible format and in GIS.
- 4.6 Contracting and Bidding Requirements. Prior to publication, Grantee will submit to State all solicitations for work to be funded by this Agreement. Prior to execution, Grantee will submit to State all contracts and subcontracts funded by this agreement between Grantee and third parties. State's Authorized Representative has the sole right to approve, disapprove, or modify any solicitation, contract, or subcontract submitted by Grantee. All contracts and subcontracts between Grantee and third parties must contain all applicable provisions of this Agreement. State's Authorized Representative will respond to a solicitation, contract, or subcontract submitted by Grantee within ten business days.

5 Conditions of Payment

All services provided by Grantee under this agreement must be performed to the State's satisfaction, as determined at the sole discretion of the State's Authorized Representative and in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations. The Grantee will not receive payment for work found by the State to be unsatisfactory or performed in violation of federal, state, or local law. In addition, Grantee will not receive payment for Airport's failure to pass periodic inspections by a representative of the State's Office of Aeronautics.

6 Authorized Representatives

If the services are satisfactory, the State's Authorized Representative will certify acceptance on each invoice submitted for payment.

7 Assignment Amendments, Waiver, and Grant Agreement Complete

- 7.1 **Assignment.** The Grantee may neither assign nor transfer any rights or obligations under this agreement without the prior written consent of the State and a fully executed Assignment Agreement, executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved this agreement, or their successors in office.
- 7.2 **Amendments.** Any amendments to this agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original agreement, or their successors in office. Notwithstanding the foregoing, when FAA issues a Letter Amendment on a federal grant agreement that results in an increase in federal funds beyond the total amount in this grant agreement (i.e., federal amendment), MnDOT's receipt of the Letter Amendment from FAA has the effect of amending the total amount in this grant agreement.
- 7.3 **Waiver.** If the State fails to enforce any provision of this agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or the State's right to subsequently enforce it.
- 7.4 **Grant Agreement Complete.** This grant agreement contains all negotiations and agreements between the State and Grantee. No other understanding regarding this agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.
- 7.5 **Electronic Records and Signatures.** The parties agree to contract by electronic means. This includes using electronic signatures and converting original documents to electronic records.
- **7.**6 **Certification.** By signing this Agreement, the Grantee certifies that it is not suspended or debarred from receiving federal or state awards.

8 Liability

In the performance of this agreement, and to the extent permitted by law, Grantee must indemnify, save, and hold the State, its agents, and employees harmless from any claims or causes of action, including attorney's fees incurred by the State, arising from the performance of this agreement by Grantee or Grantee's agents or employees. This clause will not be construed to bar any legal remedies Grantee may have for the State's failure to fulfill its obligations under this agreement.

9 State Audits

Under Minn. Stat. § 16B.98, Subd.8, the Grantee's books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices of Grantee, or other party relevant to this grant agreement or transaction, are subject to examination by the State and/or the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this agreement, receipt and approval of all final reports, or the required period of time to satisfy all state and program retention requirements, whichever is later. Grantee will take timely and appropriate action on all deficiencies identified by an audit.

10 Government Date Practices and Intellectual Property Rights

10.1 Government Data Practices. Grantee and State must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 13, as it applies to all data provided by the State under this grant agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the Grantee under this agreement. The civil remedies of Minn. Stat. §13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either Grantee or the State. If Grantee receives a request to release the data referred to in this section 10.1, Grantee must immediately notify the State. The State will give Grantee instructions concerning the release of the data to the requesting party before the data is released. Grantee's response to the request shall comply with applicable law.

10.2 Intellectual Property Rights.

10.2.1 Intellectual Property Rights. State owns all rights, title and interest in all of the intellectual property rights, including copyrights, patents, trade secrets, trademarks and service marks in the Works and Documents created and paid for under this agreement. "Works" means all inventions, improvements, discoveries (whether or not patentable), databases, computer programs, reports, notes, studies, photographs, negatives, designs, drawings, specifications, materials, tapes and disks conceived, reduced to practice, created or originated by Grantee, its employees, agents and subcontractors, either individually or jointly with others in the performance of this agreement. Works includes Documents. "Documents" are the originals of any databases, computer programs, reports, notes, studies, photographs, negatives, designs, drawings, specifications, materials, tapes, disks or other materials, whether in tangible or electronic forms, prepared by Grantee, its employees, agents or subcontractors, in the performance of this

agreement. The Documents will be the exclusive property of State, and Grantee upon completion or cancellation of this agreement must immediately return all such Documents to State. To the extent possible, those Works eligible for copyright protection under the United States Copyright Act will be deemed to be "works made for hire." Grantee assigns all right, title and interest it may have in the Works and the Documents to State. Grantee must, at the request of State, execute all papers and perform all other acts necessary to transfer or record the State's ownership interest in the Works and Documents.

10.2.2 **Obligations**

- 10.2.2.1 **Notification**. Whenever any invention, improvement or discovery (whether or not patentable) is made or conceived for the first time or actually or constructively reduced to practice by Grantee, including its employees and subcontractors, in the performance of this agreement, Grantee will immediately give State's Authorized Representative written notice thereof and must promptly furnish State's Authorized Representative with complete information and/or disclosure thereon.
- 10.2.2.2 Representation. Grantee must perform all acts, and take all steps necessary to ensure that all intellectual property rights in the Works and Documents are the sole property of State and that neither Grantee nor its employees, agents or subcontractors retain any interest in and to the Works and Documents. Grantee represents and warrants that the Works and Documents do not and will not infringe upon any intellectual property rights of other persons or entities. Notwithstanding Clause 8, Grantee will indemnify; defend, to the extent permitted by the Attorney General; and hold harmless State, at Grantee's expense, from any action or claim brought against State to the extent that it is based on a claim that all or part of the Works or Documents infringe upon the intellectual property rights of others. Grantee will be responsible for payment of any and all such claims, demands, obligations, liabilities, costs and damages, including but not limited to, attorney fees. If such a claim or action arises, or in Grantee's or State's opinion is likely to arise, Grantee must, at State's discretion, either procure for State the right or license to use the intellectual property rights at issue or replace or modify the allegedly infringing Works or Documents as necessary and appropriate to obviate the infringement claim. This remedy of State will be in addition to and not exclusive of other remedies provided by law.

11 Workers Compensation

The Grantee certifies that it is in compliance with Minn. Stat. §176.181, Subd. 2, pertaining to workers' compensation insurance coverage. The Grantee's employees and agents will not be considered State employees. Any claims that may arise under the Minnesota Workers' Compensation Act on behalf of these employees and any claims made by any third party as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of these employees are in no way the State's obligation or responsibility.

12 Publicity and Endorsement

- 12.1 **Publicity.** Any publicity regarding the subject matter of this agreement must identify the State as the sponsoring agency and must not be released without prior written approval from the State's Authorized Representative. For purposes of this provision, publicity includes notices, informational pamphlets, press releases, research, reports, signs, and similar public notices prepared by or for the Grantee individually or jointly with others, or any subcontractors, with respect to the program, publications, or services provided resulting from this grant agreement. All projects primarily funded by state grant appropriation must publicly credit the State of Minnesota, including on the Grantee's website when practicable.
- 12.2 **Endorsement.** The Grantee must not claim that the State endorses its products or services.

13 Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue

Minnesota law, without regard to its choice-of-law provisions, governs this agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings out of this agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

14 Termination; Suspension

- 14.1 **Termination by the State or Commissioner of Administration.** The State or Commissioner of Administration may unilaterally terminate this agreement at any time, with or without cause, upon written notice to the Grantee. Upon termination, the Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed.
- 14.2 **Termination for Cause.** The State may immediately terminate this grant agreement if the State finds that there

has been a failure to comply with the provisions of this agreement, that reasonable progress has not been made, that fraudulent or wasteful activity has occurred, that Grantee has been convicted of a criminal offense relating to a state grant agreement, or that the purposes for which the funds were granted have not been or will not be fulfilled. The State may take action to protect the interests of the State of Minnesota, including the refusal to disburse additional funds and requiring the return of all or part of the funds already disbursed.

- 14.3 **Termination for Insufficient Funding.** The State may immediately terminate this agreement if:
 - 14.3.1 It does not obtain funding from the Minnesota Legislature; or
 - 14.3.2 If funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to allow for the payment of the services covered here. Termination must be by written or fax notice to the Grantee. The State is not obligated to pay for any services that are provided after notice and effective date of termination. However, the Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed to the extent that funds are available. The State will not be assessed any penalty if the agreement is terminated because of the decision of the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source, not to appropriate funds. The State will provide the Grantee notice of the lack of funding within a reasonable time of the State's receiving that notice.
- 14.4 **Suspension.** The State may immediately suspend this agreement in the event of a total or partial government shutdown due to the failure to have an approved budget by the legal deadline. Work performed by the Grantee during a period of suspension will be deemed unauthorized and undertaken at risk of non-payment.

15 Data Disclosure

Under Minn. Stat. § 270C.65, Subd. 3, and other applicable law, Grantee consents to disclosure of its social security number, federal employer tax identification number, and/or Minnesota tax identification number, already provided to the State, to federal and state tax agencies and state personnel involved in the payment of state obligations. These identification numbers may be used in the enforcement of federal and state tax laws which could result in action requiring the Grantee to file state tax returns and pay delinquent state tax liabilities, if any.

- 16 **Fund Use Prohibited.** The Grantee will not utilize any funds received pursuant to this Agreement to compensate, either directly or indirectly, any contractor, corporation, partnership, or business, however organized, which is disqualified or debarred from entering into or receiving a State contract. This restriction applies regardless of whether the disqualified or debarred party acts in the capacity of a general contractor, a subcontractor, or as an equipment or material supplier. This restriction does not prevent the Grantee from utilizing these funds to pay any party who might be disqualified or debarred after the Grantee's contract award on this Project. For a list of disqualified or debarred vendors, see www.mmd.admin.state.mn.us/debarredreport.asp.
- 17 **Discrimination Prohibited by Minnesota Statutes §181.59.** Grantee will comply with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes §181.59 which requires that every contract for or on behalf of the State of Minnesota, or any county, city, town, township, school, school district or any other district in the state, for materials, supplies or construction will contain provisions by which Contractor agrees: 1) That, in the hiring of common or skilled labor for the performance of any work under any contract, or any subcontract, no Contractor, material supplier or vendor, will, by reason of race, creed or color, discriminate against the person or persons who are citizens of the United States or resident aliens who are qualified and available to perform the work to which the employment relates; 2) That no Contractor, material supplier, or vendor, will, in any manner, discriminate against, or intimidate, or prevent the employment of any person or persons identified in clause 1 of this section, or on being hired, prevent or conspire to prevent, the person or persons from the performance of work under any contract on account of race, creed or color; 3) That a violation of this section is a misdemeanor; and 4) That this contract may be canceled or terminated by the state of Minnesota, or any county, city, town, township, school, school district or any other person authorized to grant contracts for employment, and all money due, or to become due under the contract, may be forfeited for a second or any subsequent violation of the terms or conditions of this Agreement.
- 18 **Limitation.** Under this Agreement, the State is only responsible for receiving and disbursing funds. Nothing in this Agreement will be construed to make the State a principal, co-principal, partner, or joint venturer with respect to the Project(s) covered herein. The State may provide technical advice and assistance as requested by the Grantee, however, the Grantee will remain responsible for providing direction to its contractors and consultants and for administering its contracts with such entities. The Grantee's consultants and contractors are not intended to be third party beneficiaries of this Agreement.

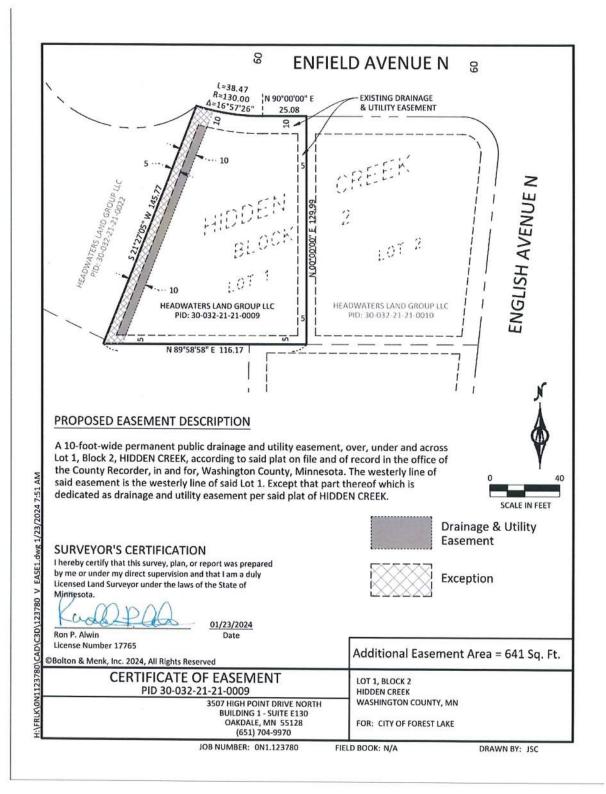

- (a) To enter upon the Permanent Easement Area at all reasonable times for the purposes of construction, reconstruction, inspection, repair, replacement, grading, sloping, and restoration relating to the purposes of the Permanent Easement; and
- (b) To maintain the Permanent Easement Area, together with the right to excavate and refill ditches or trenches for the location of such drainage and utility, curb, gutter, retaining walls, or other street project improvements; and
- (c) To remove from the Permanent Easement Area trees, brush, herbage, aggregate, undergrowth and other obstructions interfering with the location, construction and

maintenance of the Permanent Easement and to deposit earthen material in and upon the Permanent Easement Area; and

(d) To remove or otherwise dispose of all earth or other material excavated from the Permanent Easement Area as the City may deem appropriate; and

The City shall not be responsible for any costs, expenses, damages, demands, obligations, penalties, attorneys' fees and/or losses resulting from any claims, actions, suits, or proceedings based upon a release or threat of release of any hazardous substances, petroleum, pollutants, and/or contaminants which may have existed on, or which relate to the Permanent Easement Area or Landowner's Property, prior to the date hereof.

Nothing contained herein shall be deemed a waiver by the City of any governmental immunity defenses, statutory or otherwise. Further, any and all claims brought by Landowner or their successors or assigns, shall be subject to any governmental immunity defenses of the City and the maximum liability limits provided by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 466.

The Landowner, for themselves and their successors and assigns, do hereby warrant to and covenant with the City, its successors and assigns, that they are well seized in fee of Landowner's Property legally described on Exhibit A, and the Permanent Easement Area legally described on Exhibit B and depicted on Exhibit C, and have good right to grant and convey the Permanent Easement herein to the City.

This agreement is binding upon the heirs, successors, executors, administrators and assigns of the parties hereto.

This agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.

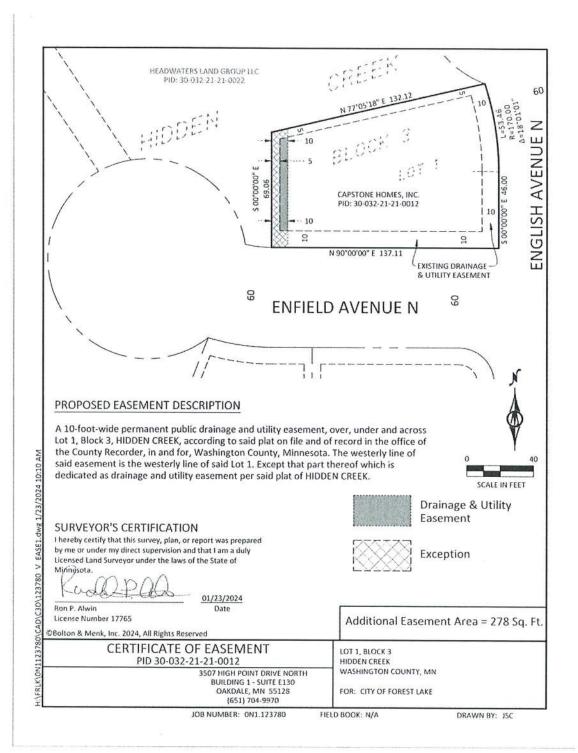

Letter for City Council

Background

The Forest Lake Rotary will hold their annual Winter Plunge fundraising event on Saturday, February 17 from 12:00 – 3:00 pm at Lakeside Memorial Park. The City Council approved resolution 01-22-24-03 granting the Forest Lake Rotary access to Forest Lake First Lake for their event, which was subject to several conditions of approval. Of those conditions, the City's Emergency Manager has the exclusive authority to cancel the Event at any time, based on industry best practices for adverse site or weather conditions or any other public safety concerns. Due to the unseasonably warm weather, this has resulted in adverse site conditions and the City's Emergency Manager has cancelled the event organizer's access to Forest Lake First Lake for the 2024 Rotary Winter Plunge Event.

Staff are working with the event organizers on alternative plans to still hold the event on land, and a verbal update will be provided at the meeting.

The event organizers have submitted a letter to the City Council requesting consideration of waiving fees required to hold the event, which is one \$50.00 fee for an outdoor entertainment with tent permit that will be issued by the City.

Council Action: Should the Council be favorable to waiving the permit fee as requested by the Forest Lake Rotary, Council should <u>motion to waive the outdoor entertainment with tent permit fee in the</u> amount of \$50.00 for the 2024 Rotary Winter Plunge.

WHEREAS, the City collects information regarding privately-sponsored public events through issuance of a City of Forest Lake Event Permit ("Event Permit") application, that in turn is reviewed and approved by the City; and

WHEREAS, Angie Comstock representing Forest Lake Rotary ("Event Organizer") desires to hold a public event to be called Rotary Winter Plunge to be held on Saturday, February 17, 2024 at/on Forest Lake First Lake ("Event"); and

WHEREAS, the Event Organizer has submitted required information to the City to hold the Event; and

WHEREAS, upon review of the Event Organizer's submitted materials, the City has approved the Forest Lake First Lake access with the following conditions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City of Forest Lake, State of Minnesota, that the Forest Lake Rotary is granted access to Forest Lake First Lake, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The Event shall not include any activities not identified on the Event Permit application and site plan. All permitted Event activities shall be in locations as identified on the submitted site plan.
- 2. Access to Forest Lake First Lake shall be permitted through the City's public beach in Lakeside Memorial Park at the Event Organizer's own risk.

- 3. Event Organizer is required to set up and clean up Event as identified in the Event Organizer's Event Permit. Clean up shall consistent of any and all activities necessary to restore the Event site and its surroundings to a state of appearance prior to the Event.
- 4. Event Organizer shall be responsible for ensuring the Event site is safe for the public after the Event.
- 5. Within ten business days prior to the Event, the Event Organizer shall provide the City's Park and Recreation Supervisor with final event details including, but not be limited to, estimated participants and attendance, schedule of events, and any additional information not previously provided to the City.
- 6. Within seven calendar days prior to the Event, the Event Organizer shall submit to the City a Certificate of Insurance with the required insurance minimums as specified by the City and with the City listed as an additional insured.
- 7. Event Organizer shall coordinate with City Fire, Police, and Public Works personnel in an onsite meeting scheduled by the Event Organizer with the City's designated Emergency Manager at least 72 hours prior to the event and as needed to meet the City's requirements and conditions and any other governmental agency approvals as required.
- 8. Although the City will endeavor to provide at least a seven day notice, the City's Emergency Manager has the exclusive authority to cancel the Event at any time, based on industry best practices for adverse site or weather conditions or any other public safety concerns.

Re: Ordinance No. 734 - 2024 Fee Schedule Discussion

At the City Council meeting on December 11, 2023, the Council adopted Ordinance No. 730 which repealed and replaced the 2024 fee schedule. The ordinance contained an error with Police Department fingerprinting, inadvertently increased the fee to \$50.00 when it was intended to increase (from \$25.00) to \$30.00. This has been changed in the enclosed ordinance.

Additionally, the City has nearly finalized online building permitting which has necessitated combining certain types of permits. This is because the new online software will not distinguish between residential and commercial for siding or roofing permits. Each of these types of permits will have a fee of \$110.

Lastly, additional clarification is needed surrounding park use and parkland dedication fees. For the former, greater clarification is needed for park facility use; fee schedule exempts the requirements for user fees when the user has entered into a use agreement with the City. Some language was proposed to be removed given it was ill-defined and other words have been added to provide greater definition. However, no fee changes are proposed in this Ordinance. For the latter, formatting changes are proposed to the text and the residential estimate is increased (back) to \$2,500 per unit to correct an error made in Ordinance 730.

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION AND FIRE INSPECTION FEES

VALUATION BASED PERMIT FEE

Permit fee to be based on job cost valuation or a fixed fee as stated in this schedule. The determination of value or valuation shall be made by the building and/or fire official. The value to be used in computing the permit and plan review fees shall be the total of all work for which the permit is issued. For building permitting, this shall include all finish work, painting, roofing, electrical, plumbing, heating, air conditioning, elevators, fire-extinguishing systems and any other permanent equipment.

- 2) 2) if the valuation is greater than \$1,000,000.00, the surcharge is \$500.00 plus two-fifths mill (.0004) of the value between \$1,000,000.00 and \$2,000,000.00
- 3) If the valuation is greater than \$2,000,000.00, the surcharge is \$900.00 plus three-tenths mill (.0003) of the value between \$2,000,000.00 and \$3,000,000.00
- 4) If the valuation is greater than \$3,000,000.00, the surcharge is \$1,200.00 plus one-fifth mill (.0002) of the value between \$3,000,000.00 and \$4,000,000.00
- 5) If the valuation is greater than \$4,000,000.00, the surcharge is \$1,400.00 plus one-tenth mill (.0001) of the value between \$4,000,000.00 and \$5,000,000.00
- 6) If the valuation exceeds \$5,000,000.00, the surcharge is \$1,500.00 plus one-twentieth mill (.00005) of the value that exceeds \$5,000,000.00

PLAN REVIEW FEE

When a building permit is required and a plan is required to be submitted, a plan review fee shall be paid. Plan review fees shall be 65% of the permit fee. The fee for similar plans shall be 25% of the normal building permit fee as defined in MSBS, Section 1300.

The plan review fees specified are separate fees from the permit fees specified and are in addition to the permit fee. Plan review fees will be charged for any plan review even if a permit is not issued.

When submittal documents are incomplete or change so as to require additional plan review, or when the project involves deferred submittal items, an additional plan review fee shall be charged at the rate contained herein.

Applications for which no permit is issued within 180 days following the date of application shall expire by limitation; plans and other documentation submitted for review may thereafter be returned to the applicant or destroyed by the building and/or fire official. The building and/or fire official may extend the time for action by the applicant for a period of 180 days upon request of the applicant with evidence that circumstances beyond the applicant's control have prevented required action. No application shall be extended more than once. In order to review action on an application after expiration, the applicant shall resubmit plans and pay a new plan review fee.

RENEWAL FEE

Permits renewed within six (6) months after a permit has expired shall be charged a permit renewal fee of \$55.00.

Permits not renewed within six (6) months after a permit has expired and work remains incomplete shall be charged as required for a new permit.

REFUNDS

The building and/or fire official may authorize refunding any fee paid under this schedule that was erroneously paid or collected.

The building and/or fire official may authorize refunding not more than 80% of the permit fee paid when no work has been done under an issued permit.

The building and/or fire official shall not authorize refunding of the plan review fee when an application for a permit is withdrawn or cancelled after a plan review has been completed.

The building/fire official shall no authorize refunding any fee paid except on written application field by the original permittee not later than 180 days after the date of the fee payment.

INVESTIGATION FEE

Whenever any work for which a city permit is required has commenced without first obtaining a permit, a special investigation shall be made before a permit will be issued. An investigation fee, in addition to the permit fee, shall be collected whether or not a permit is subsequently issued. The investigation fee shall be equal to the amount of the permit fee required by this schedule. The payment for such investigation fee shall not exempt any person from compliance with all other provisions of this code nor from any penalty prescribed by law.

BACKGROUND:

The Deputy Clerk position has been vacant since fall 2023. Around that time the city also engaged David Drown Associates to complete an organizational/staffing study. One of the recommendations from that study is to hire a City Clerk, rather than replace the Deputy Clerk position. The city council also briefly discussed this idea at their January 22, 2024 meeting and staff identified the next steps as creating a City Clerk job description and posting to bring back to council for final approval.

ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL:

Should the City Council approve the City Clerk job description? Should the City Council authorize staff to advertise the position as noted below?

PROPOSAL/ANALYSIS:

After gathering and reviewing job descriptions for city clerks from 8 of the city's comparable cities (Lino Lakes, Farmington, Hugo, Stillwater, Rosemount, Prior Lake, Ramsey and Elk River), staff drafted the proposed job description for city clerk that is included in your packet. Information about salary ranges was also obtained from these communities to help identify which grade the position should be advertised at.

The job description includes duties in the area of council and administration support, records administration, licensing, elections and communications. Proposed minimum requirements for the city clerk role include a two year degree, 3-5 years of public administration experience, a valid drivers' license and ability to obtain notary public license and clerk certification in the times noted.

Based upon the salary data received from the comparable cities listed above, staff recommends the position be advertised at Grade 13 of the Non-Union Employee Wage Schedule or an annual salary of \$86, 619.87-\$110,774.84.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The exact fiscal impact will be known when a candidate is brought forth for hiring. Estimated annual cost for the position including salary, benefits and taxes is \$121,935-\$147,525. That will obviously be less in 2024 since the position will not be filled for the entire year.

The deputy clerk position-wages, benefits and taxes- were budgeted at \$111,000 for 2024 so the position will not exceed that budget impact this year.

OPTIONS:

- 1) Approve City Clerk Job Description and Authorize staff to advertise for applicants at grade 13 of the non-union wage schedule.
- 2) Amend the job description or proposed grade and then authorize staff to advertise the position.
- 3) Do not advertise for a City Clerk. Direct staff to advertise for the vacant Deputy Clerk position.

RECOMMENDATION:

"Motion to approve the City Clerk job description as presented and authorize staff to advertise the position at grade 13 on the non-union wage schedule."

POSITION SUMMARY

Performs all statutory functions and legal requirements of the Office of City Clerk by coordinating and executing administrative duties for the Administration Department and City Council, overseeing official records management and retention, data practices, elections, licensing, and related work as apparent or assigned. A primary function of this position is to develop and maintain positive relationships with staff, council, citizens, and other groups and agencies. Work is performed under limited supervision.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

COUNCIL AND ADMINISTRATION:

- Attends, records, and reports at City Council meetings and work sessions; coordinates
 and compiles the Council agenda packets for distribution; prepares and publishes official

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Background Information

In November 2023, the City of Forest Lake approved an organizational study proposal submitted by DDA Human Resources, Inc. The purpose of the study was to help the City of Forest Lake determine the most appropriate staffing structure and process efficiencies for providing City services in the Administration Department as well as Community Development and Finance. Since several positions are currently vacant, the City determined it was the proper time to assess roles and responsibilities within City Hall.

*The most up-to-date City of Forest Lake Organizational Chart is attached for reference as Addendum D.

Assessment Process Summary

The study consisted of an evaluation of workflow, staffing needs, and assessment of organizational structure and culture with a focus on relationships within. This was accomplished through interviews with elected officials; several Administration, Finance, and Community Development employees; the Police and Fire Chiefs as well as a review of job descriptions, current positions and practices, and other relevant information. The list of those interviewed is attached as Addendum A. The goal of the process was to develop recommendations and implementation strategies to assure an efficient, customer and employee-oriented service organization with a positive culture.

Each person was interviewed during which questions were asked to generate conversation that would provide needed feedback around the history of the Forest Lake organization and for the evaluation of workflow, staffing needs, and assessment of organizational structure and culture. The questions used to generate conversation with the City Council are attached as Addendum B and the questions used to generate conversation with the City Staff is attached as Addendum C. All interviewees were also provided the option to follow up with any additional thoughts that may have arisen after the interview.

Upon conclusion of the fact-finding process, the City Administrator was updated on initial findings and a draft report was created. After discussion on the findings and draft report, this final report was prepared for consideration by the City Council.

Observations

The interviews and informational gathering process led to the following organizational observations.

- A Human Resources position is needed as soon as possible.
 - ➤ This need is based on the observation that there is presently not a position within the organization that is conducting the HR duties that are necessary in an organization such as the City of Forest Lake.
 - ➤ This position should be someone who is well versed and experienced in all HR functions such as hiring, onboarding, offboarding, employee benefits, required employee training, Federal and State human resources mandates, updating of job descriptions, facilitation of employee concerns, and other human resources duties.

- The Assistant City Administrator and Deputy Clerk positions are currently vacant. The Assistant City Administrator role was a funnel for duties where there was not a clear place to assign the duty. Recommendations for how to proceed in filling these roles are presented below under the recommendations section.
- The City of Forest Lake has been growing while being understaffed and underfunded for approximately the past 10 years.
 - ➤ Equipment and infrastructure needs are often prioritized and funded; however, staffing needs have not historically been addressed.
 - ➤ It is the consensus of most of the interviewees including Council Members and staff that City Staff is overwhelmed.
 - Often the answer regarding the ask for more staffing is, "Not this year."
 - ➤ The need is known and understood by leadership; however, the needed funding is difficult to support.
 - ➤ The 10-Year Financial Plan was a necessary step in planning for the future.
- There is a need to move away from the historical practice of combining positions and duties when staff depart to allow remaining staff the ability to effectively serve and complete tasks.
- In a memo dated November 3, 2023, the City Administrator updated the City Council on 5 positions requested in the 2024 budget. These positions are listed below and recommendations regarding these positions are included in the related section of the report below. As of the time of this report, these 5 positions were removed from the 2024 Budget and replaced with a Human Resources position. There is still a need to address and fund the below positions.
 - Code and Zoning Enforcement
 - Engineering Tech
 - Planning and EDA Supervisor
 - Community Service Officer (removed by the City Council)
 - Stormwater Technician
 - ➤ In addition, the memo outlined steps the City Administrator took to address the current vacancies until this report is finalized and implemented. One of those steps was to engage an outside firm to take over the recording and transcription of meeting minutes.
 - ➤ Development and adherence to a 10-Year Position Plan that is incorporated into the 10-Year Financial Plan is needed.
- External/Public Communications. Recently the City hired a consultant firm to assist with external or public communications and messaging. There is a need to make citizens better aware of what is happening in the City.
- Organizational Culture.
 - ➤ The culture within the organization is better than it has been in a while; however, still needs some work.
 - Recent departures and turnover raise a concern about the current culture within the organization.

- Morale is perceived by a number of the interviewed including City Council and staff to be low at City Hall.
- > There is a sense within the organization that staff are on edge. This is due to the fact that staff do not know when their roles/duties will change or be added to, wondering why their co-workers are leaving, not feeling communicated with, and wondering what the vision and direction for the organization is.
- ➤ It is difficult to make needed changes when staff is at capacity. Often it is easier to just stay the same. There is not necessarily a fear of change but a fear of what it will take to make the change.
- Hiring for fit has been a challenge.
- > Presently there are no annual staff reviews or feedback completed or provided.
- ➤ Employees in City Hall (Administration, Finance, Community Development) are presently "starved" for time.
- Staff recognition is perceived as non-existent based on the conversations had with staff.
- On a positive note, there are a number of staff dedicated to the success of the City.
- Internal/Organizational Communications
 - Internal communications are getting better.
 - There are not as many silos within the organization as in the past.
 - ➤ A hole in internal communications is the communication of important challenges, issues, and items across and through the organization Flow of communications among and between the Council-City Administrator-Department Heads-Staff.
- The duties and roles of the City's Parks and Recreation Supervisor position need to be clearly aligned with the competing needs of the City in this area.
- Presently, the Building Inspections team is housed under the Fire Department, which is not typically seen in other cities. The Community Development staff and Building Inspections staff are presently siloed because they are in different departments, which is not efficient or effective.
- Presently, the Building Maintenance Team is housed under the Fire Department. This is not typical in most cities. There is a need to evaluate the positions on this team in order to obtain the best value for the City and Public Works Department.
- Presently, the Fire Department is not in need of administrative support; however, this is likely to change as the Fire Department grows and progresses. Fire reports/reporting need to be done by someone with a fire background and presently there are Fire Department personnel accomplishing this task. Sometimes there is a need for assistance with payroll administration. Annual evaluation of additional assistance should take place.
- There is a need for better synergy across the positions that cover the front desk at City Hall due to all of them presently being in different departments and having different leaders/managers.
- There is not a clear succession plan city-wide nor within departments.

- With the vacancy in the Assistant City Administrator role, there is also a vacancy in the Airport Director role which has left the airport essentially un-managed.
- Much staff time is spent reacting to individual, smaller concerns and issues brought up by appointed/elected officials as well as a small percentage of "loud" citizens. This scope creep can be a drain on resources and takes away from focusing on bigger picture challenges, projects, and issues. Adherence to the 10-Year Financial Plan, a 10-Year Position Plan, a clear direction, strategies, a road map, and a common vision/direction are necessary.
- All those interviewed as part of this study realize and understand that Forest Lake has an
 opportunity in front of them as an organization to do something they haven't been able to
 do in quite some time. The goal for the City is to take prudent action moving forward.

Recommendations

Upon analysis of all the information, the following recommendations are put forth for consideration by the Forest Lake City Council and Staff.

- It is strongly recommended that the City of Forest Lake hire a Human Resources position immediately. This position can focus on human resources items within the organization such as:
 - ➤ Hiring, recruiting, and marketing Forest Lake as a place to thrive professionally
 - Onboarding and offboarding of staff
 - Coordination of employee benefits
 - Coordination of required and desired employee training
 - Understanding and implementation of Federal and State human resources related mandates
 - Updating and maintenance of job descriptions
 - > Facilitation of employee concerns and grievances
 - Coordination of FMLA rules and process
 - Coordination of annual performance review process for all staff
 - > Implementation and coordination of employee wellness initiatives
 - Implementation and coordination of employee recognition initiatives
- Vacant Assistant City Administrator position.* It is recommended that the City hire an Assistant to the City Administrator or Management Analyst position instead of an Assistant City Administrator (ACA). With the ACA position, there is a level of expectations around duties, authority, and responsibility that the City of Forest Lake as an organization is presently not in need of. There is; however, still a need for a role to assist the City Administrator with duties that do not fall under the purview of department heads and existing staff. The Assistant to the City Administrator or Management Analyst role would sufficiently meet these expectations. Recommended areas of focus for this role to include:
 - Communications-City lead facilitating, coordinating, and overseeing communications efforts, consultant, and staff.
 - Human Resources-supervises the HR position.

- Organizational Compliance-In collaboration with department heads, monitors operations to ensure organizational compliance with applicable laws, regulations, rules, polices and ordinances.
- ➤ City Consultant Contracts-Negotiates, implements, and oversees City contracts and related agreements with consultants.
- ➤ Airport Director-Supervises and coordinates a consultant Airport Director.
- ➤ Employee Committees-Coordinates employee committees including the Safety Committee.
- Process Improvements-Takes the lead on business process improvement efforts to enhance customer service, better utilize technology, and create efficiency.
- Organizational Understanding-Researches policy issues and provides recommendations for the City Administrator.
- Depending on what is decided regarding the direction and needs for Parks and Recreation in the City, have the Parks and Recreation position(s) report to this position.
 - *After discussions with the current City Administrator, it became evident that a more viable option to consider would be the hiring of an Administrative Services Director for this position with the possibility of hiring a management analyst in the future as well.
- Deputy Clerk position. Hire a City Clerk position and transfer the duties of Clerk from the City Administrator to the City Clerk position. Another option is to keep the City Administrator as the City Clerk and re-hire the Deputy Clerk position; however, provide the Deputy Clerk with essentially the same authority as the City Administrator/Clerk.
 - ➤ This position could also coordinate and oversee the broadcast and recording of appropriate City Council and Commission meetings.
 - > This position can supervise the outside firm that is recording and transcribing meeting minutes.
 - Assist with organizational compliance
- Conduct a staffing, market, comparison study to better understand the number of positions the City of Forest Lake currently has in Administration, Finance, and Community Development and compare that to cities similar in size and organizational structure. A Position Comparison Study was provided to the City in early January 2024.
- Clearly establish who the Interim City Administrator is in the City Administrator's absence. Options include:
 - Community Development Director
 - Finance Director
 - Administrative Services Director
- Work toward succession planning in all departments.
 - ➤ Work toward having a 2nd in command position for each department/department head. This will provide for a leader/strategist (department head) and operations manager (2nd in command) for each department.

- Recommendations for the positions asked for in the 2024 Budget:
 - ➤ Code and Zoning Enforcement This position seems to be a need for the City and should be included in a 10-Year Position Plan as such.
 - ➤ Engineer Continue to utilize a consultant City Engineer. City engineering requires expertise in a number of areas of which it is difficult to find one engineer with all of those levels of expertise. Therefore, even if the City were to hire a City Engineer, it is very likely they would continue to need the services of a consultant engineer for specific expertise. Hiring an in-house Engineering Tech is a need for the City and should be included in a 10-Year Position Plan. This position would handle in-house site plan, grading, and building permit review and coordination in addition to various Public Works needs.
 - ➢ Planning and EDA Supervisor This position would be viewed as the second in command in Community & Economic Development (Recommended name change for the department-adding Economic Development). This is similar to the existing Police Captain, Accounting Manager, Public Works Foremen, and Deputy Fire Chief as well as the proposed Administrative Services Director. Moving forward with the hiring of this position would provide the Community Development Director with someone who can focus on operations within the department while the Community Development Director focuses on leading and strategic efforts.
 - > Stormwater Technician The recommendation would be to utilize the services of the consultant City Engineer or similar firm to accomplish the duties of this position.
 - In addition, this memo outlines steps the City Administrator took to address the current vacancies until this report is finalized and implemented. One of those steps was to engage an outside firm to take over the recording and transcription of meeting minutes. It is recommended that this continue in to the future saving large amounts of staff time and resources on recording and drafting minutes. As mentioned above, this service should be coordinated by the City Clerk or Deputy Clerk position.
 - As noted above, the creation of a 10-Year Position Plan is essential to plan for the hiring and funding of these and other, future needed positions in the City.
- When filling open positions into the future, hire for organizational fit. Also, the City should
 not be afraid to repost a position if current candidates are not a proper fit for the
 organization. Having to deal with turnover and constantly hiring for positions is often more
 costly than taking the time to find the right fit.
- External/Public Communications. Recently the City hired a consultant firm to assist with external and public communications. This is a good solution and should be continued and evaluated for effectiveness into the future. Other factors to consider include:
 - Due to the nature of emergency communications needing to be instantaneous, it would be difficult to utilize the consultant or even a dedicated city employee in the moment during an emergency. It is recommended that emergency communications be kept within the Fire and Police Departments with assistance from the communications consultant and City Staff as needed.
 - ➤ Utility Bill and general mailers should be considered as an additional form of communication for community members who are not on social media or online.

- Organizational Culture and internal communications recommendations include the following:
 - Strive for a culture where employees feel heard and respected.
 - Provide the City Administrator's Weekly Report that is sent to the Council also to staff.
 - Conduct quarterly all staff meetings.
 - Consult new HR position for recommendations on how to effectively communicate within the organization.
 - An annual facilitated goal and strategy discussion with City Council and Department Heads is recommended. This would not be a session to come up with a mission statement or tag line; rather, it is an opportunity for Council Members and City Staff to get in the same room to hear and understand the desires and direction of each individual and formulate from those discussions, a list of common strategies and goals for the City to accomplish. These discussions would include assigning strategy champions and timelines to better focus on implementation of the strategies.
 - Provide new Council Member and Commission Member training that involves staff from each department and legal counsel. Strongly encourage newly elected officials as well as seasoned elected officials to attend the League of Minnesota Cities trainings designed for new and tenured City Council Members.
 - Provide opportunities for staff and City Council socialization such as holiday potlucks, simple birthday celebrations, years of service recognitions.
 - ➤ Provide staff recognition from the City Council as well as the Leadership Team. Even as simple as saying, "Thank You".
- It is important to clearly define what the City of Forest Lake wants to accomplish from a Parks and Recreation perspective before making any changes to this area and position. This needs to happen as soon as possible as the current model is unsustainable. After a clear direction is established, adjustments to the duties and roles of the Parks and Recreation position and an updated job description for the defined need should be completed.
 - What are the goals and roles for the City as it relates to:
 - Events coordinating, planning and management
 - Programming
 - Partnerships (i.e. school district, FLAA, etc.)
 - Role of and with the Parks Commission
 - Parks Maintenance
 - Senior Center
 - Golf Course
 - Athletic Complex.
 - ➤ Have the Parks & Recreation position report either to and through the Administrative Services Director position if it is more events and programming related or through the Public Works Director if it is more maintenance focused. This could also be separated in to 2 different positions if the needs dictate.
 - Utilize a park planning consultant for park planning and infrastructure development projects.

- Conduct a review and update of all City job descriptions as well as a classification and compensation study for all positions. Coordinated by the HR position and conducted by an outside consulting firm.
- Conduct annual reviews and feedback for all staff. Coordinated by the HR position.
- Move the Building Inspections team under the Community & Economic Development
 Department. Consider hiring a consultant to assist in evaluating and setting up the most
 affective process that leads to the best transition scenario. Evaluation of the need for
 daytime fire response should also be included. This should be considered a long-term
 initiative.
- Move the Building Maintenance team that is currently housed under the Fire Department to the Public Works Department. Evaluate the positions on this team in order to obtain the best value for the City and Public Works Department.

Administrative Assistant Positions

- There is a need for administrative assistance across multiple departments. Cross train these positions and share resources across multiple departments.
- ➤ A staffing, market, comparison study will help define the number of appropriate administrative support positions for organizational size. However, the City can and needs to assess internally the amount and need for administrative assistance.
 - Example: Finance Department administrative assistants seem to be set with accounts payable, utility billing, and payroll positions. Share an administrative assistant position across public safety between Police and Fire. Have 3 administrative assistant positions that are cross trained and can assist in Administration, Community & Economic Development, Public Works, and covering the front desk at City Hall.
- Build better synergy among the positions that cover the front desk. Consider having one of the 3 administrative assistant positions for Administration, Community & Economic Development, and Public Works focus on covering the front desk as City Hall.
- ➤ In order to create synergy within the administrative services positions, consider having them all report to the Administrative Services Director position or at the very least, have the Administrative Services Director position coordinate with the department heads to facilitate a synergistic approach to providing administrative assistance.
- Explore filling the position of Airport Director with a consultant in the aviation industry.
 Other options would be to assign the management of the Airport Commission, grants, and
 other administrative duties to an administrative position. Hire or assign a portion of the
 airport maintenance to Public Works and split the proposed storm water position 75/25
 with the airport supporting 25% of the cost.

- Continue to keep The 10-Year Financial Plan updated, current and front of mind. Let it be the City's funding guide. Include and keep updated a 10-Year Position Plan as part of the 10-Year Financial Plan
- Consider organizational/staffing studies for other departments such as Police and Public Works. The previous Police Department staffing study was completed in 2017.
- Conduct a City Council and Staff retreat and strategic planning session at least annually.
 This will provide the leadership team with the opportunity for team building as well as clear direction.

Implementation

As with any plan, success or failure ultimately comes down to implementation. It is recommended the City take time to discuss an implementation plan to prioritize items of greatest need and outline the steps needed to achieve each objective.

Once the City Council has determined priority action items from this report and with staff input, the City Administrator should assign each recommendation a timeline for accomplishment and who is responsible to oversee implementation. For implementation of some recommendations, a project manager who can ensure things are moving forward may be assigned.

Implementation of many of these recommendations will have an impact on the workforce that is both positive and negative. Some who struggle with change will have difficulty, while others will soar. The Council and Staff Leadership Team will have to determine a course and then stay the course. This is not to say changes can't be made, but not every complaint about a change should cause alteration of the focus. Potential changes to the plan should be thoughtfully considered prior to being made.

Conclusion

The City of Forest Lake presently has an opportunity in front of them as an organization and the support to do a number of initiatives that have been untenable in the past. Though as an organization there is presently some angst and struggle around workforce culture, city staff and elected officials are committed and dedicated to their jobs and to providing citizens the best possible service. Forest Lake clearly provides good services, and it appears the citizenry is satisfied with the efforts of the Council and staff. However, no organization is perfect, and there are ample opportunities for change that will improve efficiency and service quality.

If the City moves forward with implementing proactive changes, the organization will be positioned well for future growth. The City is blessed with residential and commercial growth opportunities, and those should continue to be encouraged. Forest Lake is a fine community that will continue to have opportunities to make a positive impact on residents, visitors, and business prospects.

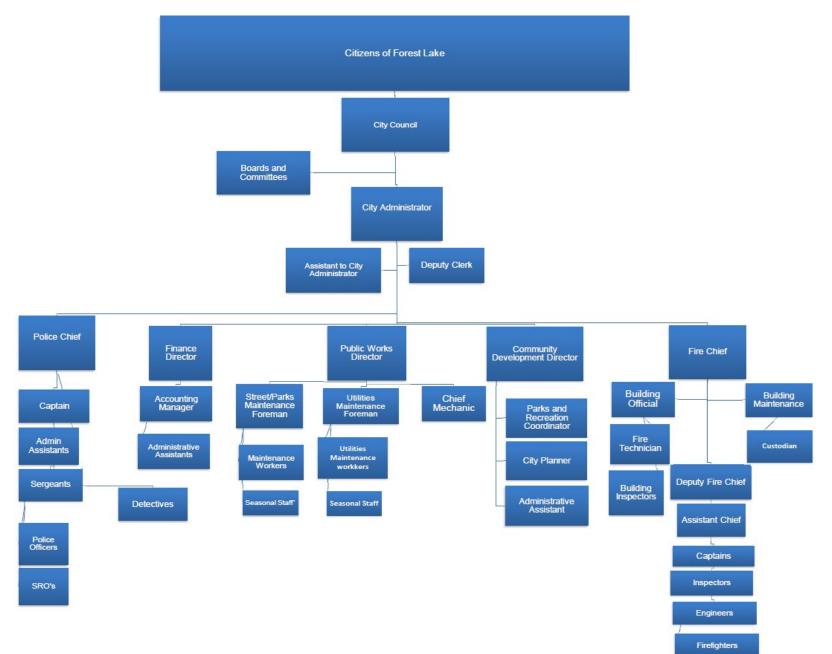

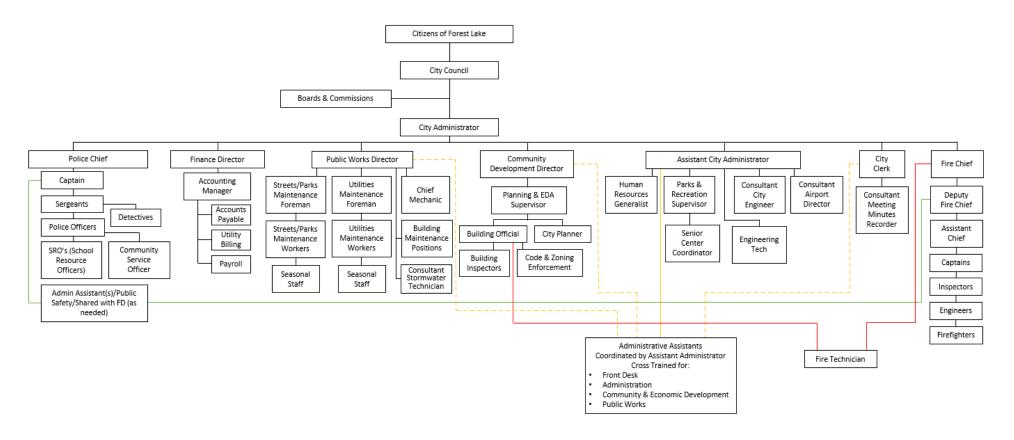

BACKGROUND:

The Minnesota Legislative Session kicks off on Monday, February $12^{\rm th}$ at noon. In anticipation of the upcoming session, as well as long range planning, staff are seeking direction from the council on what bonding priorities to pursue not only this year but to set up for future years.

Staff is asking the council to look beyond just this session, so the city has the opportunity to put in requests to Minnesota Management and Budget (MMB) as they are the ones who gather the requests from state and local governments to help put together the Governor's bonding bill proposal. The committee staff in each the House and Senate also use this list to help schedule capital investment committee tours during the interim. While these requests are typically due in June of the odd number years to prepare for the bonding bills traditionally passed in the even numbered years, the city can start talking about them this year in anticipation for next year. This gives staff time to focus and get better details on projects, align with community partners and identify where local funding matches could come from. More information about the MMB process is available at Capital Budget FAQ for State Agencies, Local Governments, and Political Subdivisions / Minnesota Management and Budget (MMB) (mn.gov) Resolutions from the city council are required in this formal process and the League of MN Cities as model resolutions the city may consider next year for not only a single project request but multiple projects.

ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL:

What state bonding proposals should the city pursue in 2024?

What state bonding proposals should be considered for submission to MMB in 2025?

PROPOSAL/ANALYSIS:

2024 Suggestion:

With the help of Washington County, their lobbyist, Rep. Anderson and Sen Housley, a bill is being drafted for the Forest Road and CSAH 32 project. The city is asking for \$4 million and will need to contribute \$400,000 based upon the current estimates. A one-page flyer has been created for use in talking with state legislators and is included in this packet.

2025 and beyond possibilities:

Staff reviewed the CIP and thought these projects may be ones the council considers pursuing bonding funding for in future years. Projects that have a regional significance are likely to score better through the MMB process. Exact details on timing, cost and scope would be finalized at a later date:

- Elmcrest Improvements (could be a great project to collaborate with other cities and counties on thereby scoring higher with a regional significance).
- North Shore Trail and North Shore Drive Street and Utility Improvements
- Fenway Ave Improvements
- 12th St Improvements
- Downtown Plan
 - o Boat launch relocation
 - Shoreline stabilization
- Public Works Facility or community park at old site once new one is built.
- Park Improvements such as lights at Fenway, etc

FISCAL IMPACT:

To be determined with each project. Having some local contribution will lead to the project being better received.

DISCUSSION:

County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 32 (11th Avenue) Pedestrian and Safety Improvement Project

The City of Forest Lake requests **\$4 million** in state funds to complete the necessary improvements along CSAH 32 and the realignment of Forest Road



Issue At-A-Glance

- Washington County is leading a reconstruction project along County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 32 in the City of Forest Lake in 2026 to address poor pavement conditions, restricted access, lack of off-road pedestrian facilities, lack of stormwater treatment, and worsening congestion in the corridor. Currently, city-owned Forest Road is part of an offset intersection with CSAH 32 and Centennial Drive immediately adjacent to the Hardwood Creek Regional Trail and was identified as part of a corridor traffic study for infrastructure improvements.
- This proposed project would widen CSAH 32 to include shoulders, curb and gutter and improved turn lanes and intersection control. Pedestrian and bicycle facility upgrades include a grade separated trail to connect an existing gap in pedestrian facilities between Trunk Highway 61 and CSAH 33 and a trailhead parking area for the Hardwood Creek Regional Trail. The project proposes to realign Forest Road to the west to connect with 4th Street and would include pedestrian improvements and a roundabout, improving safety, congestion, and circulation and maintaining full access to and from Forest Road and nearby affordable housing, schools, and parks. The new roadway realignment would be constructed on land that is vacant or for purchase from sellers who have been engaged during property owner outreach efforts and are willing participants. This

realignment provides the opportunity to construct stormwater features that will provide treatment of drainage runoff before directly discharging into Clear Lake as it currently does now.

• The City of Forest Lake explored this realignment several years ago, but it was to cost prohibitive. It emerged again during project engagement efforts as the preferred alternative with broad community support; however, it increases the city's cost share on the project beyond what it is able to contribute. Without state funding assistance the project team will need to proceed with a rehabilitation project as the City of Forest Lake cannot participate financially with this project.
