3. Council Deliberations and Candidate Selection

At 6:00 PM, Council reconvened in Chambers for deliberations. City Attorney Johnson provided a summary of the day so far. She explained the discussion was to review the top two selections from the City Council for the City Administrator candidate position.

Bart Fischer, Management Consultant for DDA Human Resources, Inc., clarified that one City Council Member only voted for one candidate.

City Attorney Johnson stated that Joe Gaa received four votes for the top choice. City Attorney Johnson stated that Kristina Handt received one vote for the top choice. She commented that Kristina Handt was not part of the interview process.

Councilmember Husnik commented that Kristina Handt had pulled out of the race and had not submitted paperwork for the process.

Councilmember Erickson advocated allowing Kristina Handt to be part of the conversation since she is currently filling the role.

Councilmember Roberts stated that it would be beneficial to consider Kristina Handt since she has filled the role well for the last six months.

Mayor Bain stated that they received feedback from the department panel that Joe Gaa would be their primary candidate without identifying a second candidate. The community panel had identified Al-Rifai Tarig as their primary candidate with Joe Gaa and Devin Swanberg as their second choice. She stated that since Joe Gaa has risen to the top.

Councilmember Roberts voiced concerns about Joe Gaa working at his previous job for four months before leaving since it was not the right fit. BACKGROUND: White Bear Lake Ducks Unlimited has applied to conduct bingo and a raffle at Friar's on September 7, 2024.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. 349.166, organizations are eligible to obtain an exempt permit to conduct a raffle without obtaining a full gambling license and without abiding by all provisions required by licensed organizations if:

- The organization conducts lawful gambling on five or less days per year;
- The organization does not award more than \$50,000 in prizes for lawful gambling in a calendar year;
- The organization submits a board-prescribed application and pays a fee of \$100 to the board for each gambling occasion, and receives an exempt permit number from the board...The application must include the date and location of the occasion and the types of lawful gambling to be conducted;
- The organization notifies the local government unit 30 days before the lawful gambling occasion, or 60 days for an occasion held in a city of the first class;
- The organization purchases all gambling equipment and supplies from a licensed distributor; and,
- The organization reports to the board, on a single-page form prescribed by the board, within 30 days of each gambling occasion, the gross receipts, prizes, expenses, expenditures of net profits from the occasion, and the identification of the licensed distributor from whom all gambling equipment was purchased.

Additionally, City Ordinance, Section 116.10 requires that any organization applying for any lawful gambling permit under Minn. Stat. 349.166 must obtain a local (city) permit specific to the dates. No background check is required for exempt or excluded gambling permit approval.

White Bear Lake Ducks Unlimited meets all state and local requirements for approval of the

LG220 application. Staff has not located any information which would allow Council to deny the permit application per code.

RECOMMENDATIONS: Approve Application for Exempt Permit and authorize City Clerk to sign the same to return to the MN Gambling Control Board.

WHEREAS, a Statewide Primary Election will be held on August 13, 2024; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Minn. Stat. 204B.20, election judges shall be appointed to serve in an election precinct and the appointing authority shall designate a judge to serve as head judge; and,

WHEREAS, Minn. Stat. 204B.021, Subd. 2 requires that election judge appointments be made at least 25 days before the election at which the judges will serve and that additional appointments may be made after the 25-day mark should the need arise.

WHEREAS, election judges for the 2024 Minnesota Primary Election are listed in Exhibit A, attached hereto.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO INTERIM CITYADMINISTRATOR EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE INTERIM CITY ADMINISTRATOR EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT ("First Amendment") is made, entered into and effective as of the ___ day of July, 2024, by and between the City of Forest Lake, a municipal corporation of the State of Minnesota ("City") and Kristina Handt. ("Employee"); and

WHEREAS, City and Employee entered into an Interim City Administrator Employment Agreement ("Agreement") effective January 16, 2024, whereby the Employee agreed to perform the services of the City Clerk and City Administrator for the City ("Services") as described in said Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend the Agreement terms related to Employee benefits and length of Agreement; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants of each to the other contained in this First Amendment and other good and valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto do covenant and agree as follows:

1. SECTION 3 – TERM OF AGREEMENT shall be replaced in its entirety as follows:

SECTION 3 - TERM OF AGREEMENT

- A. Employee will serve as the Interim City Administrator until September 30, 2024, or the starting date of a permanent City Administrator, whichever comes later, unless the parties agree in writing to extend the term of this Agreement.
- B. After September 1, 2024, either party may terminate this Agreement with thirty days written notice to the other party.
- C. Notwithstanding Section 3(A & B), Employee's tenure, service, and authority as Interim City Administrator of the City shall be subject to termination for cause by the City Council at any time by a majority vote. Cause shall be limited to malfeasance in office, gross misconduct, conviction for a felony, conviction for an illegal act involving personal gain, willful neglect of duties, or public official misconduct.
- D. Upon expiration or termination of this Agreement, neither Party will have any further claim against the other and the City's employment of Employee will automatically end, unless the Parties enter into a subsequent employment contract.

2. SECTION 4 – SALARY, PENSION AND BENEFITS shall be replaced in its entirety as follows:

SECTION 4 – SALARY, PENSION AND BENEFITS

- A. During the term of this Agreement, the City will pay the Employee \$7,200 biweekly for said services. In the event that this Agreement is terminated or expires during a pay period, the final salary payment to the Employee pursuant to this Agreement shall be prorated to termination date.
 - Employee and City acknowledge and agree that the salary provided for as the City Administrator, does not bind the City offer the same or similar salary for a permanent City Administrator position.
- B. Employee shall be eligible for all the benefits provided in the Forest Lake Personnel Manual to any exempt, non-represented employee. Employee shall be considered a fifteen-year, exempt, non-represented employee for the purposes of calculating vacation accrual.
- 3. Except as provided for above, the terms and provisions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- 4. This First Amendment and all disputes or controversies arising out of or relating to this First Amendment or the transactions contemplated hereby shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the internal laws of the State of Minnesota, without regard to the laws of any other jurisdiction that might be applied because of the conflicts of laws principles of the State of Minnesota.
- 5. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed a waiver by the City of any governmental immunity defenses, statutory or otherwise. Further, any and all claims brought by Employee or their successors or assigns, shall be subject to any governmental immunity defenses of the City and the maximum liability limits provided by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 466.
- 6. This First Amendment may be executed in two or more counterparts, all of which shall be considered one and the same instrument and shall become effective when one or more counterparts have been signed by the parties and delivered to the other parties. Delivery of a copy of this First Amendment bearing an original signature by facsimile transmission or by electronic mail in "portable document format" shall have the same effect as physical delivery of the paper document bearing the original signature.
- 7. This First Amendment shall not be amended, modified or supplemented except by a written instrument signed by an authorized representative of each party.

Re: 2024 Arts in the Park Entertainment Agreements

In May 2024 the City Council entered into agreement with the Rockin' Hollywoods for their performance at Arts in the Park on August 27, 2024. However, that Agreement was for a dollar value in excess of what the City Council approved. Thus, the enclose First Amendment to the City of Forest Lake Entertainment Performance Agreement was prepared to rectify the payment discrepancy. The City will now pay the Rockin' Hollywoods \$2,300 for their services on August 27th.

Staff Recommendation

If the Council elects to remove the enclosed agreement from the Consent Agenda, staff would recommend the City Council *move to approve the First Amendment to the City of Forest Lake Entertainment Performance Agreement with the Rockin' Hollywoods.*

FIRST AMENDMENT TO CITY OF FOREST LAKE ENTERTAINMENT PERFORMANCE AGREEMENT WITH THE ROCKIN' HOLLYWOODS

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO CITY OF FOREST LAKE ENTERTAINMENT PERFORMANCE AGREEMENT WITH THE ROCKIN' HOLLYWOODS ("First Amendment") is made, entered into and effective as of the _____ day of June 2024, by and between the City of Forest Lake, a municipal corporation of the State of Minnesota ("City") and The Rockin' Hollywoods ("Performer"); and

WHEREAS, City and Performer entered into a City of Forest lake Entertainment Performance Agreement ("Agreement"), dated May 24, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the City and Performer desire to amend the Agreement to reflect corrected compensation.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants of each to the other contained in this First Amendment and other good and valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto do covenant and agree as follows:

- 1. Fee in Paragraph 1, Performance Details is changed to \$2,300.
- 2. Except as provided for above, the terms and provisions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- 3. This First Amendment and all disputes or controversies arising out of or relating to this First Amendment or the transactions contemplated hereby shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the internal laws of the State of Minnesota, without regard to the laws of any other jurisdiction that might be applied because of the conflicts of laws principles of the State of Minnesota.
- 4. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed a waiver by the Lessor of any governmental immunity defenses, statutory or otherwise. Further, any and all claims brought by Promoter or their successors or assigns, shall be subject to any governmental immunity defenses of the Lessor and the maximum liability limits provided by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 466.
- 5. This First Amendment may be executed in two or more counterparts, all of which shall be considered one and the same instrument and shall become effective when one or more counterparts have been signed by the parties and delivered to the other parties. Delivery of a copy of this First Amendment bearing an original signature by facsimile transmission or by electronic mail in "portable document format" shall have the same effect as physical delivery of the paper document bearing the original signature.
- 6. This First Amendment shall not be amended, modified or supplemented except by a written instrument signed by an authorized representative of each party.

TERMINATION AGREEMENT AND RELEASE

THIS TERMINATION AGREEMENT AND RELEASE, (the "Termination") is fully effective as of July _____, 2024, and is entered into by DDA Human Resources, Inc. ("DDA") and the City of Forest Lake (the "City") (collectively, the "Parties").

RECITALS

Recital No. 1 DDA submitted a quote (the "Search Quote") to the City to assist with a search for the City's next City Administrator. There were multiple adjustments to the scope of services.

<u>Recital No. 2</u> The Parties have mutually agreed to end the current professional relationship and although the City did not select a permanent City Administrator, both parties agree that DDA is entitled to just compensation for the work they have performed to date.

<u>Recital No. 3</u> The parties mutually agree to this Termination with the terms and conditions stated below.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The parties hereby mutually agree to the following terms and conditions:

- 1.1 RELEASE OF CLAIMS. In consideration of the mutual promises contained within this Agreement and the Search Quote, the sufficiency of each which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby unconditionally, mutually release and forever discharge each other, and each other's past and present respective owners, members, employees, insurers, agents, elected officials, staff, successors and assigns from any and all Claims that were made, or could have been made, of whatever kind or nature that is in any way connected with the City's search for a City Administrator (the "Released Claims"). The Parties understand and expressly agree that the Released Claims include all unknown damages and consequences on account of, or because of, the Claims asserted or that could have been asserted.
- **1.2 NO ADMISSION OF DEFAULT.** The parties hereby agree that none of the parties are making an admission of default under the Search Quote.
- **1.3 NO RECRUITMENT RIGHTS.** Upon termination of the Agreement regarding the Search Quote, DDA shall have no exclusive recruitment rights to City's hiring of a City Administrator.
- **1.4 FEE PAYMENT.** The City shall pay DDA ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) as full and final payment for all the services DDA performed under the Search Quote.
- **1.5 ENTIRE AGREEMENT.** The Parties further understand and agree that this Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the

Released Claims, and that the terms of this Agreement are contractual and not a mere recital. By their signatures below, the undersigned each represent that they have carefully read this document, know and understand the terms and effect, have fully discussed the terms and effect of this document with their attorneys, have authority to enter into this Agreement, and have signed this Agreement as their free and considered act. The Parties each acknowledge that the terms and conditions and releases set forth in all pages are a material part of this Agreement and are accepted.

BACKGROUND:

The City adopted a 10-year capital plan in December 2023. The 10-year capital plan is an important document that is crucial to the City's annual budget preparation and ensure long-term success of the City. This plan is updated annually by City staff based on new information and needs. City staff presented the 10-year plan at the June 24, 2024 City Council meeting. It was requested by Council to bring back information pertaining to 2025 and 2026 to focus more on upcoming capital items.

ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL:

What questions does the council have about projects proposed for 2025 or 2026? What, if any, changes would the Council suggest to the projects proposed for 2025 and 2026?

PROPOSAL/ANALYSIS:

A copy of the plan is included in your packet that includes capital project and purchases for 2025-2026. These include vehicles, machinery, park equipment and improvements and street and utility infrastructure improvements.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The total estimated costs of projects and capital purchases for 2025 and 2026 is \$31,856,295 for the 72 projects. Funding sources have been identified for each project and capital purchase.

Wellhead Protection activities prevent well contamination by managing potential contaminant sources in the land area that contributes water to the well. Public water suppliers are required to develop Wellhead Protection Plans as stated in the Minnesota Groundwater Protection Act and the federal Safe Drinking Water Act. The Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) is responsible for administering the State WHP Program. Under the WHP Program, public water systems are required to develop and implement a plan that protects its drinking water source.

To: Honorable Mayor and City Council

From: Dave Adams, Public Works Director

BACKGROUND:

The City of Forest Lake recently received a petition from residents to convert a two-way street into a oneway street. Staff has been looking into the request and all of the different details that would go into the conversion and feel that feedback from City Council would be the first step into

ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL:

Does the City Council want to entertain converting streets into one-way streets?

If yes, does the City Council want staff to develop a policy before bringing the current petition forward?

PROPOSAL/ANALYSIS:

Currently the City does not have any one-way streets, so this request would be a change to the City's current street system. There would be many factors to consider if request was made including emergency services, street maintenance (street sweeping/snow plowing), refuse hauling, signage, and what threshold of residents are for and against this change.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Fiscal impact for the City would be the staff time to review petition, coordination with refuse haulers, and cost of signage (One-Way/Do Not Enter).

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff is seeking City Council guidance on this topic of One-Way streets and are looking for direction on how to proceed.
