Jeff Kline, Resident, stated that the golf cart and utility-terrain vehicle (UTV) discussion needs to be done correctly. He suggested separating rules for golf carts and UTVs because the noise levels and uses are different. He provided an example of the regulations used in various districts in Clear Lake, lowa

Miriam Aaland, Amira Choice Senior Living, stated that they purchased a six-seater golf cart that they would like to be able to transport senior citizens to the park on Tuesdays. She agreed that there should be rules and regulations to be able to utilize these vehicles.

Jeremy James, 25157 Firefly Avenue, Wyoming, stated he has a UTV that he utilizes to take back roads to get to the lake. He voiced support for allowing UTVs.

Scott Waters, 24405 Fallbrook Avenue, Wyoming, reviewed locations where UTVs and golf carts could be utilized.

5. Golf Cart/UTV Discussion

Chief of Police Peterson provided an overview of the discussion to allow golf carts and UTVs. He reviewed the positive and negative potentials with this consideration and summarized the feedback from similar cities about golf cart and UTV ordinances.

Mayor Bain asked about the activity level of current complaints regarding golf carts and UTVs.

Chief of Police Peterson responded that the complaints were very few.

Mayor Bain asked if the League of Minnesota Cities model ordinance included a suggested age limit.

Councilmember Erickson responded that Prior Lake had an age limit of 18 or older.

Chief of Police Peterson stated that the League of Minnesota Cities model also had a time frame from 8 AM to 10 PM.

Councilmember Erickson responded that sunrise to sunset was a common rule.

Mayor Bain commented that riding a UTV at 5:30 AM may be aggressive.

Chief of Police Peterson read the rules from the League of Minnesota Cities model for operating a UTV or ATV by someone under the age of 18.

Interim City Administrator Handt stated that conversations on a listserv recently suggested limiting the age for driving a golf cart to those who have a driver's license.

Councilmember Erickson commented that it is overall favorable to allow for this change.

Councilmember Roberts stated that he had received positive feedback. He commented that the only drawback for UTVs was noise and speed. He asked if golf carts and UTVs would have separate ordinances.

Chief of Police Peterson responded that he had seen separate ordinances previously. He reviewed concerns he had discussed with other cities, such as the noise.

Councilmember Valento stated that it was possible to create a reasonable ordinance.

Councilmember Roberts voiced support for the ordinances.

Mayor Bain commented on the benefits of allowing the ordinances with certain limits, such as daytime hours, and limiting use to those over 18 years old. She stated that City licensing of the vehicle and proof of insurance would be necessary.

Interim City Administrator Handt asked if the City Council would allow three-year permits.

Mayor Bain responded that she would be okay with this if the ordinance allows for revocation, if appropriate. She commented that zones or districts such as Clear Lake would be challenging based on the setup of Forest Lake.

Councilmember Husnik asked if the ordinances included requirements for seat belts or turn signals.

Chief of Police Peterson answered that some of the ordinances required seat belts or turn signals.

Councilmember Erickson responded that some UTVs have seat belts installed.

Councilmember Husnik wondered what other cities were requiring.

Mayor Bain voiced concerns about seat belts if there was a broader all-terrain vehicle (ATV) ordinance as it might give an impression of safety that is not present. She asked if there was a helmet law for motorcycles in Minnesota.

Councilmember Erickson responded that helmets were required on motorcycles for those under the age of 18.

Jeremy James stated that the golf cart speed is slower. DNR law requires lights to be on for a UTV. He expressed concerns with the sunset law since it gets dark so early in the winter. He commented that snowmobiles do not have a limit.

Chief of Police Peterson commented that all ordinances had timing requirements.

Interim City Administrator Handt stated that snowmobiles are not driving close to highways, but instead have separate paths.

Councilmember Roberts suggested requiring lights and turn signals if the UTVs or golf carts were being driven after sunset.

Mayor Bain asked if there should be time limits in the morning and evening.

Jeremy James suggested creating ordinances with times based on the season.

Councilmember Erickson suggested time constraints based on the type of vehicle.

Councilmember Roberts asked how the trail would be considered.

Interim City Administrator Handt responded that these ordinances would be for City roads and not City trails.

Councilmember Erickson asked if there should be an ordinance for golf carts, UTVs, and snowmobiles.

Community Development Director Wittman presented an image of the site location of the Hidden Creek 2nd Addition and provided an overview of the previous actions completed by the City Council about this project. She stated that the final plat conforms to the City standards for development. She reviewed the different elements of the plat to consider, such as the drainage and utility easement vacation and the roadway vacation. She summarized the requests from the City, including model homes and parkland dedication fees. She explained the request for Deferment of the Headwaters Parkway Development and stated that it was in the best interest for Headwaters Parkway to be built now before the release of any other building permits to ensure that the appropriate public infrastructure was in place. She summarized what actions were to be considered by the City Council.

John Dobbs, Headwaters Land Group, voiced appreciation for the collaboration on this work. He stated that there were concerns with the requirements for the development of Headwaters Parkway Development. He explained that the second phase needed to be completed so residents would have a way to get out while they were working on Headwaters Parkway. He stated that this season had been overly wet, which has impacted the timeline for their work. He predicted that the asphalt work for the second phase would be completed in September. Headwaters Parkway would most likely be worked on in October. He provided context to the drain tile system that has pumped water into the subsoil for 100 years creating a hole in the ground. He requested to delay the construction of the Headwaters Parkway before the third phase between June 15 and June 30.

Councilmember Husnik stated the request seemed reasonable and the companies had a proven track record. He asked City Engineer Goodman for the reason behind the requirement of Headwater Parkway.

Mayor Bain voiced concern about allowing a long timeframe of delay to the spring since there is no certainty about what the weather will look like in the spring.

Paul Bruggeman asked about the concession received on Headwaters Parkway. He stated that this year had been difficult with the weather.

Mayor Bain commented that a design concession had been received on Headwaters Parkway

Councilmember Roberts requested discussion about the three model homes.

Community Development Director Wittman commented that without the infrastructure in place, they cannot allow for three model homes. They could access two model homes from the current roadways. She commented that the City customarily allows for one model home.

Councilmember Roberts voiced concerns about the parkland dedication fee since it is not a part of the current City policy.

Community Development Director Wittman stated that there would be continued conversation about the parkland dedication since this is only a portion of the proposed neighborhood. There is currently no parkland proposed, but the staff believes it would be in the City's best interest to go into maintaining current parks since residents of these neighborhoods would utilize these parks.

Councilmember Roberts commented that the City Council wants to help as much as possible and work with developers. He encouraged the developers to continue to work in good faith with the staff.

Paul Bruggeman voiced concerns about the developer's agreement.

Mayor Bain stated the public hearing was closed.

Councilmember Erickson answered that there could be regional hubs that have all the departments but a smaller population. He found value in a candidate having experience with working with a variety of departments.

Mayor Bain commented that they would prefer a candidate who stayed in a position for a lengthy time.

Community Development Director Wittman asked if the code of ethics requested five years.

Mayor Bain commented that she thought it was at least a two-year commitment.

Mr. Amlie clarified that the City Council would prefer five years in the role as a City Administrator or five years in a lateral role.

Mayor Bain stated that a candidate in the last round did not seem prepared for such a large move.

Councilmember Erickson commented that they would prefer a candidate who had served as a City Administrator for a longer time frame.

Mayor Bain listed attributes the Council appreciated, including successful redevelopment experience and economic development knowledge.

Councilmember Erickson stated that they appreciated a candidate who had negotiation and relationship skills.

Mayor Bain commented that a previous candidate had a strong downtown redevelopment story and headline projects.

Councilmember Roberts appreciated a candidate who had overseen a large project, such as the proposed Public Works facility.

Community Development Director Wittman summarized that the candidate should have strong project management skills and understand different technology systems.

Councilmember Erickson commented that the person should craft a vision for how staffing should work.

Finance Director Knopik commented that an individual should be able to listen first, talk second, and listen to and lean on department heads. He also suggested someone who can appreciate and understand where the City was five years ago to where they are now.

Fire Chief Newman suggested that the City Administrator should be able to work well with the City Staff and City Council. He suggested an empathetic leader who empowers department heads, prioritizes staff growth and development, someone with employer/employee relationship skills.

Mr. Amlie requested metrics around the skill levels.

Councilmember Erickson said that there is an expectation for a level of service for the community.

Mr. Amlie requested experience minimums and maximums to use as guard rails.

Community Development Director Wittman answered that the request is to look at the history of how well an individual could complete a job. The candidate should be able to grow an organization.

Mayor Bain stated that an individual should have at least five years of experience and desires to work as a City Administrator for five to ten years. The individual should be active.

Community Development Director Wittman asked about the previous minimum qualifications.

City Attorney Johnson read the minimum qualifications from the previous search.

Councilmember Roberts commented that running an organization includes managing people so the candidate should have experience in managing a larger amount of people.

Councilmember Erickson asked about the ten-year plan for staffing.

Finance Director Knopik answered between part-time, seasonal, and full-time staffing for 2025, there would be almost ninety staff members. He stated that his hometown has similar amenities to Forest Lake but is half of the size. It should be a big picture of what the City Administrator manages in the community rather than the size of the community.

Mr. Amlie clarified that there could be a required minimum population number of 10,000.

Mayor Bain expressed concerns about setting a requirement of 10,000.

Councilmember Roberts asked if Mr. Amlie could show them a candidate privately to filter candidates.

Mr. Amlie answered that he would take the list and highlight what were the most important qualifications and present candidates that meet the qualifications while noting their positive and negative characteristics. He asked if there were other necessary qualifications, like managing fire and police, that a candidate must have.

Mayor Bain stated that the Community Development Director position was hired for a reason and not all communities have a similar role.

Community Development Director Wittman commented that other communities contract planning and zoning departments. It would be helpful to find communities, even if smaller, that have experience with these departments and do not contract them out. She stated an individual with experience managing services and a population size of 5,000 to 10,000.

Councilmember Valento provided examples of other towns that are smaller but have development and services.

Fire Chief Newman stated it would be beneficial for an individual to have experience with code enforcement.

Community Development Director Wittman said that there is a Development Director. She commented that the City Administrator would have executive skills and be able to lean on department heads.

City Attorney Johnson asked if they would only want to look at candidates with experience in Minnesota or other locations.

Fire Chief Newman asked if there could be a good candidate pool from just Minnesota administrators.

Mr. Amlie answered that they look at a narrow focus and expand it depending on the candidate options.

Mayor Bain commented that a strong reputation is a vital quality. When candidates are outside of the network, it can be difficult to learn the candidates' reputations.

Councilmember Erickson stated that it would be a preference to have a candidate start right away. It could be an easier transition for a Minnesotan candidate who knows local regulations.

Mr. Amlie asked about the metrics that the City Council would expect the candidate to achieve.

Councilmember Erickson answered that community feedback would show the City Administrator's success.

Background:

Dan Lawerence, Senior Project Manager for Washington County, has submitted an application to the City of Forest Lake for City approval of revised site plans for the Washington County Northern Environmental Center. He is making this request as Washington County is now proposing to construct Headwaters Parkway, east of Highway 61 to provide public street access to their facility. The City is requiring the County to submit this application as the City did not approve final street construction and related plans for Headwaters Parkway in 2023 with the initial land use requests for this facility.

Please see attached the applicant's project statement, maps and plans for more information about this request.

Additional Background Information:

Applicant: Washington County

Location: 6065 Headwaters Parkway (east side of Highway 61 at Headwaters Parkway)

Zoning District: I - Industrial

Land Use Plan Designation: Public/Institutional

Past Actions:

On August 9, 2023, the Planning Commission reviewed the proposed preliminary and final plats, the conditional use permit and the site and project plans for the Northern Environmental Center as proposed by Washington County. The Planning Commission approved the project site and project plans for the building, driveways and parking lots (but not the plans for Headwaters Parkway) and they recommended City Council approval of the proposed plats, subject to conditions and they approved the conditional use permit and the project plans for the facility.

On August 28, 2023, the City Council approved the preliminary and final plats for the Washington County Northern Environmental Center. This final plat created the new property lines and street right-of-way for the extension of Headwaters Parkway the County is proposing to construct.

On May 8, 2024, the Planning Commission reviewed this application. The Planning Commission recommended approval of the revised site and project plans for Washington County Northern Environmental Center subject to the 15 conditions listed in the staff report. This recommendation included requiring revisions to the landscape plan to ensure there will be adequate screening to the south and the applicant adding more trees and plantings to the site as part of this project.

General Project Description (from the applicant):

The Washington County Northern Environmental Center (WCNEC) will offer the same services as the current County facility in Woodbury (Southern Environmental Center), with opportunities to expand and grow to meet the ever-changing needs of the population. The facility will accept household hazardous waste, electronics waste for recycling and full-service recycling consisting of single stream materials (i.e., paper, cans and bottles, and cardboard, plastics). The full-service model will also collect specialty recycling such as scrap metal, plastic bags, campaign signs, medical sharps, and microwave ovens. This full-service facility will also have the ability to offer small business hazardous waste collections with a full-service Very Small Quantity Generator (VSQG) collection program. The full-service model will include a Free-Product Room and are servable meeting room that would serve as a base to hold tours for community groups and provide educational programming.

This greenfield site development and building construction project will provide critical recycling services for residents in the north metro. The new facility will provide residents with a safe way to dispose of HHW (household hazardous waste) and Electronics along with providing bulk recycling services for materials such as scrap metals, cardboard, and plastics.

Full-Service drive lane collection of allowable hazardous materials and electronics will be provided. It also will allow non-hazardous materials (i.e., cardboard and scrap metals) can be dropped off via drive up, self-service bulk recycling bin collection. The site also will provide self-serve Yard Waste collection and Organic Waste collection services.

The building will have a Free Product Room to help avoid costly incineration and other disposal costs by offering usable products, such as paints, household cleaners, and automotive supplies, to residents for free.

The new facility will support the County's Public Health Emergency Preparedness program. Supplies and equipment for public health emergencies will be stored at the WCNEC as well as the option for a mobile deployment trailer. The WCNEC would be used for staging, receiving, or shipping supplies and equipment and could be a staff rally point in the event of a public health emergency.

Additionally, the WCNEC facility will have a regular schedule of secure paper shredding events where residents can bring personal documents for destruction and recycling. The WCNEC facility supports the county's Community Environmental Resource Team. This team will utilize the meeting room in the WCNEC for training or education programs on recycling and waste management.

Issue Before the City Council:

Should the City Council approve the revised site and design plans, including the plans for the construction of Headwaters Parkway east of Highway 61, for the Northern Environmental Center as proposed by Washington County?

Proposal/Analysis:

Regulatory Framework and Discussion

Public Street Improvements

The County and City have agreed that the proposed entrance driveway along Highway 61 will be a public street as it will serve the site of the Northern Environmental Center and the City-owned property to the north. This street is shown as Headwaters Parkway on the proposed project plans. Washington County will be constructing the extension of Headwaters Parkway from the existing intersection at Highway 61 to the north property line of their site.

The proposed site access onto Highway 61 at Headwaters Parkway requires review and approval from the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) as Highway 61 is a State Highway. The County and their consultants have been working with MnDOT to finalize all the project plans and design details the State will require for this project. The City approval of the revised site and project plans should be contingent upon the State of Minnesota approving the project plans.

Trails and Sidewalks

The applicant is not proposing any public sidewalk construction with Headwaters Parkway and the Northern Environmental Center. The County is proposing to construct a ten-foot-wide bituminous trail along the west side of Headwaters Parkway from the intersection at Highway 61 to the north property line of the project site. The final design of Headwaters Parkway and the trail will be subject to the approval of the City Engineer.

Wetlands

The County had a wetland delineation completed for the property in 2021. This delineation found three wetlands on the property with a total acreage of about 7.3 acres. The project's design team showed all the wetlands on the proposed preliminary plat and project plans along with the proposed buffer areas and setbacks for each wetland. The applicant will need to provide the Watershed District and the City verification that the proposed plans for Headwaters Parkway will meet the buffer requirement.

Design Review

Landscaping – City Code Sections 153.135 and 153.136 outline the minimum landscaping requirements for multi-family, commercial and industrial projects in Forest Lake. An assessment of required vs. proposed plantings is below:

The City's usual landscaping requirements are based on a measurement of the perimeter of the parcel. The Linear feet of the site's perimeter is measured and then divided by 30 and 10 to arrive at the required number of overstory trees and understory trees/shrubs respectively. The City typically uses these standards for new construction or for major site improvements to an existing property.

The applicant's original landscape showed a variety of shade trees, evergreen trees, ornamental trees, shrubs and ornamental grasses around the proposed buildings, parking lots and drive aisles. The overall project plans also show the other parts of the site the grading and construction will disturb will be reseeded or have sod installed. As noted in the table above, the landscaping plans approved by the City in 2023 show the County proposing to plant 460 fewer trees and shrubs on the site than the City would typically require. With the large size of the parcel and the wetlands on the property, the 28.8-acre site does not lend itself to having the applicant install the typical or required number of trees and shrubs. Much of the perimeter of the site will remain undisturbed by this facility. The original landscape plans from 2023 appeared to City staff to complement and enhance the property.

As part of this application, the County submitted an updated landscape plan. This plan shows the planting of 13 trees along the south side of Headwaters Parkway just east of Highway 61. The proposed trees include 7 Norway Spruce and 6 Serviceberry trees. The intent of the proposed tree planting in this area is to provide adequate screening that is at least 90 percent opaque all year to screen the houses to the south from the new street and parking areas.

City staff and the Planning Commission reviewed the proposed updated tree planting plan and found that it probably does not meet the 90 percent opaque screening requirement. Staff recommends the City require the applicant revise the landscaping plans by removing the 3 proposed eastern-most Serviceberry trees and replacing them with 4-5 Austrian Pines or Norway Spruce trees and adding several additional trees to the south of the proposed trees. These revisions are to ensure there will be adequate screening that is at least 90 percent opaque all year to screen the houses to the south from the new street and parking areas.

The Planning Commission also recommended that the City require the applicant add more trees, shrubs and native plantings to the site as the original landscape plan would have 460 fewer trees and plantings than the City would usually require. In staff's review of the proposed landscape plan, there appears to be room for additional trees and other plantings along the east side of Headwaters Parkway in the lawn area between the new street and the wetlands and the storm water ponds. These additional planting areas should extend as far north as possible to the facility entrance driveway. It also appears there are areas on the north, south and west sides of the on-site driveways to add trees and shrubs. The goal of requiring Washington County to add more trees and shrubs to the site is to bring the total number of plantings closer to the 605 total number of trees and plantings the City Code would require for this property.

In response to the Planning Commission and staff comments about the proposed landscaping for the project, the applicant submitted a response letter to the City (dated July 22, 2024) as part of their request for City Council approval of the revised site and design plans for the Northern Environmental Center. In this letter Washington County is asking the City to approve the following requests regarding the landscaping for the Northern Environmental Center:

- 1. Allow the County to install the additional agreed-upon landscaping over the next two years as their budget allows.
- 2. Have County staff, City staff and a landscape architect hired by Washington County determine an agreed upon site plan and a final landscape plan including planting types, quantities and locations.

3. Waive or exempt the County from having to install irrigation for the landscaping.

City staff are supportive of each of these requests as noted in their letter and application materials. This is because the City and Washington County have a solid and positive working relationship and we are confident the final landscaping for the Northern Environmental Center will be asset to the site and that Washington County will care for and maintain all the landscaping on the site.

Lighting Plan – Lighting standards for commercial and industrial properties are established in City Code Section 153.130. The applicant submitted a street lighting plan with their requests. This plan shows the County installing five Domus style 19.5 foot-tall streetlights by Connexus Energy along the west side of the Headwaters Parkway. The City Engineer has approved this street lighting plan.

Signage – The applicant is proposing to install one entry monument sign to be located near the intersection of Headwaters Parkway and the driveway into the facility. The City recently issued the permits for this sign.

The County will be responsible for installing all required street and directional signage with the construction of Headwaters Parkway.

Site Plan Considerations for Approval

City Code Sections 153.038(E)(6) and (F)(2) provide the following criteria for the Planning Commission and City Council to consider when evaluating whether to approve major changes to an approved a site plan. Staff assessment is provided in *italics*.

- a) Consistency with the City Comprehensive Plan;
 - The proposed use and site plan changes are consistent with the City's adopted 2040 Comprehensive Plan.
- b) Compliance with the Zoning Ordinance;
 - The proposed changes to the approved plans for the Northern Environmental Center including the street improvements for Headwaters Parkway will be consistent with the City's adopted zoning ordinance.
- The preservation of the site in its natural state to the extent practicable by minimizing tree loss, soil removal, and grading;
 - Site development will not substantially detract from existing development in the area. The proposed improvements will alter the natural state of a portion of the property. The proposed facility and street improvements will be preserving the existing wetlands and most of the significant trees on the property. The applicants will be required to install a storm water management system that meets current City and Watershed District standards.
- d) The harmonious relationships between buildings, open spaces, natural site features, architectural details, and vehicular and pedestrian circulations; and
 - The proposed changes to the approved site plan for the Washington County Northern Environmental Center will be consistent with the City requirements for traffic circulation, yard areas, screening, lighting, and the like with the changes as recommended by City staff.

e) The protection of adjacent and neighboring properties.

City staff do not expect neighboring properties to be adversely impacted by the proposed changes to the approved site plan for the Northern Environmental Center. The nearby property owners should be adequately protected by the proposed hours of operation, the design of Headwaters Parkway and the requirements for screening and landscaping.

Staff Analysis

City Engineer's Comments:

The City Engineer provided the City with a review memo dated August 1, 2024 about the plans he received on July 31, 2024. This was the City Engineer's fourth review of the proposed project plans. In summary, the latest project plans meet all City requirements and do not need any revisions except to finalize the project landscaping as I discussed earlier in this report. City staff has shared these comments with the applicant and the project engineer. The City will require the applicant to revise the project plans as may be required by MnDOT, construct the project and install all site improvements subject to the review and approval of the City Engineer. MnDOT recently approved the plans for intersection improvements at Highway 61 and Headwaters Parkway including the signal system and turn lanes.

Fire Chief Comments:

Fire Chief Newman did not have comments about this proposal.

Rice Creek Watershed Review:

This property is in the Rice Creek Watershed District. The applicant submitted an application and plans to the Watershed District earlier this year for their approval. The Watershed District will need to approve the final project plans and issue a permit before the contractor starts the construction of Headwaters Parkway.

Findings

Staff has reviewed the application for the revised site plan approval for the Northern Environmental Center. The proposed revised site plan meets the City design requirements which details the following: location of the bituminous parking area, curbing and stormwater management, screening, striping and lighting. Additionally, with proper conditions, the proposed project conforms to standards set forth for the granting approval of the revised Site Plan.

Fiscal Impact:

There are no known fiscal impacts to the City currently with the approval of the proposed site and project plans for the Washington County Northern Environmental Center. There will be costs to the City in the future for street and utility maintenance and for public safety as the project proceeds through construction, project acceptance and occupancy of the new Environmental Center.

Options:

The City Council may approve, table, or deny the requested revised site and project plans for the Washington County Northern Environmental Center located at 6065 Headwaters Parkway.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that, if the City Council elects to remove revised site plan approval off the Consent Agenda, then the City Council make <u>motion to approve Resolution 08-12-24-01</u>. This resolution is for the approval of the revised site and project plans for Washington County Northern Environmental Center (plan sheets dated July 5, 2024, July 26, 2024, July 29, 2024 and July 30, 2024) and the final construction plans for Headwaters Parkway as approved by MnDOT (dated July 30, 2024) for the property located at 6065 Headwaters Parkway, and shall be subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The final plans shall conform to those reviewed and conditionally approved as part of this City Case Number PZ 23-1211.
- 2. Prior to the release of the Certificate of Occupancy by the City for the facility, Washington County shall obtain final approval for the proposed extension of Headwaters Parkway from MnDOT, a City Development Agreement amendment shall be made and the County shall have installed all public improvements included with the extension of Headwaters Parkway.
- 3. Any outstanding requirements related to site development and improvements, as identified by the City or Watershed District, must be satisfied before the use being established on site.
- 4. The requirements of the City Engineer (as noted in his project review memo dated August 1, 2024), Public Works Director, and Fire Chief must be met before or during the construction of the extension of Headwaters Parkway.
- 5. The final design of Headwaters Parkway and the trail will be subject to the approval of the City Engineer.
- 6. All building, site, grading, street, sidewalk, landscaping, driveway and parking lot improvements shall be constructed in accordance with the plans approved by the City with the 2023 Site Plan Review and the plans approved as part of this revised Site Plan Review.
- 7. Washington County shall be responsible for all costs related to the design, construction, installation and inspection of all elements for the extension of Headwaters Parkway, including but not limited to, street and turn-lane construction, grading and drainage improvements, landscaping, lighting, signage and modifications to the traffic signal system, as approved by the City and by the Minnesota Department of Transportation.
- 8. The applicant or owner shall receive all permits and approvals from the City, the Minnesota Department of Transportation, and the Rice Creek Watershed before starting any grading or construction activity for the extension of Headwaters Parkway.
- 9. The City Attorney shall prepare an amendment for the development agreement for the project that shall be fully executed by the City and the Applicant including all required financials and charges. This agreement shall be completed and recorded at Washington County before the applicant or contractor starts any grading or construction activity for the extension of Headwaters Parkway.
- 10. All required City financial guarantees shall be submitted and approved by the City before the contractor starts any grading or construction activity for the extension of Headwaters Parkway.
- 11. Any information needed to confirm the use meets proper licensure, health, safety or building code requirements must be furnished to the City upon request.
- 12. All construction activity and material storage shall be contained on site. There shall be no construction staging, parking or material storage on Forest Boulevard (Highway 61).

- 13. The applicant shall revise the project plans for City staff approval before the City issues any permits for this project and before starting construction. The revised plans shall show the following:
 - a. The height of any the freestanding lighting or street poles shall not exceed 25 feet.
 - b. All light fixtures shall be downlit and/or shielded to prevent glare.
 - c. Irrigation only in the landscape areas that will need irrigation to help ensure the plantings will survive and thrive. The City waives the requirement to have irrigation for all the landscaping on this site.
 - d. Changes to the proposed landscape plan to maximize the number of trees and shrubs to be planted on the entire site of the Northern Environmental Center. This includes adding more overstory trees on the south side of Headwaters Parkway (for screening) and adding a mix of overstory trees, understory trees and shrubs on the east side of Headwaters Parkway in the lawn area between the new street and the wetlands and the storm water ponds. These additional plantings should extend as far north as possible (to the facility entrance driveway). The revised landscape plans also shall show additional plantings of trees and shrubs in areas on the north, south and west sides of the on-site driveways.
 - e. Revised landscaping/screening plan for the south end of the site (south of Headwaters Parkway) that removes the 3 proposed eastern-most Serviceberry trees and replaces them with 4-5 Austrian Pines or Norway Spruce trees and adds several additional coniferous trees south of the proposed trees. This change is to help ensure there will be adequate screening that is at least 90 percent opaque all year to screen the houses to the south from the street (Headwaters Parkway) and the Northern Environmental Center.
 - f. All trees must be planted on Washington County property at least 10 feet away from the right-of-way for Headwaters Parkway and at least 10 feet away from the curb of the public street.
 - g. County staff, City staff and a landscape architect hired by Washington County shall determine an agreed upon site plan and a final landscape plan including planting types, quantities and locations by May 1, 2025.
 - h. That the proposed plans will meet the minimum wetland buffer requirements.
 - i. All changes to the proposed landscape plan as required by the City.
- 14. Washington County shall install all trees and agreed-upon landscaping by September 1, 2026.
- 15. The applicant or contractor shall hold a preconstruction meeting before starting any construction or grading activity for the extension of Headwaters Parkway. The applicant or owner shall invite representatives from the City, MnDOT, the Watershed District and the private utility companies as noted on the project plans to this meeting.
- 16. Washington County shall be responsible for the maintenance and care of all landscaping and for maintaining the number, type and condition of the plantings shown on the City-approved landscape plans for the Northern Environmental Center.
- 17. Any future significant alterations to the site as determined *Major* or *Minor* under City Code Section 153.038 by the City will require the Applicant or Owner to obtain City approval of an amendment of this Site Plan approval.
- 18. Failure to adhere to any of the conditions listed herein shall be deemed a public nuisance.

General Project Description

This project includes the addition of a fourth roadway leg at the existing intersection of Headwaters Pkwy and TH 61. The new leg will be on the east side of the intersection and will serve as an access road for the future Washington County Northern Environmental Center. South of the intersection, a 630 foot right turn lane will be added to NB TH 61 south of the proposed access road. North of the intersection, the existing lane configurations will be reconfigured with shoulder widening and new pavement markings.

This project will service Washington County's new Northern Environmental Center (NEC), which is being constructed on the east side of TH-61, just north of Headwaters Pkwy. The NEC will service the local community's environmental needs including household hazardous waste and yard waste. The intersection and roadway improvements will accommodate peak hour traffic demands to access the NEC facility and provide a multi-use path for the community.

The project's geometric design takes into account the turning movements of trucks driving to and from the future Washington County Northern Environmental Center. Traffic counts were collected on March 15, 2023 to determine future traffic requirements including number of lanes and signal layout. The proposed entrance/exit for the access road is classified as a commercial entrance, according to the city of Forest Lake's 2022 Public Works and Engineering Standards. The design speed for the access road is 25 mph and the design vehicle is a WB-62.

Purpose: The intent of this document is to clarify this project's site landscaping plan and approach to irrigation as compared to the Conditional Use Permit and Site Plan Approval letters dated August 9, 2023 and May 28, 2024. Furthermore, this document provides an update for the project's Bid Package No.3 Roadway work scopes.

1. Landscaping – Quantity of Plantings

- a. The site plan designs from Bid Package No.2 and Bid Package No.3 did not meet the planting requirements (quantities) set forth by City Code. This deficiency was a result of Washington County project budget constraints and a value engineering process.
 - i. The primary plan set (Bid Package No.2) from the project's Landscape Architect, Burns & McDonnell, proposed only 64 overstory trees and 81 understory/shrubs.
 - ii. The secondary plan set, Bid Package No.3, added only 13 additional trees as part of the roadway project scope to screen the site from adjacent houses to the south.
 - iii. Both staff reports noted that this 28.8 acre site does not lend itself to meeting the typical or required number of trees and shrubs (151 overstory trees / 454 understory trees/shrubs).
 - iv. Nevertheless, both staff reports recommended adding more plantings to get closer to these numbers, particularly at the south side of the site for 90% opaque screening requirements.
- b. The proposed solution between the County Team and City of Forest Lake staff is based on the City Planner's *Concept Landscape Planting Plan* (see attached) dated May 16, 2024.
 - Over the next two years (maximum time frame), Washington County will conduct a phased approach to include the additional required planting scope. Depending on Washington County funding and timing, this work scope could be completed sooner.
 - ii. After the completion of the primary building and roadway project in October of 2024, Washington County will engage the design services of an independent Landscape Architect to work with the County Team in conjunction with the City Team to determine an agreed upon site plan for implementation relative to planting types, quantities, and locations.

2. Irrigation – Request for Exemption

- a. Based on the sustainable design goals for the project set forth by Washington County's Public Health and Environment (PHE) Department, the project is requesting an exemption from site irrigation.
- b. With water conservation in mind, the landscape plantings for the project have been selected to incorporate a mix of low maintenance, drought-tolerant native and adaptive species representative of the local environment.
- c. See attached for the *Landscape Irrigation Exemption* request letter from the project's Landscape Architect, Burns & McDonnell. This letter defines the request and reasoning in much greater detail.



3. Update: Bid Package No.3 - Roadway and Intersection

a. The design and construction of the new roadway and intersection connection to Highway 61 is moving forward into the Bidding and Construction phases as identified in the following schedule:

b. Proposed Schedule:

- July 5: Bid Package No.3, Advertise for Bidding.
- *July 26: Bid Package No.3, Issue Addendum No.1 to Bidding Contractors.
- July 29-August 2: Final Plan Signature Process. First, signed by Washington County, then routed to the City of Forest Lake for signature, and lastly, routed to MnDot for signature.
- August 6: Bid Package No.3, Bids Due / Bid Opening
- August 27: Bid Package No.3, Bid Award
- August 28-30 (Schedule TBD), City of Forest Lake Preconstruction Meeting
- September 3: Bid Package No.3, Anticipated Construction Start
- October 15: Bid Package No.3, Anticipated Construction Completion
- October 16: Building Occupancy Target Date

[*Addendum No.1 for Bid Package No.3 will contain planset revisions including a new temporary signal system plan, which will be required to maintain the signal control at the TH 61/Headwaters Pkwy intersection once the existing signal bases are removed. This interim plan is required because County staff do not anticipate the permanent signal steel to be delivered in time for building occupancy. To mitigate this timing concern, the signal system will be temporarily switched over to utilize County-procured signal steel which will operate on the newly constructed signal bases. The County steel will be removed once the permanent steel is delivered. The remainder of the Addendum #1 items are either responding to contractor questions or miscellaneous final details that were not included in the bid planset.]

c. Washington County fully understands the City of Forest Lake requirement for the Bid Package No.3 roadway and intersection work scopes to be completed before Building Occupancy of the North Environmental Center is allowed.





Dear Mr. Lysne:

The plantings for the project incorporate a mix of low maintenance, drought-tolerant native and adaptive species of the local environment. The lawn seeding areas were specified to the MN DOT Low Maintenance Turf that provides a salt, shade and drought-tolerant turfgrass mix. The native seeding areas, provided in the stormwater detention ponds and buffer for the existing wetlands, were specified to the MN BWSR state seed mixes for adaptability to specific site conditions of the project site.

The plantings were selected with water conservation in mind, per PHE direction, to not require a permanent irrigation system. Our recommendation is to focus on the establishment period, typically the first two years after planting, to provide adequate maintenance and watering for the plants to have their best chance of long-term survival.





Property Line Map




















LOOP DETECTOR CHART

A RESOLUTION APPROVING REVISED SITE AND PROJECT PLANS FOR THE WASHINGTON COUNTY NORTHERN ENVIRONMENTAL CENTER LOCATED AT 6065 HEADWATERS PARKWAY

WHEREAS, Dan Lawerence, ("Applicant"), representing Washington County, owners and operators of the Washington County Northern Environmental Center located at 6065 Headwaters Parkway, located in the City of Forest Lake, Washington, County, Minnesota with PID's 29.032.21.11.0005 ("Property"); and

WHEREAS, the legal description of the Property for the proposed revised site and project plans is detailed on Exhibit A attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, on August 9, 2023, the Forest Lake Planning Commission reviewed the proposed preliminary and final plats, the conditional use permit and the site and project plans for the Northern Environmental Center as proposed by Washington County. The Planning Commission approved the project site and project plans for the building, driveways and parking lots (but not the plans for Headwaters Parkway) and they recommended City Council approval of the proposed plats, subject to conditions and they approved the conditional use permit and the project plans for the facility; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant submitted an application and site and project plans to the City of Forest Lake for revised site plan review for the Northern Environmental Center on the Property; and

WHEREAS, the requested improvements for the revised site plan approval include the construction of a new public street known as Headwaters Parkway and associated lighting, trail, traffic signal and landscaping improvements and storm water facilities as shown in the plans dated July 7, 2024, as may be revised; and

WHEREAS, on May 8, 2024, the Forest Lake Planning Commission reviewed the application for revised site plan approval for the Property and they voted to recommend to the City Council approval of the requested revised site plan approval for the Northern Environmental Center with conditions identified by staff; and

WHEREAS, the revised site and project plans for the Northern Environmental Center are consistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan, are compatible with the present and planned uses in the surrounding area, and any exceptions to existing city code or regulation are justified by the design or development of the proposed use.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOREST LAKE, MINNESOTA, AS FOLLOWS:

The Owner's Application for revised site plan approval for the Washington County Northern Environmental Center as described herein is hereby approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The final plans shall conform to those reviewed and conditionally approved as part of this City Case Number PZ 23-1211.
- 2. Prior to the release of the Certificate of Occupancy by the City for the facility, Washington County shall obtain final approval for the proposed extension of Headwaters Parkway from MnDOT, a City Development Agreement amendment shall be made and the County shall have installed all public improvements included with the extension of Headwaters Parkway.
- 3. Any outstanding requirements related to site development and improvements, as identified by the City or Watershed District, must be satisfied before the use being established on site.
- 4. The requirements of the City Engineer (as noted in his project review memo dated August 1, 2024), Public Works Director, and Fire Chief must be met before or during the construction of the extension of Headwaters Parkway.
- 5. The final design of Headwaters Parkway and the trail will be subject to the approval of the City Engineer.
- 6. All building, site, grading, street, sidewalk, landscaping, driveway and parking lot improvements shall be constructed in accordance with the plans approved by the City with the 2023 Site Plan Review and the plans approved as part of this revised Site Plan Review.
- 7. Washington County shall be responsible for all costs related to the design, construction, installation and inspection of all elements for the extension of Headwaters Parkway, including but not limited to, street and turn-lane construction, grading and drainage improvements, landscaping, lighting, signage and modifications to the traffic signal system, as approved by the City and by the Minnesota Department of Transportation.
- 8. The applicant or owner shall receive all permits and approvals from the City, the Minnesota Department of Transportation, and the Rice Creek Watershed before starting any grading or construction activity for the extension of Headwaters Parkway.
- 9. The City Attorney shall prepare an amendment for the development agreement for the project that shall be fully executed by the City and the Applicant including all required financials and charges. This agreement shall be completed and recorded at Washington County before the applicant or contractor starts any grading or construction activity for the extension of Headwaters Parkway.
- 10. All required City financial guarantees shall be submitted and approved by the City before the contractor starts any grading or construction activity for the extension of Headwaters Parkway.
- 11. Any information needed to confirm the use meets proper licensure, health, safety or building code requirements must be furnished to the City upon request.

- 12. All construction activity and material storage shall be contained on site. There shall be no construction staging, parking or material storage on Forest Boulevard (Highway 61).
- 13. The applicant shall revise the project plans for City staff approval before the City issues any permits for this project and before starting construction. The revised plans shall show the following:
 - a. The height of any the freestanding lighting or street poles shall not exceed 25 feet.
 - b. All light fixtures shall be downlit and/or shielded to prevent glare.
 - c. Irrigation only in the landscape areas that will need irrigation to help ensure the plantings will survive and thrive. The City waives the requirement to have irrigation for all the landscaping on this site.
 - d. Changes to the proposed landscape plan to maximize the number of trees and shrubs to be planted on the entire site of the Northern Environmental Center. This includes adding more overstory trees on the south side of Headwaters Parkway (for screening) and adding a mix of overstory trees, understory trees and shrubs on the east side of Headwaters Parkway in the lawn area between the new street and the wetlands and the storm water ponds. These additional plantings should extend as far north as possible (to the facility entrance driveway). The revised landscape plans also shall show additional plantings of trees and shrubs in areas on the north, south and west sides of the on-site driveways.
 - e. Revised landscaping/screening plan for the south end of the site (south of Headwaters Parkway) that removes the 3 proposed easternmost Serviceberry trees and replaces them with 4-5 Austrian Pines or Norway Spruce trees and adds several additional coniferous trees south of the proposed trees. This change is to help ensure there will be adequate screening that is at least 90 percent opaque all year to screen the houses to the south from the street (Headwaters Parkway) and the Northern Environmental Center.
 - f. All trees must be planted on Washington County property at least 10 feet away from the right-of-way for Headwaters Parkway and at least 10 feet away from the curb of the public street.
 - g. County staff, City staff and a landscape architect hired by Washington County shall determine an agreed upon site plan and a final landscape plan including planting types, quantities and locations by May 1, 2025.
 - h. That the proposed plans will meet the minimum wetland buffer requirements.
 - i. All changes to the proposed landscape plan as required by the City.
 - 14. Washington County shall install all trees and agreed-upon landscaping by September 1, 2026.
 - 15. The applicant or contractor shall hold a preconstruction meeting before starting any construction or grading activity for the extension of Headwaters Parkway. The applicant or owner shall invite representatives from the City,

- MnDOT, the Watershed District and the private utility companies as noted on the project plans to this meeting.
- 16. Washington County shall be responsible for the maintenance and care of all landscaping and for maintaining the number, type and condition of the plantings shown on the City-approved landscape plans for the Northern Environmental Center.
- 17. Any future significant alterations to the site as determined *Major* or *Minor* under City Code Section 153.038 by the City will require the Applicant or Owner to obtain City approval of an amendment of this Site Plan approval.
- 18. Failure to adhere to any of the conditions listed herein shall be deemed a public nuisance.

Louise Avenue, Sioux Falls, South Dakota 57107 ("Lessee"); and

WHEREAS, Lessee and Lessor entered into a Lease Agreement dated May 23, 2022, with respect to the property described in said Lease Agreement (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Lessee and Lessor entered into a First Amendment to City of Forest Lake OTN Site Lease dated May 5, 2023; and

To: Honorable Mayor Bain and City Councilors

From: Ken Roberts, City Planner

BACKGROUND:

The applicant, Terron Wright, representing Chase Bank, is proposing to construct a retail bank building with a drive-up facility on the site of the former Kentucky Fried Chicken Restaurant located 1232 Broadway Avenue West.

On May 8, 2024, the Planning Commission approved the site, building and sign plans for this proposal, subject to 25 conditions of approval including City staff approving the final project plans.

The applicant is now asking the City to approve the site improvement agreement for the project.

ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL:

Should the City Council approve the proposed site improvement agreement for Chase Bank?

PROPOSAL/ANALYSIS:

The Planning Commission approved this project on May 8, 2024. As noted above, this approval is subject to City staff approving the final project plans and the developer entering into a development or site improvement agreement with the City. The Developer's Engineer recently completed making all the required changes to the project plans.

City staff prepared the attached site improvement agreement for this project. This agreement outlines the roles and responsibilities of the City and those of the Owner and Developer for this project. A primary purpose of the agreement is to ensure the City would have the legal right and the financial means to stabilize and restore the project site if the Developer did not complete all the required and approved site and utility work.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Staff are not aware of any fiscal impacts to the City with the proposed redevelopment of the site. Having a new, operating business on the property should increase the value of the property, which in turn will increase the property taxes generated by the property.

OPTIONS:

The City Council may approve, approve with revisions or deny the proposed site improvement agreement.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the City Council approve, as part of the Consent Agenda, the proposed Site Improvement Agreement for the new **Chase Bank** including the site, landscaping, utility and drainage improvements to be located on the property located at 1232 Broadway Avenue West, subject to minor revisions as may be required by the City Attorney.

THIS IMPROVEMENT AGREEMENT ("Agreement"), made and entered into on the day of ______, 2024, by and between the City of Forest Lake, a Minnesota municipal corporation, ("City"), Steven R. Saunders and Patricia M. Saunders, husband and wife as joint tenants ("Owner), and JPMorgan Chase Bank NA, a national banking association, ("Developer")

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the Developer has obtained Site Plan approval from the City for the Subject Property.

WHEREAS, as a condition of granting Site Plan approval, the City requires Developer to enter into this Agreement regarding the site improvements as described in the Development Plans as approved by the City.

WHEREAS, under authority granted to it, including Minnesota Statutes Chapters 412, 429 and 462, the City has agreed to approve the Development Plans on the following conditions:

- 1. That the Developer enter into this Improvement Agreement, which defines the work which the Developer undertakes to complete; and
- 2. That the Developer provides one or more irrevocable letters of credit, or a cash deposit, in the amount and with conditions provided below, securing the Developer's obligation to cause the actual construction and installation of certain improvements.

WHEREAS, the Development Plans have been prepared by a registered professional engineer and have been reviewed by the City.

WHEREAS, the Developer has filed or will file a complete set of the Development Plans with the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement and in reliance upon the representations, warranties and covenants of the parties herein contained, the City and Owner agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 DEFINITIONS

- **1.1 TERMS.** The following terms, unless elsewhere defined specifically in the Agreement, shall have the following meanings as set forth below.
- **1.2** CITY. "City" means the City of Forest Lake, a Minnesota municipal corporation.
- **1.3 OWNER.** "Owner" means Steven R. Saunders and Patricia M. Saunders, husband and wife as joint tenants.
- **1.4 DEVELOPER.** "Developer" means JPMorgan Chase Bank NA, a national banking association
- **SUBJECT PROPERTY.** "Subject Property" or "Property" means the real property located in the City of Forest Lake, Washington County, identified and legally described on the attached **Exhibit A**.
- **1.6 <u>DEVELOPMENT PLANS.</u>** "Development Plans" means all those plans, drawings, specifications and surveys identified on the attached **Exhibit B**.
- **1.7 AGREEMENT.** "Agreement" means this instant contract by and between the City, Owner, and Developer.
- **1.8 COUNCIL.** "Council" means the City Council of the City of Forest Lake.
- **1.9** <u>CITY ENGINEER.</u> "City Engineer" means the City Engineer of the City of Forest Lake and their delegatees.
- **1.10 COUNTY.** "County" means Washington County, Minnesota.
- **1.11** OTHER REGULATORY AGENCIES. "Other Regulatory Agencies" means and includes the following:
 - a. State of Minnesota
 - b. Minnesota Department of Health
 - c. Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry

- d. Minnesota Department of Natural Resources
- e. Minnesota Department of Transportation
- f. Minnesota Pollution Control Agency
- g. Metropolitan Council
- h. Washington County
- i. Washington County Highway Department
- j. Comfort Lake Forest Lake Watershed District
- k. Rice Creek Watershed District
- 1. any other regulatory or governmental agency or entity affected by or having jurisdiction over the Improvements.
- **1.12 <u>UTILITY COMPANIES.</u>** "Utility Companies" means and includes the following:
 - a. utility companies, including electric, gas and communications.
 - b. pipeline companies.
- **1.13 PRIOR EASEMENT HOLDERS.** "Prior Easement Holders" means and includes all holders of any easements or other property interests that existed prior to the grant or dedication of any public easements transferred pursuant to this Agreement.
- **1.14 IMPROVEMENTS.** "Improvements" means and includes, individually and collectively, all the improvements identified on the attached **Exhibit B** as amended by the conditions as listed in Article 2.1.
- **1.15 DEVELOPER DEFAULT.** "Developer Default" means and includes any of the following or any combination thereof:
 - a. failure by the Developer to timely pay the City any money required to be paid under this Agreement;
 - b. failure by the Developer to timely construct the Improvements according to the Development Plans and the City standards and specifications;

- failure by the Developer to observe or perform any covenant, condition, obligation or agreement on its part to be observed or performed under this Agreement;
- d. breach of the Developer Warranties.
- **1.16 FORCE MAJEURE.** "Force Majeure" means acts of God, including, but not limited to floods, ice storms, blizzards, tornadoes, landslides, lightning and earthquakes (but not including reasonably anticipated weather conditions for the geographic area), riots, insurrections, war or civil disorder affecting the performance of work, blockades, power or other utility failures, and fires or explosions.
- **1.17. FORMAL NOTICE.** "FORMAL NOTICE" means notices given by one party to the other if in writing and if and when delivered both electronically <u>AND</u> by depositing it in the United States mail in a sealed envelope, by certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage and postal charges prepaid, addressed as follows:

Notices shall be deemed to have been duly given on the date of service electronically to the party to whom notice is to be given, or on the third day after mailing if mailed as provided above.

ARTICLE 2 APPROVAL OF DEVELOPMENT PLANS

2.1. APPROVAL OF DEVELOPMENT PLANS. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the recitals above, and all other applicable City Code provisions, the City hereby approves the Development Plans. The Development Plans also include compliance by the Developer with the conditions set forth in the following:

- a. City Planning Commission Resolution 05-08-24-01 dated May 8, 2024.
- b. City Engineer's recommendations memos dated May 24, 2024 and June 26, 2024;

(collectively, the "City Staff Recommendations").

The City Staff Recommendations are on file with the City. The Development Plans shall also include modifications by the Developer with written approval from the City Zoning Administrator and the City Engineer.

- 2.2 APPROVALS BY OTHER REGULATORY AGENCIES. The Developer shall obtain all necessary approvals, permits, easements and licenses from the City, the Other Regulatory Agencies, the Utility Companies, other property owners and the Prior Easement Holders as needed. Major design requirements of any such entities shall be determined prior to completion and incorporated into the Development Plans. All due diligence, analysis and costs incurred to obtain the approvals, permits and licenses, and also all fines or penalties levied by any agency due to the failure of the Developer to obtain or comply with conditions of such approvals, permits and licenses, shall be paid by the Developer. The Developer shall defend and hold the City harmless from any action initiated by the Other Regulatory Agencies, the Utility Companies, other property owners and the Prior Easement Holders resulting from such failures of the Developer.
- **2.3 RECORDING.** This Agreement shall be recorded with the County Recorder/Registrar within thirty days of execution.

ARTICLE 3 IMPROVEMENTS

3.1 IMPROVEMENTS. The Developer shall install, at its own cost, the Improvements in accord with the Development Plans and in accordance with the approvals of the City Council, and all City ordinances. The Developer Improvements shall be completed by December 31, 2025, except as completion dates are extended with written approval from the City Administrator or their designee.

Grading, excavation, building construction, utility construction and general construction activities are limited to Monday through Friday between the hours 7:00 AM and 7:00 PM; Saturdays 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM; and only related to an emergency or with Council approval on Sundays and holidays.

- **3.2 GROUND MATERIAL.** The Developer shall insure that adequate and suitable ground material shall exist in the areas of Improvements and shall guarantee the removal, replacement or repair of substandard or unstable material. The cost of removal, replacement or repair is the responsibility of the Developer.
- 3.3 <u>GRADING/DRAINAGE PLAN.</u> The Developer shall construct drainage facilities in accord with the Development Plans. The grading and drainage plan shall conform with the overall City storm sewer plan. The grading of the site shall be completed in conformance with the Development Plans. Developer agrees to convey to the City all necessary outlots and easements for the preservation and maintenance of the public drainage system if required. Developer shall provide

any required deeds and/or easement agreements for conveyance, in a form acceptable to the City attorney, to City before City shall issue any building or grading permits. The Developer shall enter into any easement agreements and stormwater management agreements with the Rice Creek Watershed District that are deemed necessary to fulfill the obligations of this Section.

In the event that the Developer fails to complete the grading and installation of the drainage facilities of the site in substantial conformance with the Development Plans, the City may, after notice and cure rights as outlined in Article 8 herein, declare the Developer in default pursuant to Article 8.

- **3.4 AREA RESTORATION.** The Developer shall restore all areas disturbed by the development grading operation in accordance with the approved erosion control plan. Upon request of the City Engineer, the Developer shall remove the silt fences after grading and construction have occurred.
- 3.5 STREET MAINTENANCE, ACCESS AND REPAIR. The Developer shall clear, on a daily basis, any soil, earth or debris from the streets and wetlands within, adjacent or near the Property resulting from the grading or building on the Property or associated trucking operations and shall restore to the City's specifications and repair to the City's specifications any damage to public bituminous surfacing resulting from the use of construction equipment. Furthermore, the Developer shall maintain reasonable access to any occupied buildings within the Property, including necessary street maintenance such as grading, graveling, patching.

If Developer fails to perform any of the responsibilities listed above, the City shall provide Developer with written notice. If work is not completed to City's satisfaction within 24 hours from the notice, excluding repair or restoration work for which the City has granted extra time, the City will have appropriate equipment dispatched to the site and all costs associated with the work will be billed to the Developer. In the event the Developer fails to timely pay costs related to the City work, the City shall withdraw the funds from any cash escrow or letter of credit ("LOC").

- **3.6 LANDSCAPING.** Site landscaping shall comply with approved landscaping plan dated May 30, 2024, and City required warranties.
- 3.7 <u>EROSION CONTROL</u>. The Developer shall provide and follow a plan for erosion control and pond maintenance in accord with the Best Management Practices (BMP) as delineated by Other Regulatory Agencies. Such plan shall be detailed on the Development Plans and shall be subject to approval of the City Engineer. The Developer shall install and maintain such erosion control structures as appear necessary under the Development Plans or become necessary subsequent thereto. The Developer shall be responsible for all damage caused as the result of grading and excavation resulting from the Improvements including, but not limited to, restoration of existing control structures and clean-up of public right-of-way, until the Improvements are completed. As a portion of the erosion control plan, the Developer shall re-seed or sod any disturbed areas in accordance with the Development Plans.

The parties recognize that time is of the essence in controlling erosion. If the Developer does not provide erosion control, the City shall provide Developer with notice to complete work. If work is not completed to City's satisfaction within 24 hours from the notice, the City will have appropriate

equipment dispatched to the site and all costs associated with the clean-up effort will be billed to the Developer. In addition to billing the Developer for any clean-up work, the City may also issue a stop work order under City Code Section 151.11(B)(1). In the event the Developer fails to timely pay costs related to City work, the City shall withdraw the funds from any cash escrow or LOC.

- 3.8 AS BUILT INFORMATION. One electronic copy, compatible with the City's Geographic Information System (GIS), of the detailed record plan "as built" drawings of the Improvements shall be provided by the Developer in accord with City standards no later than 120 days after completion of the Improvements, unless otherwise approved in writing by the City Engineer.
- **3.9** <u>INSPECTIONS.</u> The City Engineer, Public Works Director or their designee shall periodically inspect the following work installed by the Developer, its contractors, subcontractors or agents;
 - a. Stormwater, Sewer and Water connections to public infrastructure;
 - b. Water testing including pressure and bacteria;
 - c. Public improvements; and
 - d. General Property inspections in relation to a Letter of Credit reduction request or Project closeout.

The City does not routinely inspect private Improvements that will not be connected to public infrastructure. Developer acknowledges and agrees it is their responsibility to work directly with Other Regulatory Agencies regarding inspections required for those permits.

ARTICLE 4 RESPONSIBILITY FOR COSTS, CHARGES AND FEES

- **4.1 IMPROVEMENT COSTS.** The Developer shall pay for the Improvements; that is, all costs of persons doing work or furnishing skills, tools, machinery or materials, or insurance premiums or equipment or supplies and all just claims for the same; and the City shall be under no obligation to pay the contractor or any subcontractor any sum whatsoever on account thereof, whether or not the City shall have approved the contract or subcontract.
- **4.2 DEVELOPMENT FEES.** The Area Charges and Development Fees required for this project are identified on **Exhibit C**.
- **4.3** IMPROVEMENT ESCROW REQUIREMENT. Contemporaneously herewith, the Developer shall deposit with the City an irrevocable letter of credit ("LOC"), or cash deposit for the amount of \$94,000 as described in Exhibit C.

The bank and form of the LOC, or cash deposit shall be subject to approval by the City Finance Director and City Attorney and shall continue to be in full force and effect until released by the City. The LOC must be for at least a one-year term and must be automatically renewable for successive

one-year periods from the present or any future expiration dates with a final expiration date of termination of the two-year warranty period described in Article 6, and further provided that the LOC states that at least 60 days prior to the expiration date, the bank will notify the City if the bank elects not to renew for an additional period. The LOC shall secure compliance by the Developer with the terms of this Agreement. The City may draw down on the irrevocable letter of credit or cash deposit, without any further notice than that provided in Article 8 relating to a Developer Default, for any of the following reasons:

- a) a Developer Default; or
- b) upon the City receiving notice that the irrevocable letter of credit will be allowed to lapse before the two-year warranty period has expired pursuant to Article 6; or
- c) failure to pay the City for any of the costs and expenses referenced in Article 4 or 5.

The City may use these escrow proceeds to reimburse the City for its reasonable costs to take whatever action is necessary to stabilize the Property for any of the reasons stated above. After the City Engineer determines that Improvements have been constructed and after retaining 10% of amounts allocated in **Exhibit C** for the public Improvements, the remaining proceeds shall be distributed to Developer.

Developer may request the irrevocable letter of credit or cash deposit be reduced from time to time as financial obligations are paid. City Engineer shall inspect the Project and make the request to Council who shall have full discretion in determining the reduction amount, if any.

If it is determined by the City that the Development Plans were not strictly adhered to, or that work was done without required City inspection, the City may require, as a condition of acceptance, that the Developer post an irrevocable letter of credit, or cash deposit equal to 125% of the estimated amount necessary to correct the deficiency or to protect against deficiencies arising therefrom. The additional irrevocable letter of credit, or cash deposit, shall remain in force for such time as the City deems necessary, not to exceed five years. In the event that work, which is concealed, was done without permitting City inspection, then the City may, in the alternative, require the concealed condition to be exposed for inspection purposes.

4.4 <u>CASH ESCROW REQUIREMENT.</u> The Developer shall reimburse the City for all reasonable inspection costs relating to the Improvements and all reasonable engineering, administrative, legal and other expenses incurred or to be incurred by the City in connection with this Agreement. Therefore, contemporaneously herewith, the Developer shall deposit with the City a cash deposit for the amount of \$10,000 as described in Exhibit C to cover City reasonable expenses related to the project including but not limited to planning, engineering, legal and administrative services, soil testing and inspection services. The City shall use the cash deposit proceeds to reimburse the City for its costs and shall provide Developer with written itemization of said reimbursements. Upon completion of the project, the remaining proceeds shall be returned to Developer.

- **4.5 ENFORCEMENT COSTS.** The Developer shall pay the City for reasonable costs incurred in the enforcement of this Agreement, including engineering and attorneys' fees.
- **4.6** TIME OF PAYMENT. The Developer shall pay all bills from the City within thirty (30) days after billing. Bills not paid within thirty (30) days shall bear interest at the rate of 8% per year.

ARTICLE 5 ADDITIONAL DEVELOPMENT REQUIREMENTS

- **5.1** MISCELLANEOUS REQUIREMENTS. Additional requirements for approval of the Development Plans as specified by the City Council include the following:
 - a. Before any City permits will be issued for the Property all of the following conditions must be satisfied:
 - (1) Developer must execute this Improvement Agreement.
 - (2) Developer must provide the letter of credit for the amount stated on **Exhibit** C of this Agreement pursuant to the terms of Article 4 of this Improvement Agreement.
 - (4) Developer must fully pay the City of Forest Lake for all reasonable planning, engineering review and legal fees that have been incurred up to the date of this Improvement Agreement.
 - b. Developer shall hold a pre-construction meeting with the City and any necessary Other Regulatory Agencies prior to commencing any construction or grading activities on the Property.
 - c. Developer is solely responsible for any necessary easements or approvals from adjacent property owners for construction of the Improvements. Developer will provide evidence of such easements and/or approvals upon request of the City.

ARTICLE 6 WARRANTIES

- **6.1 DEVELOPER WARRANTIES.** "Developer Warranties" means that the Developer hereby warrants and represents the following:
- a. <u>AUTHORITY.</u> Developer has the right, power, legal capacity and authority to enter into and perform its obligations under this Agreement; no approvals or consents of any persons are necessary in connection with the authority of Developer to enter into and perform its obligations under this Agreement, other than approvals or consents that are required to be obtained herein, pursuant to Article 2.

- b. <u>FULL DISCLOSURE.</u> None of the representatives and warranties made by Developer or made in any exhibit hereto or memorandum or writing furnished or to be furnished by Developer or on its behalf contains or will contain any untrue statement of material fact or omit any material fact the omission of which would be misleading.
- c. <u>PLAN COMPLIANCE.</u> The Development Plans comply with all City, County, metropolitan, state and federal laws and regulations, including but not limited to subdivision ordinances, zoning ordinances and environmental regulations.
- d. <u>WARRANTY ON PROPER WORK AND MATERIALS.</u> The Developer warrants all work required to be performed by it under this Agreement against defective material and faulty workmanship for a period of two years after its completion. During the warranty period the Developer shall be solely responsible for all costs of performing repair work required by the City within thirty days of notification. Any trees, grass, and sod shall be warranted to be alive, of good quality, and disease free for two years after planting. Any replacements shall be similarly warranted for one year from the time of planting. In addition, the warranty period for Improvements shall be for two years after completion; the warranty for the Improvements shall also include the obligation of the Developer to repair and correct and damage to or deficiency with respect to such Improvements.
- e. Developer leases the Subject Property from Owner pursuant to a Ground Lease between Owner, as Landlord, and Developer, as Tenant, dated April 10, 2024, as amended (the "Lease").
 - **6.2 OWNER WARRANTIES.** "Owner Warranties" means that the Owner hereby warrants and represents the following:
 - a. The Owner owns fee title to the Subject Property.
 - b. The Owner leases the Subject Property to the Developer pursuant to the Lease.
- **1.6** <u>CITY WARRANTIES.</u> "City Warranties" means that the City hereby warrants and represents as follows:
- a. <u>ORGANIZATION</u>. City is a municipal corporation duly incorporated and validly existing in good standing under the laws of the State of Minnesota.
- b. <u>AUTHORITY</u>. City has the right, power, legal capacity and authority to enter into and perform its obligations under this Agreement.

ARTICLE 7 INDEMNIFICATION OF CITY

7.1 INDEMNIFICATION OF CITY. Developer shall indemnify, defend and hold the City, its Council, agents, employees, attorneys and representatives harmless against and in respect of

any and all claims, demands, actions, suits, proceedings, losses, costs, expenses, obligations, liabilities, damages, recoveries, and deficiencies, including interest, penalties and attorneys' fees, that the City incurs of suffers, which arise out of, result from or relate to:

- a) breach by the Developer of the Developer Warranties;
- b) failure of the Developer to timely construct the Improvements according to the Development Plans and the City ordinances, standards and specifications;
- c) failure by the Developer to observe or perform any covenant, condition, obligation or agreement on its part to be observed or performed under this Agreement;
- d) failure by the Developer to pay contractors, subcontractors, laborers, or materialmen;
- e) failure by the Developer to pay for materials;
- f) failure to pay the City for any costs and expenses referenced in Article 4 and 5;
- g) approval by the City of the Development Plans;
- h) failure to obtain the necessary permits and authorizations to construct the Improvements;
- i) construction of the Improvements;
- i) delays in construction of the Improvements;
- k) all costs and liabilities arising because building permits were issued prior to the completion and acceptance of the Improvements.

ARTICLE 8 CITY REMEDIES UPON DEVELOPER DEFAULT

8.1 <u>CITY REMEDIES.</u> If Developer Default occurs, that is not caused by Force Majeure, the City shall give the Developer Formal Notice of the Developer Default and the Developer shall have ten business days to cure the Developer Default. If the Developer, after Formal Notice to it by the City, does not cure the Developer Default within ten business days, then the City may avail itself of any remedy afforded by law and any of the following remedies:

- a) The City may specifically enforce this Agreement;
- b) The City may collect on the irrevocable letter of credit or cash deposit pursuant to Article 4;
- c) The City may, at its sole option, perform the work or improvements to be performed by the Developer, in which case the Developer shall within thirty days after written billing by the City reimburse the City for any costs and expenses incurred by the City;
- d) The City may suspend or deny building permits for buildings within the Subject Property;
- e) The City may suspend any work, improvement or obligation to be performed by the City; and/or
- f) The City may, at its sole option, certify against the Subject Property, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 444.075. subd. 3e, any unpaid charges, and the Washington County Auditory/Property Tax Assessor shall collect said unpaid charges in the year following said certification as the other Property taxes are collected.
- **8.2 NO ADDITIONAL WAIVER IMPLIED BY ONE WAIVER.** In the event any agreement contained in this Agreement is breached by the Developer and thereafter waived in writing by the City, such waiver shall be limited to the particular breach so waived and shall not be deemed to waive any other concurrent, previous or subsequent breach hereunder. All waivers by the City must be in writing.
- 8.3 NO REMEDY EXCLUSIVE. No remedy herein conferred upon or reserved to the City shall be exclusive of any other available remedy or remedies, but each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy given under the Agreement or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute. No delay or omission to exercise any right or power accruing upon any default shall impair any such right or power or shall be construed to be a waiver thereof, but any such right and power may be exercised from time to time and as often as may be deemed expedient. In order to entitle the City to exercise any remedy reserved to it, it shall not be necessary to give notice, other than the Formal Notice.
- **8.4 EMERGENCY.** Notwithstanding the requirement contained in this Article hereof relating to Formal Notice to the Developer in case of a Developer Default and notwithstanding the requirement contained in this Article hereof relating to giving the Developer a ten business day period to cure the Developer Default, in the event of an emergency as determined by the City Engineer, resulting from the Developer Default, the City may perform the work or improvement to be performed by the Developer without giving any notice or Formal Notice to the Developer and without giving the Developer the ten day period to cure the Developer Default. In such case, the Developer shall, within

thirty days after written billing by the City, reimburse the City for any and all costs incurred by the City.

Developer shall provide City with contact information for Project Manager who will be available 24 hours a day 7 days a week until the project is completed. In the event the Project Manager changes during the development, Developer shall provide City with updated contact information.

ARTICLE 9 MISCELLANEOUS

- **9.1** <u>CITY'S DUTIES.</u> The terms of this Agreement shall not be considered an affirmative duty upon the City to complete any Improvements.
- **9.2 NO THIRD-PARTY RECOURSE.** Third parties shall have no recourse against the City under this Agreement.
- **9.3** <u>VALIDITY.</u> If any portion, section, subsection, sentence, clause, paragraph or phrase of this Agreement is for any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Agreement.
- 9.4 <u>BINDING AGREEMENT.</u> The parties mutually recognize and agree that all terms and conditions of this recordable Improvement Agreement shall run with the Subject Property and shall be binding upon the successors and assigns of the Developer. This Improvement Agreement shall also run with and be binding upon any after acquired interest of the Developer in the Subject Property.
- 9.5 <u>ASSIGNMENT.</u> The Developer may not assign this Improvement Agreement without the written permission of the City which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed. The Developer's obligations hereunder shall continue in full force and effect, unless fully assumed by agreement with subsequent assignee or owner, which shall include the submission of an updated LOC in the subsequent assignee or owners name pursuant to Article 4.3 and payment of any outstanding fees not covered by the escrow provided in Article 4.4.
- 9.6 <u>AMENDMENT AND WAIVER.</u> The parties hereto may by mutual written agreement amend this Agreement in any respect. Any party hereto may extend the time for the performance of any of the obligations of another, waive any inaccuracies in representations by another contained in this Agreement or in any document delivered pursuant hereto which inaccuracies would otherwise constitute a breach of this Agreement, waive compliance by another with any of the covenants contained in this Agreement, waive performance of any obligations by the other or waive

the fulfillment of any condition that is precedent to the performance by the party so waiving of any of its obligations under this Agreement. Any agreement on the part of any party for any such amendment, extension or waiver must be in writing. No waiver of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed, or shall constitute, a waiver of any other provisions, whether or not similar, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver.

- 9.7 GOVERNING LAW. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Minnesota.
- **9.8** <u>COUNTERPARTS.</u> This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- 9.9 <u>HEADINGS.</u> The subject headings of the paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Agreement are included for purposes of convenience only, and shall not affect the construction of interpretation of any of its provisions.
- **9.10 INCONSISTENCY.** If the Development Plans are inconsistent with the words of this Agreement or if the obligation imposed hereunder upon the Developer are inconsistent, then that provision or term which imposes a greater and more demanding obligation on the Developer shall prevail.
- **9.11** ACCESS. The Developer hereby grants to the City, its agents, employees, officers, and contractors a license to enter the Property to perform all work and inspections deemed appropriate by the City during the installation of Improvements.

BACKGROUND:

Since 2021 City staff have been in discussions with GLG Properties LLC (GLG) about the rehabilitation and revitalization of the Houle elevator, located at 55 2nd Street SW. Along with the adaptive reuse of the elevator for retail purposes, the redevelopment plans include a second phase which would accommodate a retail greenhouse, outside nursery area, and associated pedestrian and parking improvements. Once complete, the entirety of the 200 block of Broadway Street West will be developed to an urban standard. To accomplish their full site build out, GLG has submitted an offer letter to the City to purchase 280 Broadway Avenue West for \$70,000.

ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL:

Should the City Council transfer the 280 Broadway Street West deed to the Economic Development Authority for sale to GLG Properties for redevelopment purposes?

PROPOSAL/ANALYSIS:

As early as 2021, City staff have been in discussions with GLG about the acquisition of 280 Broadway Avenue West for the purposes of full site buildout. However, it was not until early 2024 that City staff brought this request before the City Council and Economic Development Authority (EDA) to negotiate the private party's potential acquisition of this parcel. During the negotiation process, City staff reviewed with the EDA and City Council the history of the subject parcel. In those discussions, it was determined sale to GLG for the redevelopment project was appropriate.

The property is owned by the City of Forest Lake. In discussions with the EDA, the EDA has expressed favorability to reducing the purchase price of the land (appraised at \$138,000 in 2022) in exchange for the redevelopment project. At their regularly-scheduled meeting in July, the EDA approved a Purchase and Private Development Agreement (Agreement) with GLG. However, this approval occurred prior to the EDA holding a public hearing. Thus, at their August 12, 2024 meeting the EDA will hold a public hearing to reconsider the Agreement; it is anticipated the EDA will approve the Agreement. As noted in the Purchase and Private Development Agreement,

GLG's failure to complete the redevelopment by December 31, 2027, the property will revert back to the EDA.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Aside from legal costs associated with drafting the legal agreement and costs associated with the sale, there is negligible fiscal impact. In fact, the sale will add revenue to the City.

OPTIONS:

The City Council can elect to transfer the deed to the EDA or not.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Staff recommends that, if the Council elects to remove the deed transfer consideration from the Consent Agenda, then the Council move to approve Resolution No. 08-12-24-05, A Resolution Approving Conveyance of Land to the Forest Lake Economic Development Authority for Redevelopment Purposes.

BACKGROUND: City Ordinance requires that anyone who wishes to offer therapeutic massage services obtain a license. CarrieLynn Stewart has applied for a Massage Therapist License.

ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL: Should Council approve a massage therapist license for CarrieLynn Stewart?

PROPOSAL/ANALYSIS: Pursuant to City Code, Chapter 115.15, an applicant for a massage therapist license must meet the following requirements:

- The license shall be issued only to persons who have received and can furnish proof of receiving at least 600 hours of certified therapeutic massage training recognized and accepted by the State of Minnesota or a national professional therapeutic massage organization.
- The license shall be issued only to persons of good moral character and repute.
- No massage therapist license shall be issued to an applicant who has been convicted of criminal prostitution, similar sex offenses, or other crimes directly related to the offering of massage therapy services or the running of a massage business, and has not shown competent evidence of sufficient rehabilitation and present fitness to perform the duties and responsibilities of a licensee as prescribed by M.S. § 364.03, Subd. 3.
- The license shall not be issued to persons who have, within 1 year prior to the date of application, been denied licensure or have had a massage therapist or massage business license denied or revoked by any political subdivision, municipality or by the State of Minnesota.
- The license shall be issued only to applicants who have fully and truthfully answered all of the information requested in the application and have paid the full license and investigation fee.
- The license shall be issued only to persons 18 years of age or older.

City staff, including the Forest Lake Police Department, have reviewed the application and applicant's supporting documentation and have conducted the requisite background investigation. Staff has verified that the applicant meets all requirements; approval of the resolution authorizing a Massage Therapist license is recommended.

FISCAL IMPACT: Small annual increase to licensing revenue: the fee for an annual therapist license is \$50.00.

BACKGROUND: St. Peter's Catholic Church hosts a Fall Festival at its parish annually. ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL: Should Council provide City approval the permits and licenses for St. Peter's Fall Festival?

PROPOSAL/ANALYSIS In order to conduct an outdoor event with any amplification of sound, a permit is required. The staff at St. Peter's have been in frequent contact with City staff to ensure they are meeting all requirements of the code, including submission of site plans, safety plans, and insurance documentation for the outdoor special event permit. Staff have reviewed the plans and recommend approval.

St. Peter's has also submitted an application for an exempt gambling permit to conduct bingo and a raffle at the festival. The Church meets all requirements laid out in state statute to obtain an exempt permit. Staff recommend approval of this application.

A temporary on-sale liquor license application has also been submitted as the church intends to offer alcoholic beverages for sale at the festival. Staff has reviewed insurance details submitted by the church and has verified that the church meets the requirements to obtain a temporary on-sale liquor license; as such, approval of this application is also recommended.

BACKGROUND:

Council last discussed how to move forward with filling the vacancy created in April with the resignation of the previous Parks and Recreation Supervisor at their May 28th meeting. Staff heard mixed reactions from council about creating a mid-management level position in public works and went back to the drawing board to develop a new proposal.

ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL:

Should the City Council approve the amended Parks and Recreation Coordinator job description and authorize staff to begin advertising for the position?

PROPOSAL/ANALYSIS:

Staff has revised the Parks and Recreation Supervisor position to a Parks and Recreation Coordinator position. We feel strongly that parks functions should be housed in one department and given the current development level of the organization, that department should be public works. Future city councils may consider creating a stand alone parks department that houses all staff related to parks but we are not there as we need the flexibility with some of our maintenance staff to assign them to either parks or streets depending upon the need of the day. This position will be fully devoted to parks administration.

The Parks and Recreation Coordinator position is very similar to the Parks and Recreation Supervisor position however, it will remain a grade level 6 and work cooperatively with the Parks Foreman and Public Works Director to staff the Parks and Recreation Commission with a focus on the non-infrastructure components of parks and recreation. Infrastructure, capital improvements, maintenance issues will be the primary responsibility of the Parks Foreman and other Public Works maintenance staff. The Parks and Recreation Coordinator's main focus will be programming, event coordination and promotion, facility rental, partnerships/agreements, and related grants.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Keeping the position at a Grade Level 6, means the 2024 annual salary range is \$63,609.62 - \$79,512.03; the total compensation is \$93,649 - \$112,016. This will result in a decrease of about \$30,000 in the proposed 2025 (from what was previously included in the FMP).

OPTIONS:

- 1) Approve the Parks and Recreation Coordinator Job Description and Authorize staff to advertise for applicants at Grade 6.
- 2) Amend and or proposed grade and then then authorize staff to advertise the position.
- 3) Do not approve the new job description and authorize staff to advertise for the Parks and Recreation Supervisor position with no changes.

- Participates in the selection process and provides work direction to seasonal employees as needed to support park programming.

BACKGROUND:

In January, 2023, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 721 which repealed and replaced City Code pertaining to the (then) Parks, Trails and Lakes Commission. At that time, Ordinance No. 721 aimed to outline the roles and responsibilities of the (new) Parks and Recreation Commission (Commission) and of the two departments managing the parks system. However, since the adoption of that Ordinance, no appointments have been made to the Commission. As the City has sought new volunteers for the Commission and is preparing to conduct interviews and appointments to fill these vacancies, it was determined minor amendments are appropriate.

ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL:

Should the City Council adopt Ordinance No. 740, An Ordinance Amending Title III, Chapter 31, Section 31.75, Related to the Parks and Recreation Commission?

PROPOSAL/ANALYSIS:

In previous discussions with the City Council, it has been determined there are some portions of Ordinance No. 721 which are not appropriate for the new Commission; this has largely centered around having member representatives from the Forest Lake Area School District and the Forest Lake Area Athletic Association as voting members of the Commission. Enclosed is an updated Ordinance for the City Council's consideration that not only changes those representatives to non-voting, ad hoc members but also removes references to the separate departments that have been managing the system as outlining staff duties in Ordinance is unconventional.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Aside from costs associated with publishing the Ordinance in the Forest Lake Times, there is no fiscal impact to the City with the adoption of Ordinance No. 740.

OPTIONS:

The Council has the following options:

- 1. Move to approve Ordinance No. 740; or
- 2. Move to approve Ordinance No. 740 with modifications; or

- 3. Move to direct staff to amend Ordinance No. 740 and bring back for Council consideration at a later date; or
- 4. Move to deny Ordinance No. 740.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE III, CHAPTER 31, SECTION 31.75, RELATED TO THE PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOREST LAKE ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section One. <u>Title III, Chapter 31, Section 31.75 Amendment:</u> Title 11, Chapter 31, Section 31.75 of the Forest Lake City Code is hereby amended as follows. The <u>underlined</u> text shows the proposed additions to the City Code, the <u>struck out</u> text shows the deleted wording, and all other unformatted text remains unchanged:

§ 31.75 PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION.

- A. Establishment. There is hereby created a Parks and Recreation Commission of the City of Forest Lake that will be the successor to the current Park, Trails, and Lakes Commission, which is hereby abolished. This Commission is not a park board as is defined under M.S. Ch. 412 and shall have no powers to acquire or lease land, employ personnel, or enter into contracts or leases, or any similar powers authorized for a park board by state law.
- B. Definitions. For the purpose of this section, the following definitions will apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

PARK SYSTEM. All areas of land for the enjoyment of the public in the city, including public parks, trails, open spaces, and pedestrian facility system and public service facilities.

PARTNERED RECREATION PROGRAMS. Any program for organized recreation such as athletics, <u>classes</u>, games and other similar activities where the <u>Ceity</u> is partnering with another entity such as the Forest Lake Area Athletic Association, <u>or</u> the Forest Lake School District, <u>or other</u> to provide the programming.

SPECIAL-PUBLIC PARK EVENTS. A group activity including, but not limited to, a performance, meeting, assembly, contest, exhibit, ceremony, festival, parade, reading, or picnic for which specific space in the Park System is requested to be reserved regardless of profit. It is an activity where the general public is invited, allowed or encouraged to attend. This shall not be defined as a private event, restricted to members of a family, organizations, group, or by invitation only. This definition shall not include casual park use by visitors.

- C. Purpose. The Commission is an advisory body, tasked with the responsibility to review and make recommendations to the Forest Lake City Council and city staff on matters of the development and use of the city's park system Park System, development and promotion of special-public park events, and the development and promotion of partnered recreation programs.
- D. Membership.

- 1. The Commission will consist of 7 regular members appointed by the Mayor, with the consent of the Council—, and two non-voting ad hoc representatives, one each from One member will be a representative from the Forest Lake Area Athletic Association (FLAAA) and 1 member will be a representative from and the Forest Lake Area School District (FLASD). The non-voting representatives shall attend meetings of the Commission and participate in the discussion of the matters coming before the Commission and may participate as deemed appropriate in other matters coming before the Commission. With the exception of the FLAAA and FLASD representatives, all members of the Commission will be qualified voters and residents of the city.
- 2. Regular members will be appointed to a 3-year term, with a limit of 2 consecutive terms. Terms will expire January 31 of the third year of such term. Members appointed to the initial Commission will serve the following initial terms: 2 members will serve for a term of 1 year, 2 members will serve for a term of 2 years, and 3 members will serve for a term of 3 years. Initial terms of less than 3 years will not be counted towards the consecutive term limit. Time served by members existing prior to the initial Commission's formation will not be counted towards the consecutive term limit.
- 3. Vacancies will be filled by appointment of the Mayor with approval of the Council for the balance of the term. A member of the Commission may be removed with or without cause by a simple majority vote of Council.

E. Meetings.

- 1. The Commission will hold the following meetings:
 - a. At least 1 regular meeting each month at such time and place as it may fix by Council resolution be posted at City Hall in accordance with the open meeting law; and
 - b. An annual public meeting to receive community comments regarding the Commission's purpose and goals for the upcoming year.
- 2. A simple majority of the Commission constitutes a quorum. Findings will be recorded in the official minutes, which shall be a public record. Members will receive compensation of \$25 per meeting and are entitled to a reasonable reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses incurred. No obligation incurred by any person on behalf of Commission will be valid unless the expenditure is authorized the Council.
- 3. At the first regular meeting in February, the Commission will elect a Chairperson and a Vice Chairperson from among its appointed members for a term of 1 year; and the Commission may create and fill such other offices as it may determine. The Chairperson will preside over all meetings, and in the event of their absence, the Vice Chairperson will perform these duties.

F. Commissioner duties.

- 1. The Commission will review, advise and make recommendations to the Council regarding:
 - a. Matters related to the <u>park systemPark System</u>, including but not limited to the expansion of and plans for <u>Park System the</u> development;

- b. Updates to the <u>park system Park System</u> in the city's comprehensive plan, <u>park system Park System</u> plan, and individual park plans;
- c. Proposed special-public park events and partnered recreation programs;
- d. Parkland dedication requirements for proposed developments;
- e. Annual <u>work plan and goals</u>, fee schedule changes, budgets, and capital improvement plans (including, but not limited to, capital replacements, repairs, and additions).
- 2. The Commission will assist city staff as requested and advise city staff in matters of policy regarding the following tasks:
 - a. The attitudes and concerns of the citizens of Forest Lake regarding the park systemPark System, special public park events and partnered recreation programs;
 - b. Engagement with a variety of internal and external stakeholders in matters beneficial to the park systemPark System;
 - c. Quality and variety of special public <u>park</u> events and partnered recreation programs;
 - d. Monitor industry trends;
 - e. Methods to engage positive public interest in the park systemPark System, special public park events and partnered recreation programs;
 - f. Feasible methods of discouraging vandalism and destruction of the park systemPark System; and
 - g. Hold public meetings on plans, programs, and policies as necessary.
- —(G) Staff's duties. The work of the Commission is a collaborative effort between the Commission and multiple city departments including Community Development and Public Works. Both departments shall assign a qualified member of their respective departments to carry out the following:
- (1) Prepare and update all plans regarding the park system, special public events, and partnered recreation programs;
- (2) Coordinate opportunities for citizen participation and education of the park system, special public events and partnered recreation programs; and
- (3) Attend Commission meetings as may be required.
- (4) The Community Development Department shall:
- (a) Provide orientation and ongoing training to all new Commission members;
- (b) Keep Commission informed of relevant actions of the Council and other city commissions;
- (c) Prepare an agenda for each Commission meeting;
- (d) Prepare minutes from each Commission meeting and submit to the Commission for review and approval at the following meeting;
- (e) Plan and execute special public events for the city;

The City is modifying its Parks and Recreation Commission ordinance by altering membership and removing staff responsibilities.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on August 15, 2024.

Passed by the Forest Lake City Council on August 12, 2024.

BACKGROUND:

The Forest Lake Police Department requested an ordinance prohibiting the location of a predatory offender's residence near schools, parks and commercial daycares within the City of Forest Lake. A predatory offender is an offender who has committed one of the offenses listed below in which the victim was less than 16 years old and pursuant to Minnesota Statute, is required to register under the predatory offender registration law.

An offender must register under the law if charged with and convicted of one of the following offenses or another offense arising out of the same set of circumstances: murder while committing or attempting to commit criminal sexual conduct in the first or second degree with force or violence; kidnapping; criminal sexual conduct in the first, second, third, fourth, and fifth (felony only) degree; felony indecent exposure; false imprisonment of a minor; soliciting a minor to engage in prostitution or sexual conduct; using a minor in a sexual performance; and possessing pictorial representations of minors.

Due to the nature of these crimes, the City has a compelling public interest to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City, recognizing the particular vulnerability of minors, by prohibiting predatory offenders from establishing residence around primary schools, parks, and commercial daycares, locations where minors regularly congregate.

ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL:

Consider an Ordinance establishing restrictions on where a predatory offender can establish temporary or permanent residence within the City. Specifically, the Ordinance would prohibit a predatory offender from residing within 1200 feet of every primary school, public park, and commercial daycare within the City. See attached Map, every blue circle is a 1200-foot radius around a school, park, or daycare.

PROPOSAL/ANALYSIS:

Summary of Ordinance

1. Purpose

- To establish restrictions on where a predatory offender can establish temporary or permanent residences within the city.
- To protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the city, recognizing the
 particular vulnerability of minors, by prohibiting predatory offenders from establishing
 residence around schools, parks and commercial daycares, locations where minors
 regularly congregate.

2. Protected Zones

- It will be unlawful for any predatory offender to establish a residence or reside on a parcel where any portion of the parcel lies within 1200 feet of any of the following protected places:
 - School for pre-K through Grade 12 (public, private, or charter);
 - Public park;
 - Public playground;
 - o Licensed childcare center (excluding in-home daycare providers).

3. Exceptions

- A predatory offender residing within a prohibited zone will not be in violation of the ordinance if:
 - They established, reported, and registered the residence prior to the effective date of the ordinance;
 - o They are under the age of 18 and living with a parent or legal guardian; or
 - The protected place commenced operation after they established residence and reported and registered the residence.

4. Renting Real Property

• It will be unlawful to let or rent any place, building, trailer or other structure, or part thereof, with the knowledge that it will be used as a residence by a predatory offender prohibited from establishing such residence pursuant to the ordinance, if such place, building, trailer, or other structure is located within a protected zone.



ORDINANCE NO. 741

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING FOREST LAKE CITY CODE TITLE XIII, CHAPTER 130, SECTION 130.13, RESTRICTING THE LOCATION OF A PREDATORY OFFENDER'S RESIDENCE

The City Council of the City of Forest Lake does ordain:

SECTION 1. ENACTMENT. Forest Lake City Code Section 130.13 is hereby enacted as follows:

§130.13 PREDATORY OFFENDER RESIDENCE LOCATION RESTRICTIONS.

- A. *Purpose*. The purpose of this Section is to establish restrictions on where a predatory offender can establish temporary or permanent residences within the city. This section aims to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the city, recognizing the particular vulnerability of minors, by prohibiting predatory offenders from establishing residence around schools, parks, and commercial daycares, locations where minors regularly congregate.
- B. Definitions. For purposes of this Section, the following terms shall be defined as stated.

Predatory Offender.

Any person who is: (1) required under Minn. Stat. §243.166 to register as a predatory offender with the Minnesota Department of Public Safety Predatory Offender Unit. A person is treated as a predatory offender if the person has committed a designated offense, as defined herein.

<u>Designated Offense.</u>

A conviction, adjudication of delinquency, or commitment involving any of the following offenses under Minnesota statutes sections: 609.185(a)(2); 609.25; 609.342 – 609.345; 609.3451; 609.3453; 617.23(3); 609.746(1)(h); 609.2325(1)(b); 609.255(2); 609.322; 609.324(1)(a); 609.352(2); 609.352(2a); 617.246; 617.247; 609.3455(3a); 253B.18; successor statutes; a similar offense from another state; or a conviction of a similar offense under a law of the United States, including the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

Residence (or Reside).

A place where a person abides, dwells, inhabits or stays for more than fourteen (14) days in the aggregate during a 12-month period or a place where the person routinely abides, dwell, inhabits or stays for four (4) or more consecutive or non-consecutive days in any month.

Residence does not require the person to have an ownership interest in or a formal rental or lease agreement for the residence. A hotel, motel, or other commercial lodging

establishment, boarding house or shelter, and group home may be deemed a person's residence under this Section.

A predatory offender's registered residence(s) shall include their: primary address; secondary address; all addresses used for residential or recreational purposes; and the addresses of all Minnesota property owned, leased, or rented by the person.

All homeless predatory offenders living within the City of Forest Lake are required to register with the Minnesota Department of Public Safety Predatory Offender Unit.

C. Location of Residence.

- 1. <u>Protected Zones.</u> It is unlawful for any predatory offender to establish a residence or otherwise reside on a parcel where any portion of the parcel lies within 1,200 feet of any of the following places (hereinafter referred to as "Protected Zones"):
 - a. School for pre-K through Grade 12 (public, private, or charter);
 - b. Public park;
 - c. Public playground;
 - d. Licensed childcare center (excluding in-home daycare providers). (collectively "Protected Places")
- 2. <u>Determining the Minimum Distance</u>. For purposes of determining the minimum distance separation of 1,200 feet, the requirement shall be measured by following a horizontal line from any property line of the lot or parcel on which the subject residence is located to the nearest property line of the subject prohibited zone identified above.
- 3. Official Map. The Police Chief shall maintain an official map showing approximate locations in which a predatory offender is prohibited to reside, as defined by this Section. The Police Chief shall update the map at least annually to reflect any changes in the location of prohibited zones. The actual measurement of the minimum distance separation of 1,200 feet between the residence and the prohibited zone shall govern.
- D. *Penalty*. A violation of this Section is a misdemeanor. Each day a person maintains a residence in violation of this section constitutes a separate violation.
- E. *Exceptions*. A predatory offender residing within a prohibited zone is not in violation of this Section if any of the following applies:
 - 1. The predatory offender established the residence and reported and registered the residence pursuant to Minn. Stat. §243.166, and Minn. Stat. §243.167 (if applicable) or successor statute(s), prior to the effective date of this Section;

- 2. The predatory offender is under the age of 18 and resides with a parent or legal guardian; or
- 3. The Protected Place commenced operation after the predatory offender established residence and reported and registered the residence pursuant to Minn. Stat. §243.166 or successor statute.
- F. Renting Real Property in Violation of this Section.
 - 1. It is unlawful to let or rent any place, building, trailer or other structure, or part thereof, with the knowledge that it will be used as a residence by a predatory offender prohibited from establishing such residence pursuant to this Section, if such place, building, trailer or other structure, or part thereof, is located within a Protected Zone described in this Section.
 - 2. A property owner's failure to comply with the provisions of this Section shall constitute a violation of this Section and shall be subject to the penalties provided herein.

BACKGROUND:

At the June 10, 2024, meeting, council authorized the issuance of a Request for Proposals (RFP) for a Public Works Facility Assessment/Space Needs Study. Proposals were due July 15, 2024. The city received proposals from 7 firms by the deadline-ISG, Wold, Widseth, Oertel, Adkins, MSA and Urbanworks. The cost of services in the proposals ranged from \$18,200 to \$148,480.

ISSUE BEFORE COUNCIL:

Which firm shall the council select to complete the public works space needs study?

PROPOSAL/ANALYSIS:

The Public Works Director and Interim City Administrator scored the proposals based upon the criteria in the RFP-understanding of the project; qualifications and expertise of key personnel; experience and qualifications of the firm and consultant team; project approach, schedule, and resources available to complete the project; references; and cost.

The top two scoring firms were Oertel and Wold. Staff are recommending the council select Wold. They scored high on the understanding of the project, work plan, schedule and resources, costs and have a Forest Lake connection. While Oertel scored highest in most categories, staff cannot justify the cost (\$41,804) that is more than double Wold (\$19,750) at this point in the process.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The not to exceed price is \$19,750. The council budgeted \$50,000 for this in the capital improvement fund for 2024.

OPTIONS:

- 1) Authorize the Mayor and Clerk to enter into a contract with Wold for the Public Works Space Needs Study after city attorney review.
- 2) Authorize the Mayor and Clerk to enter into a contract with another firm for the Public Works Space Needs Study after city attorney review.
- 3) Do not engage a firm in a Public Works Space Needs Study.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

"Motion to Authorize the Mayor and Clerk to enter into a contract with Wold for the Public Works Space Needs Study after city attorney review."
