Project Background

- High speeds & traffic volumes make entering roadway difficult from side streets
 - 10,000 Average Daily Traffic (ADT) on TH 61
 - 2,000 ADT on side street
- Currently side-street stop controlled
- Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB)
- History of crashes involving pedestrians
 - *with RRFB in operation
- Hardwood Creek Regional Trail

 - Local Partnership Program \$1,000,000

Reduce the frequency and severity of crashes.



Provide clear, safe, and accessible crossings for multi-modal trail users.

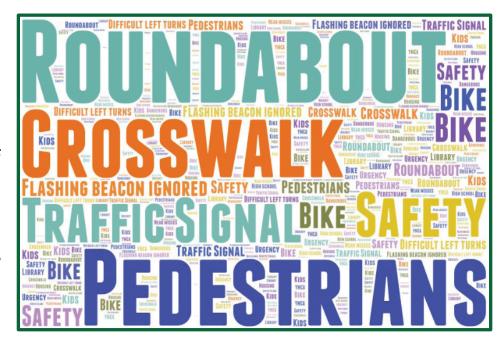


Maintain acceptable vehicular operations for current and future traffic volumes.



Open House #1, July 9 - What We Heard

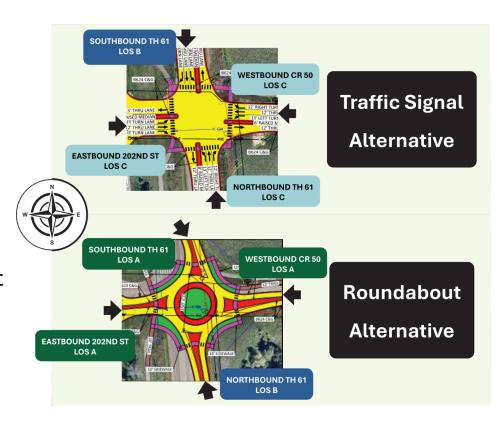
- Difficult to turn left onto TH 61
- Difficult & dangerous to cross as a pedestrian
 - TH 61 is a barrier
 - Drivers fail to yield to flashing RRFB
 - RRFB is hard to see depending on the angle of the sun
 - High speed vehicles = high consequence
- Strong support for intersection improvements
- Project should be expedited





Traffic Study & Alternatives

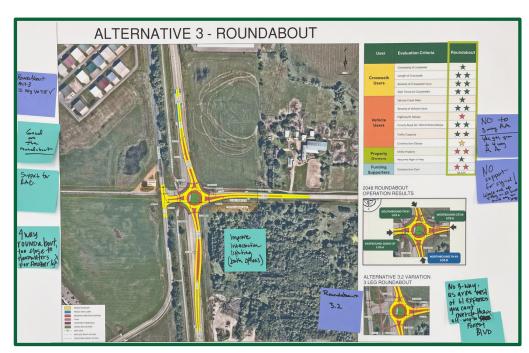
- Gathered existing vehicle and pedestrian volumes
- Forecasted for future growth in surrounding area
- Both signal and roundabout options can accommodate future demands
 - Roundabout will see less delays for side street users
- Looked at feasibility of removing the west leg of the intersection





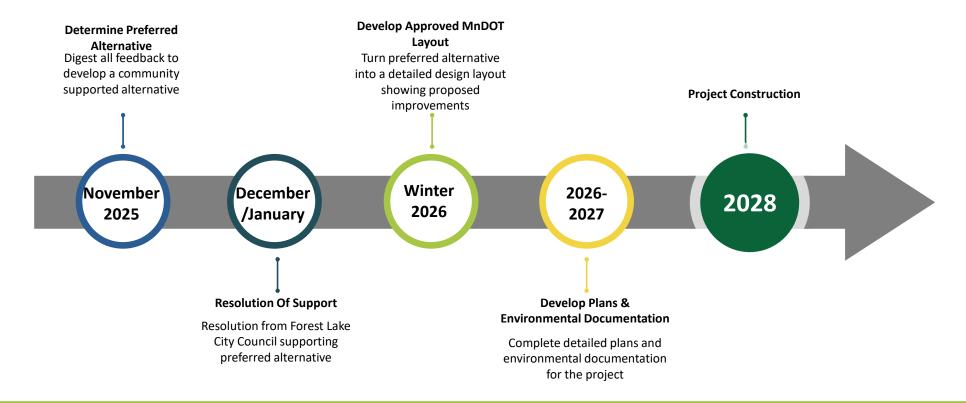
Open House #2, September 17 - What We Heard

- Strong support for a roundabout
 - Maintains access to TH 61 during off peak hours
 - Minimizes delay on side streets
 - Lower vehicle speed
- Improved intersection lighting
- Less support for signalized option
- Feedback is split on west leg closure

Comments:

Joshua Wickander, Republican Senate District 33 Chair, said that the 13 percent proposed levy is concerning. He stated that the new public works building needed to be on the ballot for residents to decide. He encouraged the City Council to get as close to zero percent with the levy.

Chris Luger, 2280 Court, agreed with the previous comments.

Julie Bernier, 5063 217th Street North, requested consideration to separate the twelve percent levy increase over time, as those on the lakeside have catch-up taxes added to their properties.

A resident, who was not clearly identified, said he appreciated the comments so far. He said that he watched his taxes increase over the last couple of years. He stated he had a large family, so small increases over time really impacted his family budget. They moved to Forest Lake because it was known to be fiscally responsible. He expressed confusion with the large request for the Public Works building and the need to scale back on the project.

Resident Isaac Erickson said he owned two small businesses in town, and he would rather use the money to help invest in Forest Lake businesses, rather than a twelve percent tax increase. He went to the new environment building, and it seemed unnecessary to have such a nice building.

Frank Nameny asked when the twelve percent was discussed. Mayor Roberts answered that they can lower the levy, and they cannot go any higher. He said that they will discuss the levy tonight.

Mr. Namenyasked why they set the budget at such a high amount. He said it was like negotiating when they bring it down to make residents feel good.

5. Classification and Compensation Study Results – Malayna Maes Halvorson/Mark Statz

City Administrator Statz said that they had the report results to present. They will discuss the implementation of the report.

Malayna Maes Halvorson, from McGrath Human Resources Group, discussed how they engaged various individuals from the organization with the project. She complimented the level of transparency and engagement of the Forest Lake employees. She reviewed the human capital and noted that there had been a change in the public sector, as more people were leaving than coming in. The difficulty with backfilling creates difficulty with overtime and training. She stated there are recruitment and retention challenges, and Forest Lake needs to keep all its positions filled. She reviewed the graphs about the employment length and noted that there were employees in their fifties and sixties who would start thinking about retirement. She stated that over one-third of the workforce was under the age of forty and were extra mobile based on wages, which makes it difficult to plan for succession. She summarized the process for the classification and compensation study results, including the employee survey and a list of comparable cities. She reviewed the graph to explain how minimum wages compared to positions in other cities. She reviewed the graph to explain how the mid-range wage point compared to positions in other cities. She stated that there was collective bargaining in the City, and they recommended putting all positions on one unified salary schedule and moving to six steps with a four percent increase at each step. She summarized the discussion of position placement and succession management. She recommended an identified economic indicator that they utilize each year. She noted it had been a volatile market for the last five years, and they should do a market update every three to five years.

Assistant City Administrator Chaika noted that the City's labor attorney was in favor of moving to one schedule to benefit the bargaining units and the pay equity.

Mayor Roberts asked about the initial conversation. Ms. Maes Halvorson answered that they had some that were favorable and some that might be disappointed in the outcomes because they thought their positions would receive more.

City Administrator Statz said if someone sees that they are getting a substantial raise, that will feel good, but an employee who would not get a raise since they were over the market might be disappointed. He said that the markets did not care about the midpoint but often cared about the maximum salary. He stated that they wanted to look at a strategy to align the midpoint and maximum with the market as closely as possible so that most employees receive a modest increase. He stated that the proposed budget matched closely with the suggested changes. He stated that if they wanted to lower the salary standards, that would not be preferred because they want to get their pay up to the market.

Commissioner Erickson said that they have seen a lot of turnover in their employees, and there is a cost to training.

Ms. Mae Halvorson said that public safety had about twice the cost of a position with turnover rates. She suggested reallocating the funds into the salary so that they do not have to bleed the dollars out in overtime and training costs.

Mayor Roberts said that they are losing people to Woodbury. He said that it took a year to hire a building official because of the salary rate.

City Administrator Statz stated that the next step would be to bring them a matrix and discuss strategy, and the City Council can formally adopt a portion of the study. He stated that they have negotiating sessions lined up in November.

6. Review of the Big 3 Street Recons - Ryan Goodman

Councilmember Erickson said that the road projects had a high cost, so residents should know about the projects.

City Engineer Goodman provided an overview of his presentation. He summarized the three proposed street reconstruction projects, including North Shore Drive and North Shore Trail, 12th Street Southwest, and Harrow Avenue North. He explained the road rating system so the City Council can see the road conditions.

Mayor Roberts asked if it included any improvements on the trunk highway. City Engineer Goodman answered that it did not include any improvements on the trunk highway.

City Administrator Statz stated that this did not include their share of investments in Highway 97 or Highway 61, as those were outside the CIP. He stated that these were not new projects, but they were evaluating where they should fall on the CIP.

City Engineer Goodman reviewed the project scope and cost estimate for North Shore Drive and Trail. He summarized the pros and cons of the key project issues. He reviewed the project scope for 12th Street Southwest and noted that it was currently identified for construction from 2030 to 2031. He stated that the high-level planning cost estimate was \$11,900,000. He summarized the pros and cons of the key project issues. He reviewed the project scope for Harrow Avenue North and noted that it was currently identified for construction in 2031-2032. He said that the high-level planning cost estimate was \$9,800,000. He summarized the pros and cons of the key project issues. He discussed where the projects fell in the capital improvement plan from 2026 to 2035. He summarized the roadway assessment policy and noted that they would assess a minimum of twenty percent to the property owners, and the City would cover the remaining eighty percent.

Mayor Roberts asked if the twenty percent was contemplated. City Engineer Goodman said it was not considered.

City Administrator Statz said that they would receive a fifth of the twenty percent over a ten-year cycle. He said that some of the costs were bonded. He said that the cost impact was stretched out over a period of time, and all three projects were planned for bonds. He stated that they could delay the project or save for the project. He stated that those who pay for the project are often those who use the roadway.

City Engineer Goodman asked if they had an alternative project priority sequence and if the outline in the CIP was in line with future goals and needs, or if adjustments needed to be made.

Councilmember Erickson voiced concern about the Northshore Trail project alongside Highway 8. City Engineer Goodman answered that Highway 8 had been delayed a number of times.

Councilmember Erickson voiced concerns with Harrow, as more homes would be put on Highway 97. City Engineer Goodman said that there was history in the corridor. He said an accident happened at Goodview, so all the work went there. He said that there were a lot of changes that happened in the last couple of years, but they were able to put the project on the MnDOT radar to look at the intersection.

Mayor Roberts asked about Fenway. City Engineer Goodman answered that it was in the plan for 2027, but it would not be a full reconstruction.

Mayor Roberts said that there was still a lot of uncertainty with 32, and it was getting pushed further. City Engineer Goodman answered that they were hoping to hear information in November, but with the government shutdown, he did not know.

7. Utility Connection Fee Review – Ellie Larkin/Mark Statz

Mayor Roberts reordered the agenda to consider Item 8 before Item 7.

8. Budget Review

a) Franchise Fees Review – Mark Statz

City Administrator Statz said that they receive \$0 in local government aid. He stated one revenue source for the City would be franchise fees, such as line items on the sewer and gas bills. He stated it was a tax by a different name, but it diversified where the revenue came from. He stated that the franchise fees were a nice way of making sure it is used for items that most people support. He noted that the franchise fees had not been increased since 2013. He stated that if they did not raise franchise fees, they would need to cut a small percentage from the budget. He suggested catching up with the franchise fees in terms of inflation. He asked if they wanted to increase the franchise fees to lower the levy or utilize the funds for roads.

Finance Director Larkin said that these could be additional ways to lessen the tax burden. They could take a large percentage out of the levy but subsidize it elsewhere.

Mayor Roberts asked about where comparable cities were in franchise fees. City Administrator Statz noted that this would be in line with what other cities are doing.

Councilmember Erickson expressed a preference to let all groups pay a portion of the taxes.

Mayor Roberts discussed the need to guarantee that these dollars were used only for the roads. He said that residents were able to send emails if they had any questions.

b) 2026 Budget Direction and Priorities - Ellie Larkin/Mark Statz

City Administrator Statz stated that there were a couple of items that were a part of the budget but were not a part of the expenses. He stated that the City Council had a goal to keep the levy under ten percent. He discussed the police funding increase, and they thought there would be a decrease in State funding. They heard that the legislature was going to be cutting some of the funds, but now they are confident that the State funding would be an adequate amount, and they can budget for that revenue and add \$100,000. He discussed that they suggested cutting staffing positions, such as the additional sergeant position. He commented that with the makeup of the department, the Police Department could handle the staffing change. He discussed the delays in staffing and onboarding. He stated that some staff positions might not be filled by January 1st.

Councilmember Erickson asked where they pushed the money saved from open positions last year. City Administrator Statz answered that they put that money in the Capital Fund.

Councilmember Erickson asked about the necessity of the two patrol officers. He asked about the reason for being a deputy chief. City Administrator Statz said that the fire department had a paid chief and part-time staff. He stated that they did not have any other full-time employees for the Fire Department. He said that the fire department was affordable, and this position would add costs. He stated that twenty percent of the budget was funded by Columbus. He stated that the fully loaded cost included gear, salary, and benefits.

Mayor Roberts said the chief requested this position and declined a separate position last year. He noted that Chief Newman currently works seventy to eighty hours a week.

Councilmember Larson said the Fire Chief gave them pages of items he is responsible for, but he has difficulty accomplishing all the tasks. He discussed the need to train an individual for a succession plan.

City Administrator Statz said that the call volume had ballooned. There are many more mental health calls than in previous years. He discussed the additional challenges and the need for two additional patrol officers. He stated that three of the positions would be boots-on-the-ground. He discussed that they received over a hundred responses on the budget survey, and public safety was at the top of the list for desired spending.

Mayor Roberts said that they were at 9.25 percent, but they could still come down. He stated

that the City was more than willing to listen, and they were struggling as much as everyone else when considering construction, police, and public safety. He expressed a desire for feedback.

Assistant City Administrator Chaika said that the Truth and Taxation meeting was on December 8th, where residents could come and talk with the City Council about their taxes.

City Administrator Statz said that there were multiple capital improvement plans. He stated the capital funds lived outside of the general fund levy, so they did not see the immediate impact of the expenditure. He discussed the need to put a regular amount into the capital funds each year so they can ride the wave of projects. He stated that the rollback would be to take a list of street projects and look at a nine-year plan in ten years, so they can put less into the capital funds each year.

Councilmember Erickson discussed that moving the project outside of the ten-year project window would help with the savings over ten years. City Administrator Statz confirmed this information, and he said they could do it at different scales.

Councilmember Erickson said he would love to hear about spreading out projects. He said that the current roads and projects were a result of cutting the budget. He stated that he welcomed more feedback.

Mayor Roberts discussed pushing out the project and the potential project cost increase. He stated that all feedback was great.

Councilmember Valento said that years ago, when they cut off the budget, they laid off two people in the Community Development Department, but one person was expected to continue the work. She said that they are still recovering from this and noted it was difficult to get staff into Forest Lake and stay working for the City. She wanted to hire great employees with high morale to retain staff to benefit residents.

7. Utility Connection Fee Review – Ellie Larkin/Mark Statz

City Administrator Statz provided an outline of the system for the water connection fees. He said that the fee was similar to buying a piece of the well or the water tower. He stated that they collect the fees and use them for upgrades to the system. Maintenance for the system comes from user charges. The fees can be used to pay down debt. He stated that the utility connection fee was competitive with other towns in the area, but they need to dive deeper into the calculation. He stated that they would do work to double-check that the fee is still adequate. They did not want the cost of development to be paid by existing tax users. He stated that they did not want a price so high that developers could not build in Forest Lake. He said that they would come back to the City Council with more concrete numbers.

Motion: Mayor Roberts made a Motion to Approve the Consent Agenda Items 7.a. through 7.b. and 7.d. Motion seconded by Councilmember Erickson. Motion carried 5-0.

7.c. Proposal for Topographic Survey – Future Public Works Facility Site

City Administrator Statz stated that they had a public inquiry about the item. He noted that the City decided to move forward with schematic design for a future public works facility site. He said that they would need to complete a topographic survey for the location. He commented that Bolten and Menk put together a proposal for a topographic survey, which was not included in the architectural scope of services.

Mayor Roberts requested that the items related to the future public works facility site be on the regular agenda moving forward. He asked if they could do a request for proposal. City Administrator Statz said that they could do a request for proposal. He noted that it is beneficial for the designer and the surveyor to be the same.

Mayor Roberts asked if they could use any previous work when they swapped land with the County. City Engineer Goodman answered that some title commitments were related, and they did not complete a topographic survey.

City Attorney Johnson asked if they did title commitments when they did the land swap with the County. Community Development Director Wittman answered that she was not sure.

City Attorney Johnson said that an updated title commitment was cheaper than getting a new one, so she could check with the information.

City Administrator Statz stated that Bolten and Menk was not to exceed the proposed cost.

Motion: Councilmember Erickson made a Motion to Approve Item 7.c., Proposal for Topographic Survey - Future Public Works Facility Site.

Motion seconded by Councilmember Miller. Motion carried 5-0.

8. Regular Agenda (Action Items)

a) Amberly Woods – Preliminary Plat & PUD – Abbi Wittman

Community Development Director Wittman provided an overview of the property and the planned unit development and preliminary plat. She reviewed the street and lot layout. She summarized the land use analysis. She explained the bulk standards for the planned unit development and noted that they were proposing 25 fifty-five-foot lots. She noted that they had a public benefit of meeting the minimum comprehensive plan requirements and the land acquisition for the City. She reviewed the streets and roads, tree removal, and planned unit development criteria.

Councilmember Erickson asked about the easements. He asked if there would be an easement on the parkland as part of the titling. Community Development Director Wittman answered that they needed an underground right-of-way for the future utilities, and they will be recorded with the deed.

Councilmember Erickson asked about the plan for covering the cost of the infrastructure. Community Development Director Wittman answered that the landowners were aware, but it was still to be determined. She noted that it was a critical infrastructure right-of-way.

Councilmember Miller stated that the project came to the Planning Commission. He said that this was a perfect area to install a natural park with the wetlands and resources.

Mayor Roberts asked about the funding. Community Development Director Wittman answers that they were looking for parkland for the four nearby properties. They wanted to have passive natural resources and have more active recreation to the south to service the neighborhood.

Motion: Councilmember Miller made a Motion to Adopt Resolution 10-27-25-01 approving the Amberly Woods preliminary plat and planned unit development with the five conditions of approval. Motion seconded by Councilmember Valento. Motion carried 5-0.

Councilmember Larson commented that the Planning Commission was very strongly opposed to the fifty-five-foot lot limits. He noted the difficulties with meeting the Metropolitan Council requirements.

Mayor Roberts said that they were guided by density by the Metropolitan Council. He said it was good that the Planning Commission brought it to their attention. He mentioned affordable housing.

b) Proposal for Engineering Services: 2026 Local Road Project – Ryan Goodman

City Engineer Goodman reviewed the proposal for the 2026 local road project and the secondary approval with the plans and scope of the project. He explained that Hayward Avenue North was added to the 2026 project after being removed from the 2025 project due to time constraints. He reviewed the funding for the projects and the anticipated schedule.

Mayor Roberts asked about the ability to do more south and east of the high school. He said that the budget would not change.

City Administrator Statz said that the road projects come from the capital fund, so they do not budget for a particular project. They have an annual amount that goes into the capital fund, and what comes out varies each year. He explained that there were options to add or subtract projects each year based on how bids come in.

Councilmember Erickson asked how many miles of roads were represented. City Engineer

Goodman answered that he did not have the information. He cautioned them about the work on Eureka Avenue. He encouraged being flexible to see where bids come in, so they know where the bids are on this project and the work on Eureka Avenue.

Mayor Roberts said it would be better to hold off until they had more information.

City Administrator Statz said that City Engineer Goodman would refine his information as much as possible.

City Engineer Goodman said that they could add information up to 25 percent at the time of the bid. He said it was a good project, but depending on other factors, they could make better decisions.

<u>Motion:</u> Councilmember Erickson made a <u>Motion to Approve</u> the proposal for Engineering Services: 2026 Local Road Projects as proposed tonight.

Motion seconded by Councilmember Larson. Motion carried 5-0.

c) Adoption of Classification and Compensation Implementation Plan - Mark Statz

City Administrator Statz summarized the results of the Classification and Compensation Study that was discussed at the October 20, 2025, workshop. He discussed the options for implementation and noted that he proposed keeping employees at the same step, and step increases would be honored at the start of the year. He commented that the 2026 budget would get employees to the market rate salary, which would be fair for employees. He commented that implementing the compensation plan would help attract new employees, especially for public safety.

Councilmember Erickson noted the study proposed moving from five steps to six steps. He asked for clarification on the suggestion from City Administrator Statz to retain employees at their current step. City Administrator Statz explained his recommendation noting that it allowed for tenured employees to maintain the higher step that they had earned through years of service.

City Administrator Statz stated that many of the City's current pay rates are not that far off from the market which allows the Council to consider taking a more aggressive approach by moving everyone to the same step in the study's recommended wage scale. He thought they had constructed a budget to make all of the changes at one time.

Mayor Roberts said that many recently posted positions were not quite at market, and they struggled to previously fill open positions, so this will help Forest Lake attract and retain professional employees.

<u>Motion:</u> Councilmember Erickson made a <u>Motion to Adopt</u> the 2026 Wage Scale and position grading as presented in the Final Classification and Compensation Study, along with the guiding principles for

d) Cannabis Registration Ordinance Amendment – Jolleen Chaika

Mayor Roberts excused himself from the room.

Acting Mayor Valento introduced the topic.

Assistant City Administrator Chaika reviewed the previous discussion for staff to prepare an amendment to Chapter 117 of the City Code related to Adult Use Cannabis registration. She advised that should the City adopt a cap, the County would not enforce the cap should registration of cannabis and low-potency hemp edible retailers be delegated to the County. She also advised that the proposed ordinance was in line with Council's direction and would limit registrations to the statutory minimum plus one within the City. She reviewed the registration requirements for Low-Potency Hemp Edible retailers.

Councilmember Erickson thanked staff for looking at the information.

<u>Motion:</u> Councilmember Larson made a <u>Motion to Approve</u> Ordinance 759, An Ordinance Amending Forest Lake City Code Title XI, Chapter 117, Sections 117.01 and 117.02, Registration of Cannabis Businesses, to Include Lower-Potency Hemp Edible Retailers in Retail Registrations. Motion seconded by Councilmember Erickson. <u>Motion carried 4-0.</u>

AGENDA ITEM: Forest Hills Preserve – Development Agreement Amendment

INTRODUCTION:

As part of the Development Agreement with J. Johnson Development for Forest Hills Preserve, the bituminous wear course/final lift was to be installed after 70% of the homes were constructed but no later than September 1st of this year. As of September 1st of this year, 70% of the homes were not completed. As such, City staff has worked with the developer on an amendment which would allow the developer to install the wear course on or before September 30, 2026. A copy of the Development Agreement Amendment is enclosed for City Council review and approval.

ANALYSIS:

Bituminous wear course is the top/final layer of asphalt. The City requires this portion of the roadway to wait until most of a site and its homes have been developed. This is to help ensure construction traffic wear/tear does not occur on the finished roadway. Though the Development Agreement indicates the wear course be installed by this year, the site's development and the homes in it have not reached 70%. Therefore, staff would not recommend the wear course be installed this year but, instead, be installed next year to help ensure the longevity of this public infrastructure.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the City Council approve the Second Amendment to the Development Contract with J. Johnson Development by approving the Consent Agenda.

1. Exhibit C to the Development Agreement is hereby amended as follows:

Completion Date for the final wear course of City streets shall be on or before September 30, 2026.

- 2. Except as provided for above, the terms and provisions of the Development Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- 3. This Second Amendment and all disputes or controversies arising out of or relating to this Second Amendment or the transactions contemplated hereby shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the internal laws of the State of Minnesota, without regard to the laws of any other jurisdiction that might be applied because of the conflicts of laws principles of the State of Minnesota.
- 4. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed a waiver by the City of any governmental immunity defenses, statutory or otherwise, or of the maximum liability limits provided by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 466.
- 5. This Second Amendment may be executed in two or more counterparts, all of which shall be considered one and the same instrument and shall become effective when one or more counterparts have been signed by the parties and delivered to the other parties.
- 6. This Second Amendment shall not be amended, modified or supplemented, except by a written instrument signed by an authorized representative of each party.

AGENDA ITEM: Declaration of Amendment & Restatement of Flexible Benefit Plan

BACKGROUND:

With the recent passage of federal budget reconciliation legislation (H.R. 1), the annual contribution limit for Dependent Care Flexible Spending Accounts (DCFSAs) will increase effective January 1, 2026. This adjustment applies to both calendar and non-calendar year plans and represents the first major increase in several years.

Under the new limits, participants may contribute up to:

- \$7,500 per year (single or married filing jointly)
- \$3,750 per year (married filing separately)

As has been past practice, Benefit Extras, Inc., the City's flexible spending account administrator, will automatically adjust all dependent care FSAs to the new maximum amounts effective January 1, 2026.

ANALYSIS:

To comply with the updated federal limits, the City must formally adopt an amendment and restatement of its Flexible Benefit Plan prior to the effective date. Benefit Extras has provided updated plan documents, including:

- Flex Plan Amendment (attached) authorizing the updated dependent care maximum.
- Flexible Benefit Plan Master Document to be executed and retained on file.
- Summary Description (SD) and Plan Information Appendix outlining the provisions specific to the City's plan.
- Flex Highlights Sheet summarizing updated healthcare and dependent care limits.

Execution of the amendment will bring the City's plan into compliance with the new federal limits effective January 1, 2026. The plan documents are available for review in my office if interested.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Staff recommends that the City Council authorize execution of the attached amendment to the City's Flexible Benefit Plan to reflect the increased dependent care FSA contribution limits effective January 1, 2026.

Beginning January 1, 2026, the maximum reimbursement shall be \$7,500 for single individuals and married couples filing jointly (\$3,750 in the case of a Participant who is a married individual filing a separate tax return). The Amended and Restated Plan, except as otherwise expressly provided for in the attached instrument, shall be effective as of January 1, 2026.

INTRODUCTION:

To fill previously vacated patrol positions, the City of Forest Lake Police Department was accepting rolling applications for the position of Police Officer.

ANALYSIS:

On September 25, 2025, staff conducted interviews to fill one of the police officer vacancies Following a successful interview and a thorough review of application materials, Police Chief Peterson made a conditional offer of employment to Hannah Belka, contingent upon successful completion of a background investigation, medical examination, and psychological examination; then, further contingent upon Council approval. Ms. Belka has successfully completed all examinations and has received recommendations from past and current employers.

Ms. Belka is a Hamline University and Hennepin Technical college graduate with approximately 4 years of experience as a Community Service Officer with Columbia Heights PD and Blaine PD.

The conditional offer proposes appointment at Step 1 of the LELS #111 wage schedule. The offer also includes a starting bank of 20 hours of vacation and 20 hours of sick leave.

AGENDA ITEM: Gambling Permit Application

INTRODUCTION:

Non-profit organizations must obtain City approval to obtain an exempt or excluded gambling permit for bingo or raffle events. The Knights of Columbus #7750 (Lindstrom) has applied to conduct a raffle on April 17, 2026 at the American Legion and the Forest Lake Fire Relief Association has applied to conduct a raffle on April 5, 2026 at the American Legion.

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. 349.166, organizations are eligible to obtain an excluded or exempt permit to conduct bingo or a raffle without obtaining a full gambling license and without abiding by all provisions required by licensed organizations if:

Exempt Gambling Permit (LG220):

- The organization conducts lawful gambling on five or less days per year;
- The organization does not award more than \$50,000 in prizes for lawful gambling in a calendar year;
- The organization submits a board-prescribed application and pays a fee of \$100 to the board for each gambling occasion, and receives an exempt permit number from the board...The application must include the date and location of the occasion and the types of lawful gambling to be conducted;
- The organization notifies the local government unit 30 days before the lawful gambling occasion;
- The organization purchases all gambling equipment and supplies from a licensed distributor; and.
- The organization reports to the board, on a single-page form prescribed by the board, within 30 days of each gambling occasion, the gross receipts, prizes, expenses, expenditures of net profits from the occasion, and the identification of the licensed distributor from whom all gambling equipment was purchased.

Additionally, City Ordinance, Section 116.10 requires that any organization applying for any lawful gambling permit under Minn. Stat. 349.166 must obtain a local (city) permit specific to the dates. No background check is required for exempt or excluded gambling permit approval.

The Knights of Columbus and the FLFD Relief Association meet state and local requirements for local approval of the submitted exempt applications.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends Council move to approve the LG220 applications for Knights of Columbus and the FLFD Relief Association and authorize the Assistant City Administrator/Clerk to sign applications for remittance to the Minnesota Gambling Control Board.

INTRODUCTION:

INTRODUCTION:

The Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) Office of Aeronautics has awarded the City of Forest Lake an Airport Maintenance and Operations (M&O) Grant for State Fiscal Years 2026 and 2027. The purpose of this agreement is to provide financial assistance to the City for ongoing maintenance and operational costs associated with the Forest Lake Airport.

The grant is authorized under Minnesota Statutes §§ 360.015 and 360.305, which allow the State to provide funding to airports for maintenance and operations activities that support safe and effective public use of aviation facilities.

ANALYSIS:

Under MnDOT Agreement No. 1060314, the State will reimburse the City for 75% of eligible maintenance and operations expenses, up to a maximum of \$18,609.14 per fiscal year, for a combined total of \$37,218.27 over the two-year period.

Eligible costs include:

- Routine maintenance such as mowing, plowing, and surface upkeep of runways, taxiways, and lighting areas.
- Operational costs necessary to ensure the airport remains safe and serviceable for aeronautical use.
- Expenses approved under the State's Funding Eligibility Guidance for airport maintenance and operations.

The City is responsible for submitting quarterly reimbursement requests to MnDOT following the established schedule:

- Quarter 1: July–September (due November 15)
- Quarter 2: October–December (due February 15)
- Quarter 3: January–March (due May 15)
- Quarter 4: April–June (due August 15)

The City's designated authorized representative for this agreement is the Finance and Administration department. The State's authorized representative is Jenny Bahneman, Grants Specialist Coordinator with MnDOT's Office of Aeronautics.

The agreement requires that the airport be maintained in a safe, serviceable condition for aeronautical purposes for at least one year following final reimbursement. It also requires compliance with all

applicable state and federal laws, audit provisions, and data practices requirements. The agreement expires June 30, 2027.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

This grant provides partial reimbursement for the City's operational and maintenance costs related to the Forest Lake Airport, effectively reducing the City's share of eligible expenditures to 25% of total costs. No local match beyond this share is required.

The total annual MnDOT reimbursement will be \$18,609.14, resulting in total potential funding of \$37,218.27 over the two-year term.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the MnDOT State Grant Agreement No. 1060314 for Airport Maintenance and Operations (MO26–MO27) and authorize the City Administrator and Mayor to execute the agreement on behalf of the City of Forest Lake.

STATE OF MINNESOTA STATE AIRPORTS FUND AIRPORT MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS GRANT AGREEMENT

This Agreement is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Commissioner of Transportation ("State") and City of Forest Lake, City of Forest Lake, 1408 Lake Street South, Forest Lake, MN 55025 acting through its City Council ("Grantee") ("Agreement").

RECITALS

- 1. Minnesota Statutes §§360.015 and 360.305 authorize the State to provide financial assistance to airports for maintenance and operations activities.
- 2. Grantee owns, operates, or controls an airport ("Airport") in the state system, and desires financial assistance from the State for maintenance and operations activities for State Fiscal Year 2026 and State Fiscal Year 2027.
- 3. Grantee represents that it is duly qualified and agrees to perform all services described in this Agreement to the satisfaction of the State.

AGREEMENT TERMS

1. Term of Agreement and Survival of Terms

- 1.1. **Effective Date**. This Agreement will be effective on the date the State obtains all required signatures under Minnesota Statutes §16B.98, subdivision 5, whichever is later. As required by Minnesota Statutes §16B.98 Subd. 7, no payments will be made to Grantee until this Agreement is fully executed.
- 1.2. **Expiration Date**. This Agreement will expire on June 30, 2027.
- 1.3. **Survival of Terms**. All clauses which impose obligations continuing in their nature and which must survive in order to give effect to their meaning will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including, but not limited to, the following clauses: Indemnification; State Audits; Government Data Practices; Governing Law, Jurisdiction and Venue; and Data Disclosure.

2. Grantee's Duties

- 2.1. **Airport Use.** In accordance with Minnesota Statutes §360.305, subd. 4, Grantee must operate and maintain the Airport, for the use and benefit of the public, in a safe, serviceable manner for aeronautical purposes only for a period of one (1) year from the date Grantee receives final reimbursement under this Agreement.
- 2.2. **Grounds Maintenance.** Grantee will keep the runway and the area around the lights at the Airport mowed and plowed. The grass must be mowed at least seven (7) feet beyond the lights and must not exceed six (6) inches in height on the landing area. The areas around any navigational aids must be sufficiently mowed and plowed to keep the area clear for vehicle access. If the Airport remains operational during the winter months, Grantee will keep at least one runway, associated taxiway, and apron area cleared of snow and ice to the same priority as arterial roads. Snowbanks must be limited in height so that aircraft wings, engines, and propellers will clear them. Landing strip markers and/or lights must remain visible.

- 2.3. **Periodic Paint Striping.** If the State contracts for the periodic paint striping of the Airport's runways and taxiways during the term of this Agreement, Grantee will cooperate with the marking operation. Grantee must coordinate seal coat pavement maintenance projects with the State to maximize the pavement marking life.
- 2.4. **Inspections.** Grantee will allow a representative of the State's Office of Aeronautics access to any area of the Airport necessary for the purpose of periodic inspections.
- 2.5. **Third-Party Contracting.** Grantee will comply with all applicable local, state, or federal laws, regulations, policies and procedures in the procurement of goods and services funded in whole or in part under this Agreement.

3. Grantee's Assurances

- 3.1. Grantee represents and warrants that Grantee has established a zoning authority for the Airport, and such authority has completed, or is in the process of and will complete, with due diligence, an airport zoning ordinance in accordance with Minnesota Statutes \$\$360.061 to 360.074.
- 3.2. Grantee will comply with all required grants management policies and procedures set forth in Minnesota Statutes §16B.97 subd. 4(a)(1).

4. Consideration and Payment

- 4.1. **Consideration.** State will pay for all eligible maintenance and operations costs incurred by Grantee under this Agreement as follows:
 - 4.1.1. **Basis.** Grantee will be reimbursed for 75% of all eligible maintenance and operations costs not reimbursed by any other source. Eligible maintenance and operations costs will be determined at the sole discretion of State's Authorized Representative or their designee according to the State's Funding Eligibility Guidance, which is available at: https://www.dot.state.mn.us/aero/airportdevelopment/fundingandgrants.html
 - 4.1.2. **Fiscal Year Obligations.** State has currently obligated \$18,609.14 in each state fiscal year to reimburse 75% of eligible costs incurred by Grantee during each fiscal year and will be capped at this amount for each fiscal year. Any funding granted but not requested for reimbursement within the first fiscal year will not roll over into the second fiscal year.
 - 4.1.3. **Total Obligation.** The State's total obligation for all compensation and reimbursements to Grantee under this Agreement will not exceed \$37,218.27 (reflecting state fiscal years 2026 and 2027 combined obligations).

4.2. Payment.

- 4.2.1. **Invoices.** Grantee must submit detailed reimbursement requests for its eligible costs to the State's Authorized Representative on a quarterly basis or as otherwise directed by State's Authorized Representative. Invoices for expenses incurred after grant funds were encumbered by the State, but before the Effective Date of this Agreement, may not be submitted for reimbursement until after the Effective Date of this Agreement. The State's Office of Aeronautics will supply the reimbursement request forms that Grantee must submit. Reimbursement requests must be submitted according to the following schedule:
 - Quarter 1 (Jul. 1st Sept. 30th): On or after October 1, and no later than November 15;
 - Quarter 2 (Oct. 1st Dec. 31st): On or after January 1, and no later than February 15;
 - Quarter 3 (Jan. 1st Mar. 31st): On or after April 1, and no later than May 15; and
 - Quarter 4 (Apr. 1st Jun. 30th): On or after July 1, and no later than August 15.

The State may reject any costs submitted for reimbursement that the State determines, in its sole discretion, are not eligible maintenance and operations expenses. Any invoices not received by the State's Authorized Representative by December 31st of the fiscal year in which the expenses were incurred will be ineligible for reimbursement and rejected.

- 4.2.2. All Invoices Subject to Audit. All invoices are subject to audit, at the State's discretion.
- 4.2.3. **Progress Reports.** The State may, at its sole discretion, require Grantee to submit quarterly progress reports in addition to its invoices. If so requested, the State will provide a progress report form for Grantee's completion and submittal with its invoices.
- 4.2.4. The State's Payment Requirements. The State will promptly pay all valid obligations under this Agreement as required by Minnesota Statutes §16A.124. The State will make undisputed payments no later than thirty (30) days after receiving Grantee's invoices and progress reports, if requested by the State, for services performed. If an invoice is incorrect, defective or otherwise improper, the State will notify Grantee within ten (10) days of discovering the error. After the State receives the corrected invoice, State will pay Grantee within thirty (30) days of receipt of such invoice.
- 4.2.5. **Grant Monitoring Visit and Financial Reconciliation.** If the State's total obligation is greater than \$50,000.00, the State will conduct at least one monitoring visit and financial reconciliation of Grantee's expenditures. If the State's total obligation is greater than \$250,000.00, the State will conduct annual monitoring visits and financial reconciliations of Grantee's expenditures. The State's Authorized Representative will notify Grantee's Authorized Representative where and when monitoring visits and financial reconciliations will take place, which state employees and Grantee staff members should be present, as well as which, if any, of Grantee's contractors or consultants, or their agents, are required to participate. Grantee will be provided at least seven (7) days' notice prior to monitoring visits and/or financial reconciliations. Following a monitoring visit or financial reconciliation, Grantee will take timely and appropriate action on all deficiencies identified by the State. At least one monitoring visit and one financial reconciliation must be completed prior to final payment being made to Grantee.
- 4.2.6. **Closeout.** The State will determine, at its sole discretion, whether a closeout audit is required prior to final payment approval. If a closeout audit is required, final payment will be held until the audit has been completed. Monitoring of any capital assets acquired with grant funds will continue following grant closeout.
- 5. Conditions of Payment. All services provided by Grantee under this Agreement must be performed to the State's satisfaction, as determined at the sole discretion of State's Authorized Representative and in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, including business registration requirements of the Office of the Secretary of State. Grantee will not receive payment for work found by the State to be unsatisfactory or performed in violation of federal, state or local law. In the event the Airport fails to pass any periodic inspection conducted by a representative of the State's Office of Aeronautics, Grantee will not receive payment under this Agreement until all deficiencies identified by any such inspection have been rectified to the Office of Aeronautics' satisfaction.

If Grantee's Authorized Representative changes at any time during this Agreement, Grantee must immediately notify State.

7. Assignment; Amendments; Waiver; Agreement Complete; Electronic Records; Certification

- 7.1. **Assignment.** Grantee may neither assign nor transfer any rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior consent of the State and a fully executed Assignment Agreement, executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved this Agreement, or their successors in office.
- 7.2. **Amendments.** An amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original agreement, or their successors in office.
- 7.3. **Waiver.** If the State fails to enforce any provision of this Agreement, such failure does not waive the provision or the State's right to subsequently enforce it.
- 7.4. **Agreement Complete.** This Agreement contains all prior negotiations and agreements between the State and Grantee. No other prior understanding regarding this Agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.
- 7.5. **Electronic Records and Signatures.** The parties agree to contract by electronic means. This includes using electronic signatures and converting original documents to electronic records.
- 7.6. **Certification.** By signing this Agreement, Grantee certifies that it is not suspended or debarred from receiving federal or state awards.
- 8. **Liability and Indemnification.** Each party is responsible for its own acts, omissions, and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law. Minnesota Statutes § 3.736 and other applicable law govern liability of the State. Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466 and other applicable law govern liability of Grantee. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Grantee will indemnify, hold harmless, and defend (to the extent permitted by the Minnesota Attorney General) the State against any claims, causes of actions, damages, costs, and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising in connection with the services performed under this Agreement, asserted by, or resulting from the acts or omissions of Grantee's contractors, consultants, agents or any other third parties under the direct control of Grantee.
- 9. **State Audits.** Under Minnesota Statutes § 16B.98 subd. 8, the books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices of Grantee, or those of any other party relevant to this grant Agreement, or transactions resulting from this Agreement, are subject to examination by the State and/or the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six (6) years from the expiration of this Agreement or receipt and approval of all final reports, whichever is later. Grantee will take timely and appropriate action on all deficiencies identified by an audit.
- 10. Government Data Practices. Grantee and the State must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minnesota Statutes Chapter 13, as it applies to all data provided by the State under this Agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained or disseminated by Grantee under this Agreement. The civil remedies of Minnesota Statutes §13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either Grantee or the State. If Grantee receives a request to release the data referred to herein, Grantee must immediately notify the State and consult with the State as to how Grantee should respond to the request. Grantee's response to the request must comply with applicable law.
- 11. **Workers' Compensation.** Grantee certifies that it is in compliance with Minnesota Statutes §176.181, subd. 2, pertaining to workers' compensation insurance coverage. Grantee's employees and agents will not be considered state employees. Any claims that may arise under the Minnesota Workers' Compensation Act on behalf of Grantee's employees, as well as any claims made by any third party as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of Grantee's employees are in no way the State's obligation or responsibility.

- 12. **Governing Law, Jurisdiction and Venue.** Minnesota law, without regard to its choice-of-law provisions, governs this Agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings arising out of this Agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.
- 13. **Data Disclosure.** Under Minnesota Statutes §270C.65, and other applicable law, Grantee consents to disclosure of its social security number, federal employer tax identification number and Minnesota tax identification number, already provided to the State, to federal and state agencies and state personnel involved in the payment of state obligations. These identification numbers may be used in the enforcement of federal and state laws which could result in action requiring Grantee to file state tax returns and pay delinquent state tax liabilities, if any, or pay other state liabilities.

14. Termination and Suspension

- 14.1. **Termination by the State.** The State or Commissioner of Administration may unilaterally terminate this Agreement at any time, with or without cause, upon written notice to Grantee. Upon termination, Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed.
- 14.2. **Termination for Cause.** The State may immediately terminate this Agreement if the State finds that there has been a failure to comply with the provisions of this Agreement, that reasonable progress has not been made, that fraudulent or wasteful activity has occurred, that Grantee has been convicted of a criminal offense relating to a state grant agreement, or that the purposes for which the funds were granted have not been or will not be fulfilled. The State may take action to protect the interests of the State of Minnesota, including the refusal to disburse additional funds and requiring the return of all or part of the funds already disbursed.
- 14.3. **Termination for Insufficient Funding.** The State may immediately terminate this Agreement if it does not obtain funding from the Minnesota Legislature or if funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to pay for the services contracted for under this Agreement. Termination must be by written or fax notice to Grantee. The State is not obligated to pay for any services that are performed after notice and effective date of termination. However, Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed to the extent that funds are available. The State will not be assessed any penalty if the Agreement is terminated because of the decision of the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source, not to appropriate funds. The State will provide Grantee notice of the lack of funding within a reasonable time of the State's receiving that notice.
- 14.4. **Suspension.** The State may immediately suspend this Agreement in the event of a total or partial government shutdown due to its failure to pass an approved budget by the legal deadline. Work performed by Grantee during a period of suspension will be deemed unauthorized and undertaken at risk of non-payment.
- 15. **Fund Use Prohibited.** Grantee will not utilize any funds received pursuant to this Agreement to compensate, either directly or indirectly, any contractor, corporation, partnership, or business, however organized, which is disqualified or debarred from entering into or receiving a state contract. This restriction applies regardless of whether the disqualified or debarred party acts in the capacity of a general contractor, a subcontractor, or as an equipment or material supplier. This restriction does not prevent Grantee from utilizing these funds to pay any party who might be disqualified or debarred after Grantee has been awarded funds for the Project. For a list of disqualified or debarred vendors, see www.mmd.admin.state.mn.us/debarredreport.asp.
- 16. **Discrimination Prohibited by Minnesota Statutes §181.59**. Grantee will comply with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes §181.59 which requires that every agreement for or on behalf of the State, or any county, city, town, township, school, school district or any other district in the State, for materials, supplies or construction will contain provisions by which Grantee agrees that:
 - 16.1. In the hiring of common or skilled labor for the performance of any work under any agreement, or any sub-agreement, no contractor, material supplier, vendor, or other agent of Grantee will, by reason of race, creed or color, discriminate against the person or persons who are citizens of the United States or resident aliens who are qualified and available to perform the work to which the employment relates;

- 16.2. No contractor, material supplier, vendor, or other agent of Grantee will, in any manner, discriminate against, or intimidate, or prevent the employment of any person or persons identified herein, or on being hired, prevent or conspire to prevent, the person or persons from the performance of work under any agreement on account of race, creed or color:
- 16.3. A violation of this Section is a misdemeanor; and
- 16.4. Any subsequent violations of this Section may result in the termination of this Agreement and any subagreements by the State, or any county, city, town, township, school, school district or other entity or person authorized to enter into agreements for employment, and all money due, or to become due, under this Agreement or any sub-agreements may be forfeited.
- 17. Limitation. Under this Agreement, the State is only responsible for disbursing funds. Nothing in this Agreement will be construed to make the State a principal, co-principal, partner, or joint venturer with respect to the Project(s) covered herein. The State may provide technical advice and assistance as requested by Grantee; however, Grantee will remain responsible for providing direction to its contractors and consultants and for administering its agreements with such entities. Grantee's consultants and contractors are not intended to be third party beneficiaries of this Agreement.

AGENDA ITEM: Pervious Surface Agreement – 891 19th Street SE

INTRODUCTION:

On February 9, 2009, the City passed a Resolution that permits the use of pervious surfaces to meet the impervious surface limitations established in City Code. City staff are bringing forward an Impervious Surface Agreement to the Council for approval, prior to the landowner executing the Agreement and a building permit being issued.

ANALYSIS:

The property owners at 891 19th Street SE (PID 0903221440029) have proposed a 956 square foot pervious driveway and sidewalk, requesting a 50% credit to exempt 478 square feet from being considered impervious to bring the application in compliance with City Code.

The proposal is as follows, with the non-compliance highlighted for reference:

Code Requirement (For Nonconforming Lots)	30%, but no more than 3,750 square-feet
Without Pervious Surface Agreement	28.4% or 3,871 square-feet
With Pervious Surface Agreement	24.9% or 3,393 square-feet

Part of the Agreement states each site shall be considered on a case-by-case basis and will give no more than 50% credit of the total area covered by the proposed surface in meeting the impervious surface limits. Additionally, the application shall be reviewed for approval by the City Engineer and inspected every 3 years to ensure continued compliance.

The application has been reviewed and approved by the City Engineer and City Planner and meets all Code requirements to receive the credit.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the City Council approve the Pervious Surface Agreement for 891 19th Street SE by approving the Consent Agenda.

891 19th Street SE, Forest Lake, Minnesota 55	5025 ("Owners").	

RECITALS:

The Brannan Family Trust are the owners of the following described real property (the "Lot") situated in the County of Washington and State of Minnesota, to-wit:

Lots 6 and 7, Block 1, Forest Park Addition to the Village of Forest Lake.

The Lot is located in the Single Family (SF) Residential and Shoreland Overlay zoning districts.

The Lot has an area of 13,616 square feet above the ordinary high water line ("OHWL").

The Owners wish to replace an existing residential structure on the Lot with a new home.

The Lot currently has impervious surface coverage of 964 square feet, equal to 7.08% of the lot area above the OHWL.

Pursuant to the City Code of the City, allowable impervious surface in the area where the property is located is 30% of the surface area, or 3,750 square feet.

In connection with the construction of the new home on the Lot, the Owners propose to reduce the impervious surface to allowable limits by constructing a pervious driveway and sidewalk.

By Resolution Number 02-09-09, the City adopted an Interim Pervious Surface Policy which provides, *inter alia*, that the City shall give no more than a 50% credit of the total area covered by an artificial pervious surface in meeting the total impervious surface limitation on a specific single family residential lot in the Shoreland Overlay District.

The plan for the new construction proposes a pervious surface driveway and sidewalk covering 956 square feet in area as identified on the design summary prepared by the Owners' engineer. The square footage applied by reducing the impervious surface of the Lot by constructing the pervious driveway and sidewalk is 478 square feet.

The pervious driveway and sidewalk credit of 478 square feet together with the remaining impervious surface resulting from the new construction on the Lot is proposed to total 3,393 square feet or 24.9% of the area of the Lot above the OHWL.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the above recitals, which are hereby incorporated herein as if fully set forth below, and of the mutual covenants and obligations contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The City hereby grants to the Owners a pervious surface credit against the allowable impervious surface of 50% of the pervious driveway and sidewalk of 956 square feet in the amount of 478 square feet.
- 2. With the credit for the pervious driveway and sidewalk, the overall impervious surface on the lot shall not exceed 30% of the square footage of the lot above the OHWL.
- 3. The construction of the pervious driveway and sidewalk shall be in accordance with the plans presented by the Owners and approved by the City.
- 4. The Owners shall comply with the above-described Interim Pervious Surface Policy of the City, as may be amended, including the obligation to perform proper maintenance and to maintain the function of the pervious driveway and sidewalk surface at the direction of the City.
- 5. The City will perform necessary inspections not less than every three years to ensure the pervious driveway and sidewalk surface's function. If the pervious surface is found not to be functioning properly it shall be repaired or replaced by the Owners as required by the City.

CITY OF FOREST LAKE INTERIM PERVIOUS SURFACE POLICY

WHEREAS, property owners desire to make use of artificial pervious surfaces to meet the limitations established by the City Code; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is in the process of establishing a policy pertaining to the use of artificial pervious surfaces in meeting the impervious surface regulations within shoreland areas of the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, Section 153.345 of the City Code of the City of Forest Lake limits the amount of impervious surface, as defined in the Code, that may exist on residential lots in the Shoreland Overlay Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, The City of Forest Lake will work in partnership with the Comfort Lake – Forest Lake Watershed, Rice Creek Watershed, and the DNR when using pervious surface applications to continue to improve lake quality; and

WHEREAS, the City of Forest Lake proposes to address the issue of the use of artificial pervious surfaces on a permanent basis as part of the Shoreland Overlay District requirements of the Zoning Code update following the adoption and implementation of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan update; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for an interim artificial pervious surface use policy;

NOW, THEREFORE, for the purpose of implementing an Interim Pervious Surface Policy, the City Council of the City of Forest Lake hereby adopts the following:

Section 1. Purpose of the Policy.

- A. To permit the use of an artificial pervious surface to address storm-water and lot coverage issues.
- B. To establish interim standards for the use of artificial pervious surfaces in meeting impervious surface limitations.
- C. To protect the interests of the local and regional community and watersheds by establishing interim standards for the use of artificial pervious surfaces.

Section 2. Definitions.

A. Artificial pervious surface is defined as pervious pavers, pervious asphalt or pervious concrete for the purpose of this policy.

Section 3. Approval of other Government Units.

A. Any property owner desiring to use an artificial pervious surface in meeting the impervious surface limitations imposed by the City Code shall obtain any permits required by the regulations of any other applicable agencies.

Section 4. Stormwater Credit and Applicable Standards.

- A. The City shall treat each site on a case by case basis and reserve the right through this policy to grant or deny the use of an artificial pervious surface on a single family lot in the Shoreland Overlay District area.
- B. The City shall give no more than a 50% credit of the total area covered by an artificial pervious surface in meeting the total impervious limitation on a specific single family residential lot in the Shoreland Overlay District area.
- C. All standards stated in Section 4D shall be met or exceeded to receive credit under this policy.
- D. The following standards shall be applied to property in the Shoreland Overlay Zone:
 - 1. No artificial pervious surface shall be used in the Shore Impact Zone or Bluff Impact Zone as defined in §153.345 of the City Code.
 - 2. The artificial pervious surface system shall be reviewed and considered for approval by the City Engineer.
 - 3. Artificial pervious surface systems shall be engineered and constructed using the latest storm-water best management practices related to design, installation and maintenance.

- 4. The base of pervious surface product shall be installed with an infiltration system that maintains no less than a minimum of a 3 foot separation from the seasonally saturated soils, bedrock or water table to ensure soil absorption, contaminate removal and enhanced retention of storm-water.
- 5. The design shall allow for the infiltration of the first inch of any storm-water from the artificial impervious surface on the parcel, and where storm-water retention is a goal, the design shall meet the 2 year 24 hour storm as determined by the City Engineer.
- 6. The installation of an artificial pervious surface shall be monitored by the City Engineer or his appointee to ensure proper implementation.
- 7. The property owners and their successors shall be required to perform proper maintenance and function of the artificial pervious surface at the direction of the City.
- 8. The City will perform necessary inspections every 3 years to ensure the artificial pervious surface's function. If the artificial pervious surface is found not to be functioning properly it shall be repaired or replaced as required by the City.
- 9. A Pervious Surface Agreement shall be prepared by the City Attorney and shall be executed and recorded in the office of the Washington County Recorder prior to the installation of an artificial pervious surface.

Dear Mayor and Council:

The Representatives from Headwaters Land Group, LLC (Hidden Creek Third Addition) have requested a reduction in their financial surety for the site improvements that have been completed to date for the subdivision located west of Fenway Avenue and north of Headwaters Parkway.

Work completed to date on the project includes installation of sanitary sewer, watermain, storm sewer, sanitary sewer & water services, concrete curb and gutter, and base course paving for Phases 1, 2, and 3, as well as the majority of the site grading for all Phases of the development.

Remaining work to be completed includes completion of utility testing, private utilities, pedestrian facilities, completion of site grading, final restoration, wear course paving, punch list items, along with completion of record plans, and related work for Phases 1, 2, and 3 of the development.

The current Letter of Credit is for the amount of \$3,320,000. The estimated value of the remaining site work is \$991,782.44 which includes 125% of the estimated construction of the remaining items as required by the Development Agreement.

We recommend that the City Council consider the request to reduce the financial securities for the improvements to an amount no less than \$991,782.44 for this project. Please contact me if you have any questions regarding this letter of credit reduction request.

INTRODUCTION:

Over many years, the City of Forest Lake has contributed financially to the Clear Lake Association for the treatment of AIS and lake management activities on Clear Lake. This contribution has usually come in the form of individual annual requests from the CLA board for assistance. As you recall, last year the City of Forest Lake and Clear Lake Association entered into an agreement that formalizes the financial participation of each group versus individual requests. Staff and CLA are recommending this same agreement be approved for 2026.

ANALYSIS:

Annually, the City of Forest Lake participates financially for AIS projects on Clear Lake. Financial participation ranges from \$10,000 to \$20,000 annually to help battle AIS and conduct lake management activities such as boat/boat trailer inspections on Clear Lake. This agreement would not really increase or decrease the annual contribution but would provide the City and the CLA a more consistent funding plan and give the CLA an opportunity to better plan for AIS and lake management programs.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommendation is that Forest Lake City Council makes a "Motion to approve Funding Support Agreement For Aquatic Invasive Species And Lake Management Activities On Clear Lake."

2026 FUNDING SUPPORT AGREEMENT for AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES and LAKE MANAGEMENT ACTIVITIES on CLEAR LAKE

THIS FUNDING SUPPORT AGREEMENT is made this <u>23rd</u> of <u>Oct</u>, 2025 by and between the City of Forest Lake ("City"), a Minnesota municipal corporation, and the Clear Lake Association (CLA) a 501c(3) non-profit organization hereafter collectively referred to as "Parties", and individually as "Party."

WHEREAS, the CLA agrees to carry out a program to manage aquatic invasive species ("AIS") within Clear Lake, to prevent the spread of AIS, protect water quality, enhance ecological integrity and diversity, and maintain lake recreational use;

WHEREAS, the CLA conducts AIS program elements including watercraft inspections; performing aquatic vegetation surveys; establishing and carrying out AIS early detection, rapid response, and prevention actions; managing and removing AIS from Clear Lake; and managing common carp to protect native plant communities;

WHEREAS, the City views the CLA's activities as beneficial for the health, safety and welfare of the City, and the City wishes to support the CLA's efforts by contributing funding;

WHEREAS, it is difficult to prepare for unseen challenges to AIS and Lake Management Activities. To help provide an opportunity for faster response and offset possible financial burdens, both parties will create a reserve fund. If a party does not spend its total annual commitment, the remaining balance will be placed in a reserve fund. This reserve fund will be capped at the party's annual contribution;

WHEREAS, the desire to enter into a funding agreement for calendar year 2026 to support the activities of the CLA.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City and CLA enter into this Agreement and hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The CLA will carry out AIS management activities on Clear Lake as necessary, act to prevent the introduction and spread of AIS, conduct activities to protect the water and recreational quality of Clear Lake.
- 2. The City will support the CLA activities by providing funding at the agreed levels.
- 3. CLA will perform AIS management activities as determined by CLA.
- 4. The parties agree to spend, in calendar year 2026, the following amounts on activities described in paragraph 1 through 3:

City: \$20,000 (66.6%) CLA: \$10,000 (33.3%)

up to a combined maximum by both parties of \$30,000. By November 15, 2026, each party will share with the others the documentation for its expenditures. If either party has not met its maximum spending commitment, reimbursement among the parties will occur so that the total expenditure is distributed in accordance with the stated percentages.

- 5. Expenditures that count toward a party's commitment include services and materials purchases, equipment rental, and hired contractor costs. Expenditures covered by grant funds are not counted towards the totals in paragraph 4.
- 6. If a party does not meet its spending commitment in paragraph 4, above, it will establish a reserve in the amount by which its spending, plus the amount it has reimbursed the other parties under paragraph 4, falls short of its commitment. The reserve for each party, as aggregated over successive AIS funding support agreements, will be capped at its respective annual financial commitment or \$30,000 cap, as listed under paragraph 4. At a time of its choosing, the party who contributed the funds to the reserves will spend all or a portion of the reserve for any of the purposes described in this agreement or may choose to use the reserves to offset its annual financial commitment and will inform the other parties when it has done so.
- 7. This agreement is for the purpose of establishing mutual funding commitments for the benefit of Clear Lake. Each party is responsible for the activities it elects to perform, and no party assumes responsibility for the activities of another party.
- 8. The City and CLA are performing the work subject to this agreement in reliance on each other's funding as herein provided. The City and CLA intend that this agreement be legally binding.

AGENDA ITEM: Decertification of TIF Districts (Cherrywood and Centennial)

INTRODUCTION:

The City recently completed the required 2024 TIF reporting forms. It was determined that the Cherrywood and Centennial Pay-as-you-go obligations would be fully repaid during Pay 2025. Based on the current market value, decertification of the Cherrywood TIF district (215) will add an estimated \$203,093 to the City's tax capacity. Decertification of the Centennial district (216) will add an estimated \$14,636 to the tax capacity. The total of \$217,729 in additional tax capacity is effective for the Pay 2026 tax year and may be slightly adjusted based on final Pay 2026 values. The City has been working with our TIF consultants (Ehlers) on how to utilize these funds.

ANALYSIS:

The Centennial district has an outstanding interfund loan with the Capital Improvement Fund for prior administrative expenses. To fully retire the interfund loan, a transfer of an estimated \$37,000 from Fund 215 to Fund 216 will be required. Fund 216 currently has approximately \$11,000 available, and these resources, together, will allow the remaining interfund loan balance to be paid in full.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the attached Resolution 11-10-25-01 Decertification, and transfer of TIF Funds to pay the interfund loan, thus increasing the City's Tax capacity by an estimated \$217,729 for Pay 2026.

WHEREAS, the City of Forest Lake recently completed the required annual TIF Reporting Forms to the Minnesota State Auditor and as of December 31, 2025, all obligations to which tax increment from the TIF Districts have been pledged are anticipated to have been paid in full; and

WHEREAS, the City desires by this resolution to cause the decertification of the TIF Districts effective December 31, 2025, after which all property taxes generated by property within the Districts will be distributed in the same manner as all other property taxes in Payable 2026; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Forest Lake City Council that the City staff take such action as is necessary to cause the County Auditor of Washington County to decertify the Cherrywood Pointe and Centennial Office Building Tax Increment Financing Districts and no longer remit tax increment from the TIF Districts to the City as of December 31, 2025.

AGENDA ITEM: Approve 2025 Fee Schedule, Ordinance No. 762

INTRODUCTION:

At the City Council meeting on December 9, 2024, the Council adopted Ordinance No. 745, which repealed and replaced the City's 2024 Fee Schedule in its entirety. Following implementation, City staff identified several additional corrections and clarifications that were necessary to ensure consistency and accuracy across all departments. These adjustments were subsequently brought forward to the Council and approved through Ordinance No. 748 (February 2025) and Ordinance No. 756 (May 2025).

Since that time, staff have continued to evaluate the City's fees as part of routine review and alignment with current practices, administrative costs, and development activity. Through this process, staff identified the need to establish a new fee for final plan development review, which reflects the staff time and resources required during the final stage of development applications.

As part of this ongoing effort, City staff conducted a comprehensive review of all fees currently charged by the City to ensure they remain consistent with comparable jurisdictions and aligned with the City's adopted policies and procedures. The updated fee schedule, which includes the proposed addition and other minor clarifications, is attached for Council consideration and approval.

BACKGROUND:

Below is a summary of the proposed change to the 2025 fee schedule:

Fees for Development Projects

- Final Plan Development Review \$10,000
 - City Code Section 152.083, Information Required for Final Plat; Final Plans, indicates the City Administrator may authorize a licensed engineer (opposed to the City Engineer) to develop final development plans associated with an approved preliminary plat. In circumstances where the City Engineer is not the developer of the plans, the City still requires the City Engineer to review the plans. Given this, the City needs to accept additional escrow to cover the City's Final Plan development review costs.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of the 2025 fee schedule, Ordinance No. 762, An Ordinance Amending City Code Chapter 35, Fees and Service Charges.

Permit fee to be based on job cost valuation or a fixed fee as stated in this schedule. The determination of value or valuation shall be made by the building and/or fire official. The value to be used in computing the permit and plan review fees shall be the total of all work for which the permit is issued. For building permitting, this shall include all finish work, painting, roofing, electrical, plumbing, heating, air conditioning, elevators, fire-extinguishing systems and any other permanent equipment.

- 5) If the valuation is greater than \$4,000,000.00, the surcharge is \$1,400.00 plus one-tenth mill (.0001) of the value between \$4,000,000.00 and \$5,000,000.00
- 6) If the valuation exceeds \$5,000,000.00, the surcharge is \$1,500.00 plus one-twentieth mill (.00005) of the value that exceeds \$5,000,000.00

PLAN REVIEW FEE

When a building permit is required and a plan is required to be submitted, a plan review fee shall be paid. Plan review fees shall be 65% of the permit fee. The fee for similar plans shall be 25% of the normal building permit fee as defined in MSBC, Section 1300.

The plan review fees specified are separate fees from the permit fees specified and are in addition to the permit fee. Plan review fees will be charged for any plan review even if a permit is not issued.

When submittal documents are incomplete or change so as to require additional plan review, or when the project involves deferred submittal items, an additional plan review fee shall be charged at the rate contained herein.

Applications for which no permit is issued within 180 days following the date of application shall expire by limitation; plans and other documentation submitted for review may thereafter be returned to the applicant or destroyed by the building and/or fire official. The building and/or fire official may extend the time for action by the applicant for a period of 180 days upon request of the applicant with evidence that circumstances beyond the applicant's control have prevented required action. No application shall be extended more than once. In order to review action on an application after expiration, the applicant shall resubmit plans and pay a new plan review fee.

RENEWAL FEE

Permits renewed within six (6) months after a permit has expired shall be charged a permit renewal fee of \$55.00.

Permits not renewed within six (6) months after a permit has expired and work remains incomplete shall be charged as required for a new permit.

REFUNDS

The building and/or fire official may authorize refunding any fee paid under this schedule that was erroneously paid or collected.

The building and/or fire official may authorize refunding not more than 80% of the permit fee paid when no work has been done under an issued permit.

The building and/or fire official shall not authorize refunding of the plan review fee when an application for a permit is withdrawn or cancelled after a plan review has been completed.

The building/fire official shall not authorize refunding any fee paid except on written application field by the original permittee not later than 180 days after the date of the fee payment.

INVESTIGATION FEE

Whenever any work for which a city permit is required has commenced without first obtaining a permit, a special investigation shall be made before a permit will be issued. An investigation fee, in addition to the permit fee, shall be collected whether or not a permit is subsequently issued. The investigation fee shall be equal to the amount of the permit fee required by this schedule. The payment for such investigation fee shall not exempt any person from compliance with all other provisions of this code nor from any penalty prescribed by law.

STAFF RFPORT



MEETING DATE: November 10th, 2025

AGENDA ITEM: Franchise Fees

INTRODUCTION:

Staff are asking the City Council to review its franchise fee structure for electric and natural gas services. These fees are collected by Xcel Energy and Connexus Energy on behalf of the City and remitted quarterly. They provide a local revenue source, outside of the general levy, that can be used for support of roads.

The current franchise fee rates are a fixed amount on each bill and have not been adjusted since 2013, despite annual cost inflation. Revenue does grow slightly each year as more homes are added, but that growth is accompanied by more street infrastructure to maintain. As part of this review, staff requested support from Xcel Energy and Connexus Energy to determine appropriate updated rates and analyzed what the fees would look like today if they had been indexed to inflation (2.76% annually, compounded, rounded to the nearest \$0.25).

ANALYSIS:

Currently, Forest Lake's franchise fees are set to generate approximately \$820,000.00 annually. If no changes are made, this revenue stream will remain essentially flat, totaling about \$8.2 million over the next 10 years. The adopted 2026 Preliminary Budget includes a small increase in Franchise Fees revenue, forecasting \$900,000 in annual income.

Under the updated model, proposed franchise fee rates would generate an estimated \$1.14 million annually, an increase of approximately \$320,000 compared to current collections, or \$240,000 compared to the Preliminary Budget.

If the City were to adjust franchise fee rates to "catch up" to inflation, as proposed an additional \$2.4 Million would be raised over the next 10 years. It may also be prudent to adopt a policy to regularly increase these fees by 5% every other year (rounded to the nearest \$0.25) to keep pace with inflation. With this provision in place, the total franchise fee revenue over 10 years is projected at \$12,639,285. This represents an additional \$4,469,285 in revenue compared to maintaining current rates.

Importantly, if this new revenue is realized and the City associates no additional expenses to it, the additional funds could be applied directly to reduce property tax reliance. Under this scenario,

the City's 2026 levy increase could be reduced to approximately 11%, without requiring any further expenditure cuts.

This option would create long-term financial stability for the City by generating a recurring revenue stream that not only grows predictably with development, but also provides direct tax relief for Forest Lake residents and businesses. Unlike the property tax levy, which is borne only by taxable parcels, this fee is collected more broadly, capturing revenue from all utility users in the City, including entities that do not pay property taxes such as hospitals, schools, and other tax-exempt organizations. As a result, the cost of maintaining and improving City services is shared more equitably across the entire community, rather than being concentrated solely on homeowners and businesses.

AN ORDINANCE IMPLEMENTING A GAS SERVICE FRANCHISE FEE ON NORTHERN STATES POWER COMPANY, A MINNESOTA CORPORATION, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, FOR PROVIDING GAS SERVICE WITHIN THE CITY OF FOREST LAKE.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOREST LAKE DOES ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. The City of Forest Lake Municipal Code is hereby amended to include reference to the following Special Ordinance.

- **Subd. 1.** <u>Purpose</u>. The Forest Lake City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to impose a franchise fee on those public utility companies that provide natural gas services within the City of Forest Lake.
 - (a) Pursuant to City Ordinance 621, a Franchise Agreement between the City of Forest Lake and Northern States Power Company, a Minnesota corporation, its successors and assigns, the City has the right to impose a franchise fee on Northern States Power Company, a Minnesota corporation, its successors and assigns, in an amount and fee design as set forth in Section 9 of the Northern States Power Company Franchise and in the fee schedule attached hereto as <u>Schedule A</u>.
- **Subd. 2.** <u>Franchise Fee Statement</u>. A franchise fee is hereby imposed on Northern States Power Company, a Minnesota Corporation, its successors and assigns, under its gas franchise in accordance with the schedule attached here to and made a part of this Ordinance, commencing with the NSPM November, 2025 billing month.

This fee is an account-based fee on each premise and not a meter-based fee. In the event that an entity covered by this ordinance has more than one meter at a single premise, but only one account, only one fee shall be assessed to that account. If a premise has two or more meters being billed at different rates, the Company may have an account for each rate classification, which will result in more than one franchise fee assessment for gas service to that premise. If the Company combines the rate classifications into a single account, the franchise fee assessed to the account will be the largest franchise fee applicable to a single rate classification for energy delivered to that premise. In the event any entities covered by this ordinance have more than one premise, each premise (address) shall be subject to the appropriate fee. In the event a

question arises as to the proper fee amount for any premise, the Company's manner of billing for energy used at all similar premises in the city will control.

- **Subd. 3.** Payment. The said franchise fee shall be payable to the City in accordance with the terms set forth in Section 9 of the Franchise.
- **Subd. 4.** <u>Surcharge</u>. The City recognizes that the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission may allow Company to add a surcharge to customer rates of city residents to reimburse Company for the cost of the fee.
- **Subd. 5.** Enforcement. Any dispute, including enforcement of a default regarding this ordinance will be resolved in accordance with Section 2.5 of the Franchise Agreement.
- **Subd. 6.** Effective Date of Franchise Fee. The effective date of this Ordinance shall be after its publication and ninety (90) days after the sending of written notice enclosing a copy of this adopted Ordinance to NSPM by certified mail. Collection of the fee shall commence as provided in above.

SECTION 1. The City of Forest Lake Municipal Code is hereby amended to include reference to the following Special Ordinance.

- **Subd. 1.** <u>Purpose</u>. The City of Forest Lake City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to impose a franchise fee on those public utility companies that provide electric services within the City of Forest Lake.
 - (a) Pursuant to City Ordinance 621, a Franchise Agreement between the City of Forest Lake and Northern States Power Company, a Minnesota corporation, its successors and assigns, the City has the right to impose a franchise fee on Northern States Power Company, a Minnesota corporation, its successors and assigns, in an amount and fee design as set forth in Section 9 of the Northern States Power Company Franchise and in the fee schedule attached hereto as <u>Schedule A</u>.
- **Subd. 2.** <u>Franchise Fee Statement</u>. A franchise fee is hereby imposed on Northern States Power Company, a Minnesota Corporation, its successors and assigns, under its electric franchise in accordance with the schedule attached here to and made a part of this Ordinance, commencing with the NSPM November, 2025 billing month.

This fee is an account-based fee on each premise and not a meter-based fee. In the event that an entity covered by this ordinance has more than one meter at a single premise, but only one account, only one fee shall be assessed to that account. If a premise has two or more meters being billed at different rates, the Company may have an account for each rate classification, which will result in more than one franchise fee assessment for electric service to that premise. If the Company combines the rate classifications into a single account, the franchise fee assessed to the account will be the largest franchise fee applicable to a single rate classification for energy delivered to that premise. In the event any entities covered by this ordinance have more than one premise, each premise (address) shall be subject to the appropriate fee. In the event a question arises as to the proper fee amount for any premise, the Company's manner of billing for energy used at all similar premises in the city will control.

- **Subd. 3.** Payment. The said franchise fee shall be payable to the City in accordance with the terms set forth in Section 9 of the Franchise.
- **Subd. 4.** <u>Surcharge</u>. The City recognizes that the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission may allow Company to add a surcharge to customer rates of city residents to reimburse Company for the cost of the fee.

The City Council of Forest Lake ordains:

Section 1. Summary.

The Forest Lake City Council adopted Ordinance No. 760 and Ordinance No. 761 on November 10, 2025, thereby establishing a franchise fee on Northern States Power Company (Xcel Energy) for providing natural gas service within the city. The ordinance authorizes a monthly fee per customer account—\$4.00 for residential customers and varying amounts for commercial and industrial classes—to support city infrastructure and operations. The fee will take effect following publication and a 90-day notification period to Xcel Energy, with collections remitted quarterly to the City of Forest Lake.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon publication.

Dear Mayor and Council:

On October 7, we publicly opened bids for the Eureka Avenue Improvements project. Five bids were received in total. The following is a bid summary below:

- Alternate 1 includes proposed reconstruction of the unimproved portion of Hornsby St NE in Columbus (Columbus has declined award).
- Alternate 2 includes proposed street lighting on Hornsby St NE in Columbus (Columbus declined).
- Alternate 3 includes additional shoreline restoration work to be reimbursed by Rice Creek Watershed District.
- Alternate 4 includes providing decorative blue fencing in lieu of galvanized pipe railing at the existing fish barrier and at the north end of the project.

The above Bids do not include costs or scope of work for potential project street lighting.

Staff are still waiting on a federal funding review for the DNR Roadway Easement required to reconstruct approximately 1,500' of Eureka Avenue that is located on DNR property along Clear Lake. The easement application review has been ongoing since August 30, 2024, and the latest information provided by the DNR is that the review will be continuing for another 4-6 weeks at a minimum, if it is not further impacted by the federal government shutdown.

The critical path for the project timeline is placement of the soil surcharge, as that needs to be in place for 9 months prior to completing reconstruction activities. A large portion of the surcharge is located on DNR property in the easement area and can't be placed until the easement is approved and finalized.

Staff feel that placement of the soil surcharge in areas outside of the DNR easement portion of the project yet this fall is in the best interests of the project and the City as this will allow much of the project work to be completed in 2026 per the original planned schedule.

Due to the extended DNR easement review timeframe, the soil surcharge within the easement area will not be able to be placed until Spring 2026, which will result in reconstruction activities for this portion of Eureka Avenue being delayed until Spring 2027.

Staff have had preliminary conversations with the low bidder, Forest Lake Contracting, Inc., regarding the project delays due to the DNR easement acquisition and potential cost increases associated with delaying this part of the project another year.

Staff recommends the City consider award of the Base Bid, Alternate 3, and Alternate 4 as shown below:

The Engineer's Estimate for the Base Bid plus Alternates 3 and 4 was \$3,866,863.50.

The low bid total for the Base Bid plus Alternates 3 and 4 is \$578,826.00 less than the second lowest bid.

Potential cost increases for 2027 construction associated with materials, labor, fuel, trucking, and construction inefficiencies are estimated to be on the order of \$265,000 or more. Actual cost increases would need to be determined at a later date and incorporated into a project change order.

Staff anticipate that re-bidding the project will result in significantly higher pricing and delay of the entire project reconstruction until 2027.

Therefore, Staff recommends the City award the contract to Forest Lake Contracting, Inc. to perform the work included in the Base Bid, Alternate 3, and Alternate 4 in the amount of \$3,387,743.50, with the following conditions:

- A limited notice to proceed will be issued to complete the soil surcharge placement outside of the DNR easement portion in 2025, and for completion of the remainder of the work after the DNR easement is obtained.
- The City reserves the right to execute a change order to remove the work proposed on DNR property from the project at no additional cost.
